PARIS, March 15. (AP).—Americans virtually cut the Ruhr-Frankfurt super highway east of the Rhine today, and established a nine-mile bridgehead across the Moselle River within eight miles of besieged Coblenz.

LONDON, Mach 15 (AP)—The Tokyo radio said today the British Pacific fleet, operating from Australian bases, has gone into action in the Philippine waters taking part in the United States operation against Mindano Island.

PEARL BOY LETTIN' 'EM HAVE IT WITH THE 362ND FIGHTER GROUP OVER GERMANY

On a rainy day you can wade thru mud to the door of the operations shack at this base for the 362nd Fighter Group and walk right in on a lively bunch of Texans--fighter-bomber pilots such as Lt. H. H. Marks, Jr., of San Antonio and Lt. E. R. Johnson of Pearl, Coryell County, Texas.

They're the men who are striking every day the weather permits at such vital spots in the Nazi war machine as rail-road marshaling yards, highways on which the Germans depend for motor transport of men and supplies, and who dive-bomb positions in the Siegfried Line itself, in front of advancing American troops.

Johnson has been recommended for a cluster for the DFC, and has 13 clusters for his Air Medal,

after completing more than 80 missions since coming to the ETO last May.

As he was strafing the marshaling yards at Frankfurten-Main recently, his plane was struck by flak, but we'll let him tell it:

"On my second pass, they got pretty accurate, and hit one wing of the ship, then the engine. The last burst caused the engine to start losing oil, which covered my windshield and canopy and I had to fly in mostly on instruments for a crash landing. But I wasn't scratched."

A son of Mr. and Mrs. E. R. Johnson, who farm near Pearl, the young pilot attended school at Mosheim and has been in the AAF since September, 1942. —The Ft. Worth Star Telegram.

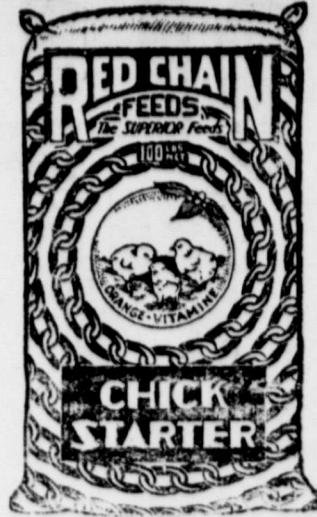

in "Indian territory" Maj. Klobb and his men hid beside you, and then jumped out and said: "Haende hock!"

The enemy did, and the Nazi captain was followed by other soldiers with their hands up also.

Another time they couldn't make the grade at a small Belgium village. The major called for long white underwear to provide camouflage, if not charm, for the third attack.

Pulling them over their other clothes, the major's men waited for darkness, and moved across the field, 800 yards without detection, and then it was too late to stop them. The enemy withdrew.

and I had dug it between two dead Germans. I just looked at them and ate my K-Ration. Then, one night, we were all almost sick and didn't have water. It was dark and the ground was full of shell holes and the shell holes was full of water. As it was raining, I finally got about five gallons and started back. It was almost daylight and I knew if I didn't get back before daylight I would never make it. So I ran 1 1/2 miles and fell down in those holes got out of sight in the mud and water. It was quite an experience but I made it.

Pvt. Richard E. Adams who is now in England continues: "After I was shook up by the shell, I

crawled out from under the debris and my buddies were laying all around me. My canteen had a bad hole in it.

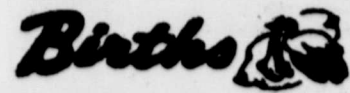

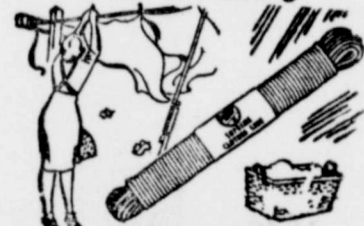

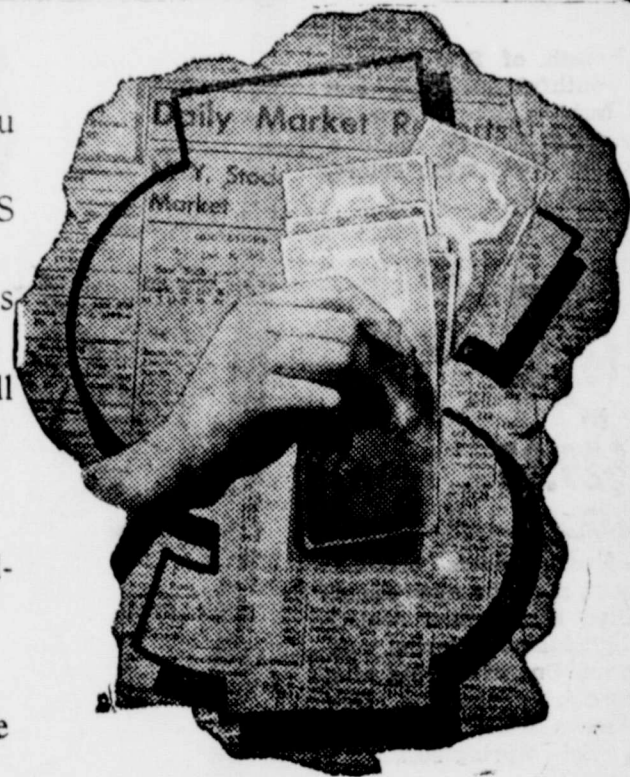
