### Texas Pioneer Dies At Home In Evant, Mother Of Local Man

Mrs. Mary E. Eddy Putnam, widow of the late Owen H. Putnam, prominently known pioneer citizens of Evant and that section of Texas, died at her home, Sept. 19, after only a brief illness. Mrs. Putnam's death was not unexpected however, as she had been frail in health for several years.

A son, Don Putnam and family,

and a niece of Mrs. Putnam, Mrs. Bill Ament and husband were in Evant with the other bereaved loved ones and attended the service of the last rites held at the Methodist Church on the afternoon of September 20, at 3 o'clock. The Memorial Ceremonies were conducted by the Rev. Sam Drake, who paid beautiful tribute to the exalted life of the noble, wife, mother and Christian, who had been a member of the Fairview Methodist Church for over 50 years.

Burial was in Hurst Ranch cemetery, where her body was laid to rest in a grave beside that of her husband, who passed on a number of years ago. Flowers in profusion and of rich coloring and rare perfume covered the spot where Mrs. Putnam rests and also, decorated the grave of Mr. Putnam.

Mary E. Eddy was born in West Virginia in the year, 1861. When she was twelve years of age her family moved to Texas. She was married to Owen H. Putnam in 1889, and to them eight children were born, seven of whom survive and were present at her funeral. They are Mrs. Grace Mason, Dublin, Texas; Dr. C. E. 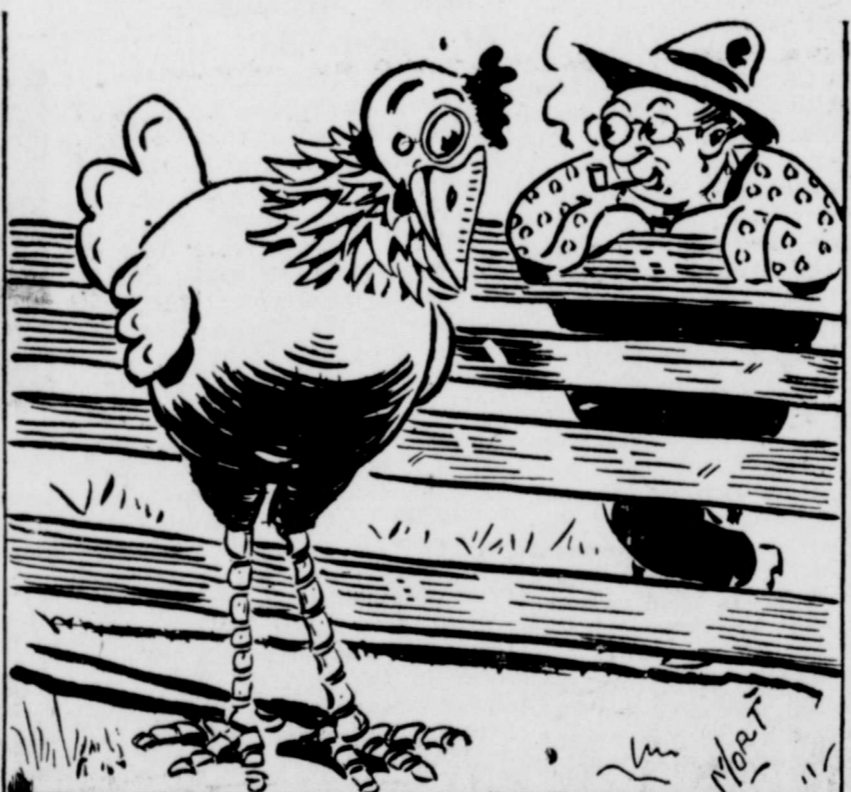
