### Funeral Rites Held For P. B. Griffith

Funeral services were held on Monday for Pearl B. Griffith, 80, longtime Friona resident.

Services were held in the Methodist Church here with Rev. U. S. Sherrill, pastor, officiating assisted by Rev. Russell Pogue of the Friona Baptist Church.

Pearl B. Griffith, son of Joshua and Nancy Griffith, was born at Logan, Ohio, on January 25, 1872. On October 20, 1895, he was married to Miss Ethel J. Wright near Charleston, Ill., at the home of the bride.

To this union were born nine children, eight of whom survive: Frank Griffith, Mrs. Foster Rector, Jim Griffith, Paul Griffith and Mrs. Raymond Adams, all of Friona, and Tom Griffith of Bovina, Mrs. D. T. Elliott, Delores, Colo., and Mrs. Floyd Brookfield, Hereford. Another daughter, Estella, died in 1921.

In 1902 the Griffiths moved to Oklahoma where they homesteaded, moving on to Friona in 1926. They lived here until 1941 when they moved to Cortez, Colorado. However, they came back to Friona in February of '52 because of Frank's illness. On Feb. 27th Mr. Griffith became very ill and was never able to return to his Colorado home. He died Dec. 27th at the age of 80 years, 11 months and 2 days.

Mr. Griffith is survived by the widow, eight children, ten grandchildren, eleven great grandchildren, two brothers and one sister. Pall bearers were Bill Massie, Ed Massie, Hershel Taylor, David Massey, Clyde Goodwin and C. L. ### March of Dimes Drive Is Underway; Last 30 Days

The March of Dimes will be conducted throughout the month of January, County Campaign Chairman Raymond Euler has announced. This is the second time in the history of the program that the drive has been scheduled for a full month.

this extended drive was forced by the record number of polio cases reported in 1952 and the tens of thousands of patients stricken in previous years who still needed financial aid from the March of Dimes.

Other factors included extensive laboratory research coupled with research with the actual cases.

Of the more than 55,000 persons treated for polio in 1952, approximately 44,000 were assisted in whole or in part by the March of Dimes.

Half of the money contributed to the dime drive is used by the local county chapter to help pay the cost of treating local patients or in emergencies, polio patients elsewhere. The other 50 per cent finances March of Dimes research, professional education and epidemic programs.

We once proposed something in the nature of "Gateway to the Irrigation Belt" as a slogan.

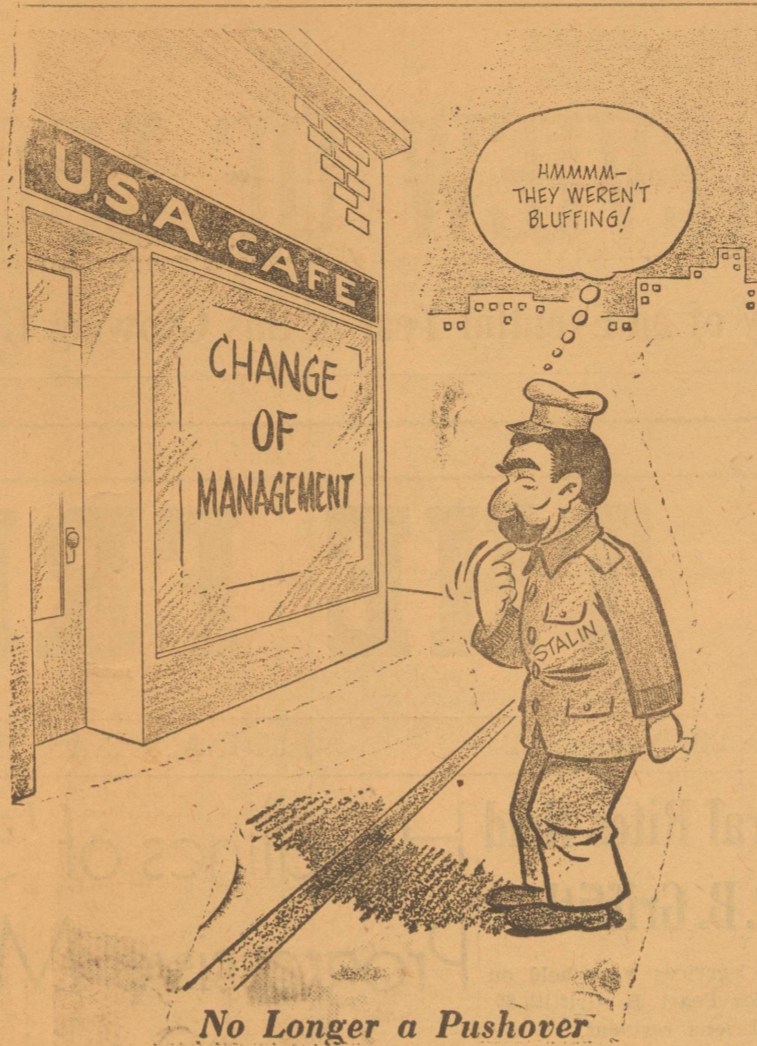

WASHINGTON AND

“Small Business”

On many Washington calendars, January 20th is ringed with some uncertainty.

