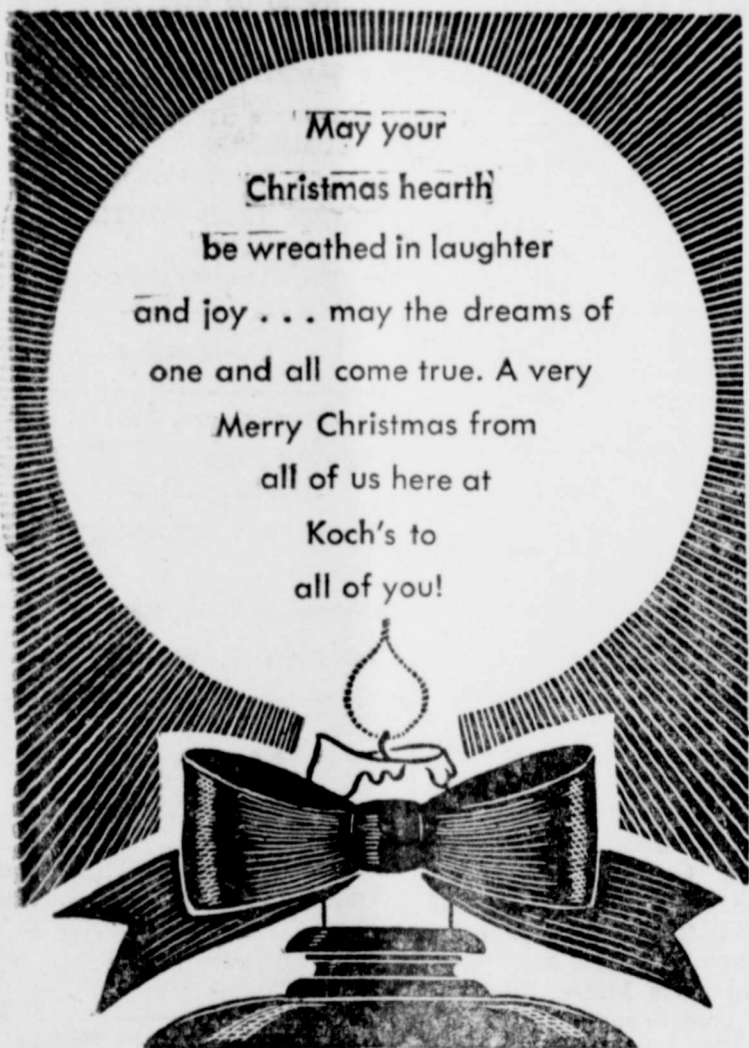

**WELFARE BIG BUSINESS
IN CORYELL COUNTY: 743
ON PAY ROLLS**

Coryell County citizens to a total of 843 are receiving welfare payments, according to the Texas Public Welfare Department. The report covers the fiscal-year which ended in August.

There were 788 persons receiving old-age funds; 23 dependent children; 14 were blind and 18 were permanently disabled.

They received \$531,803 of which \$502,000 went to the aged, \$19,982 to dependent children, \$4,539 to the blind, and \$6,051 to the disabled.

