





The first is to quit growing cotton for a year or more, which the commissioner does not recommend, or to destroy the worm in its hibernating quar-

The pink bollworm hibernates inside the cottonseed or in bols remaining in the field after picking has been completed. White recommends that no untreated cotton seed be saved from this year's crop and that all untreated seed be taken to the oil millor be fed to ivestock. Only a supply of treated seed should'be used for planting next year's crop

Picking should be rushed and every effort made to pick as cleany as possible. Strippers do a good job of cleaningthe stalks. Cutting the stalks with a new type shredder kills a considerable per cent of the worms and enables a better olowing job to be done, said

As soon as possible after stalks have been cut, the remaining debris should be deep-