The enigma is not so much Eisenhower, but Eisenhower's friends. Some of his appointees are little known, creating a feeling of uncertainty.

For example, while the General was in Korea, exposed to danger, a political note was introduced in the government anti-trust suit against DuPont.

Joseph P. Savage, an attorney, appeared in the Chicago Federal Court, asserting he represented the stockholders, told the court that the incoming Attorney General, Herbert Brownell might call off the suit.

Brownell has said he intends to review all cases pending.

The government through the Justice Department started suit against DuPont in 1949, alleging the \$5 billion empire composed of the DuPont Chemical Company with a 23% ownership of General Motors stock, and 18% interest in U. S. Rubber, has conspired to restrain trade.

Career men in the Justice Department headed by W. L. Hotchkiss spent three years preparing the government's case.

Usually, Justice Department career men do not force a case to trial unless they have ample evidence to justify a trial.

But apparent confidence expressed in Federal Court that the new Attorney General will

quash the trial causes grave concern over future administration of the anti-trust laws.

Naturally, until all the evidence is in, and a decision reached, no one can say whether or not the DuPont empire is guilty as charged. But opinion prevails that now is the time to decide the issue in open court, without political interference.

Whether or not Brownell stops the trial on taking office on January 20 remains to be seen. But the fact that such a possibility is voiced in a trial court highlights the drive started by the National Federation of Independent Business to remove anti-trust enforcement from politics.

In a recent nationwide poll of independent businessmen, 78% voted for legislation to make appointment of an assistant U. S. Attorney in charge of the anti-trust division permanent, thus removing him from political pressure. In the past ten years, five have been removed from this post.

Here is the issue.

Briefly, it is desired that enforcement of the anti-trust laws be put on the same permanent basis as other Federal laws are enforced by J. Edgar Hoover, head of the FBI.

There will be a great deal of opposition to this plan.

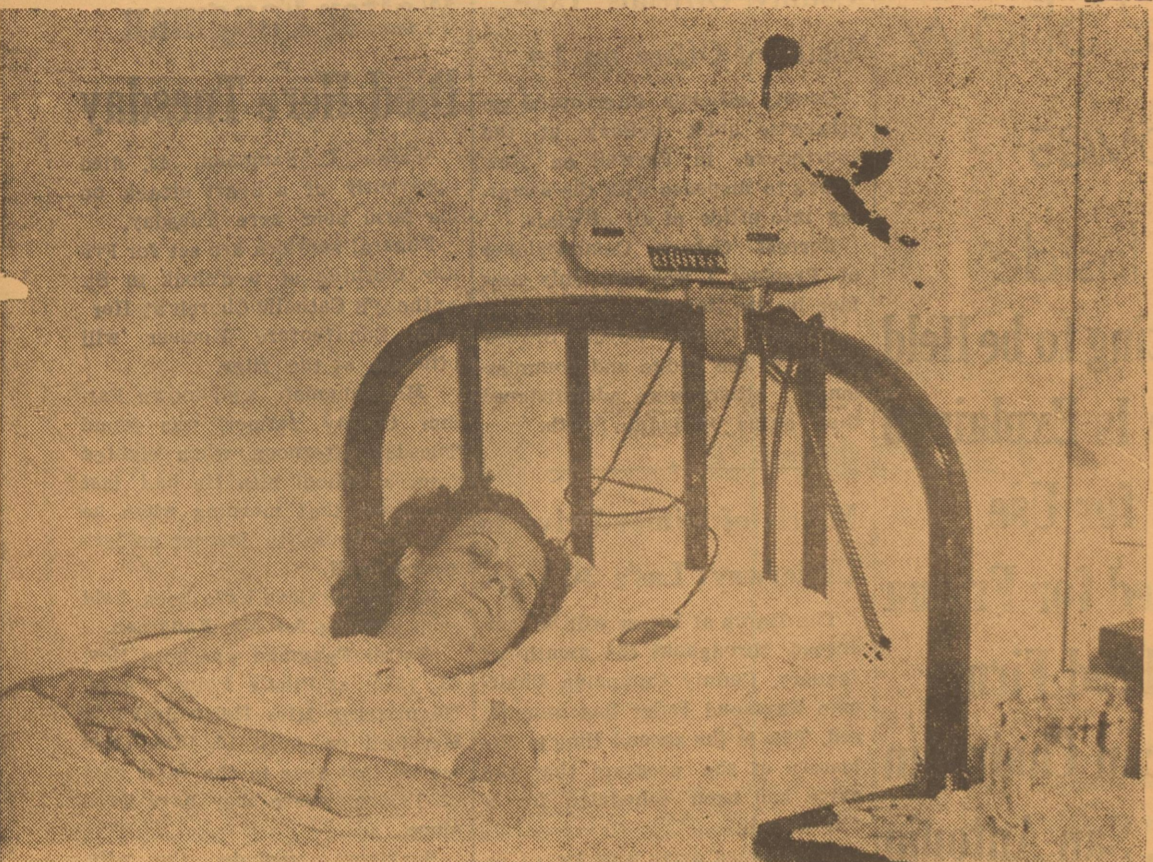
Concerns found meriting a trial under the anti-trust laws usually have ample means and influence. The easiest way to win is to secure dismissal.

