



CHICAGO (AP)-A presidential poll of the nation's newspaper editors and publishers, with about 40 per cent voting, indicate Vice-President Richard M. Nixon will! win Tuesday's election.

Publisher's Auxiliary, a weekly trade newspaper which conducted the 3-week poll, announced Thursday final results from nearly 4,000 of the 10,703 ballots sent to the newspaper executives.

It announced that weekly newspaper editors and publishers belive Nixon the winner in what it sad "could be called a near landslide." He was favored in 36 states with a total of 416 electoral votes while Sen. John F. Kennedy was th choice in 12 states carrying 115 electoral votes.