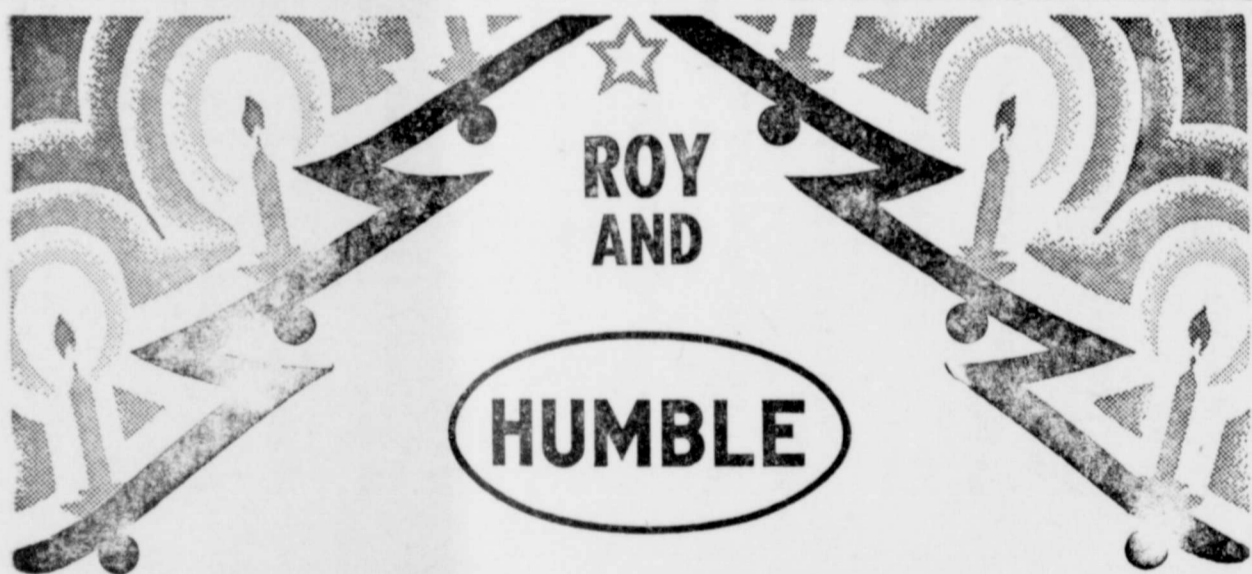

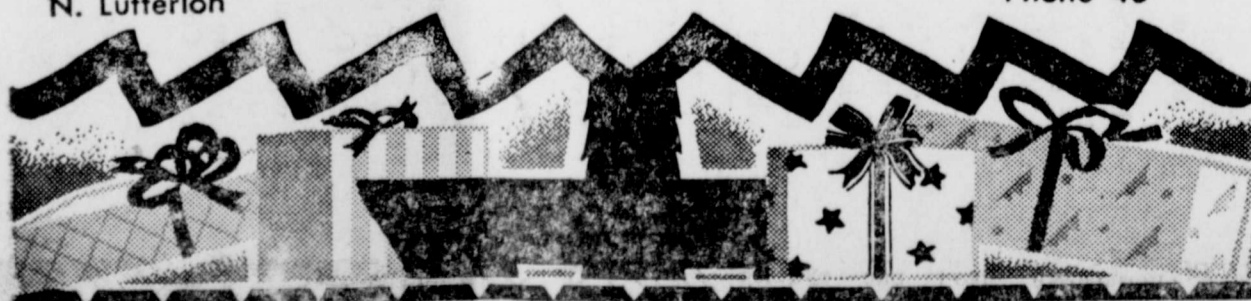

Court Case Ruling Opposed By Evetts

Last week the Courier carried an article, stating that the suit of Jack Bankhead vs Coryell County was scheduled to hand a decision in 52nd District Court for an injunction to stop use of county-owned machinery on jobs for private use.

The report also stated that all parties involved had agreed to submit the case to Judge Cross on a "stipulated" finding of facts.

This week Roy Evetts, Commissioner for Beat 2, stated that he did not agree to the submission, nor did another un-named commissioner. Mr. Evetts asked that we make this clear to the public this week as he felt that such a decision was against the will of the people of Coryell County.

\$3.3 Billion Dollars Spent on Highways By Texas System

AUSTIN, Texas — The Texas Highway Department has just totaled its forty-first year of operation. State Highway Engineer D. C. Greer said that 80 per cent of the funds expended during the past year were for construction, and 13 per cent for maintenance.

"Less than two-thirds of one percent was spent for the administration of the Highway Department, and the remaining six and one-third percent went for the highway patrol and miscellaneous operations.

"The 80 percent expended for construction is the largest percent that has gone for this item since the 1959 Texas cotton crop at bales ginned in the state last year. Average yield per acre will be about 337 pounds. . . One-eighth, or six of the 48 persons executed for crimes in the U. S. last year, were executed in Texas. California, Georgia and Ohio also had six executions each. So far this year Texas has had only three the few years soon after the creation of the Highway Department. Almost all of the expenditures went for construction in those early days, as the counties were responsible for highway maintenance at that time. The Department assumed maintenance of state highways in 1924.

"Over the 41 years, 70 percent of the funds have been expended for construction," Greer said.

Greer stated that during the past year, 19 percent of the revenue of the Department came from license plates, 32 percent from the gasoline tax, 43 percent from the federal government, and the remaining 6 percent from miscellaneous sources.

In the 41 years of operation, \$3.3 billion dollars have been spent on the Texas Highway System. The System now consists of 60,374 miles.

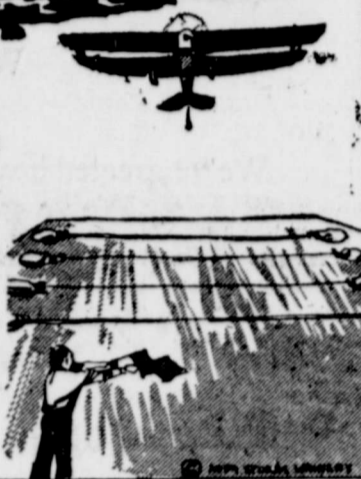

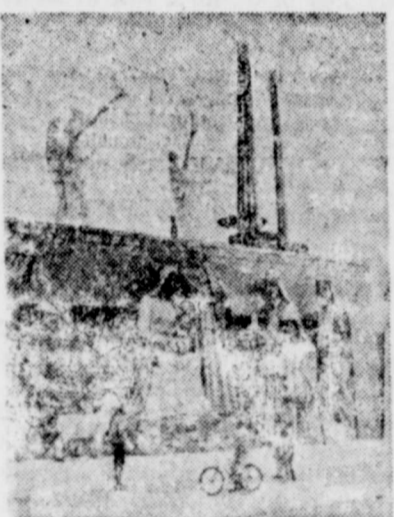