The plan of independent businessmen is quite plain.

It's merely a matter of making it impossible to "fix" a traffic ticket on a high level.

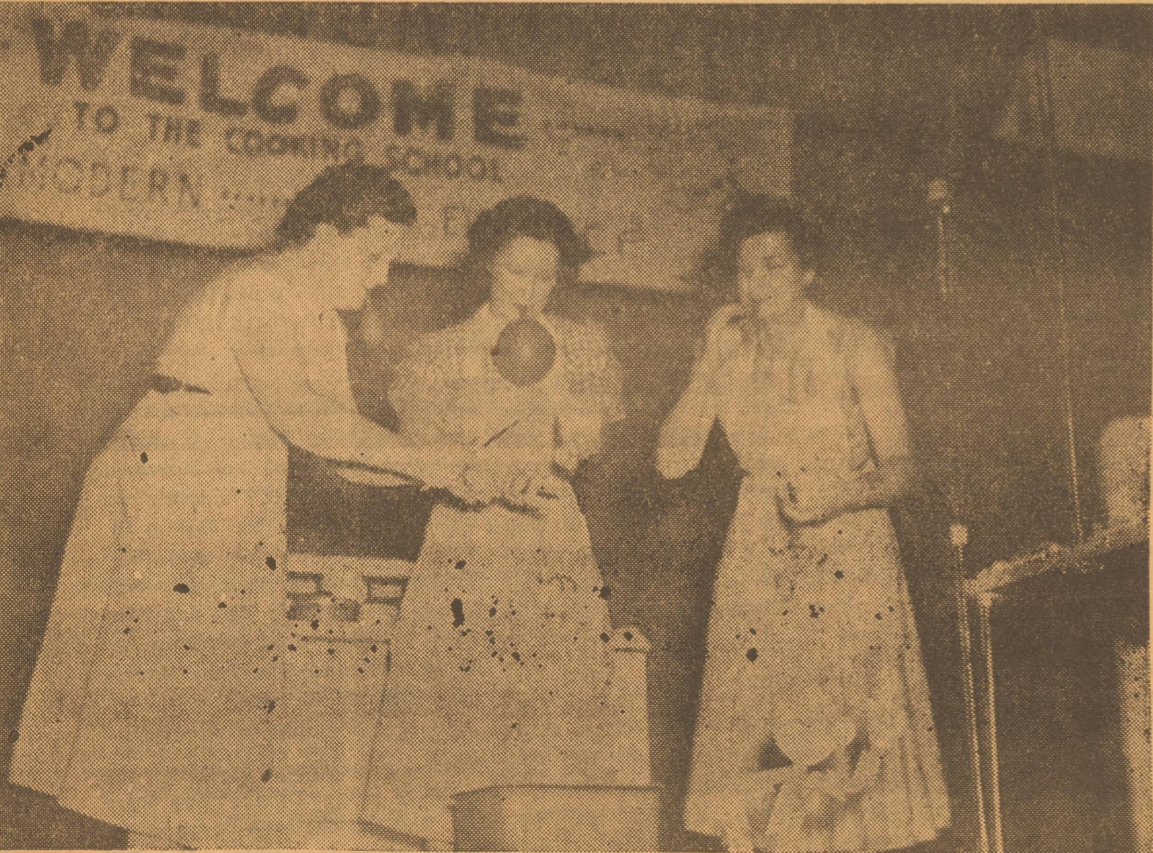
