# Rael Shelter Is a Real Life Saver

By Prof. Willard F Libby The more comfortable and

elaborate you can make your shelter the better, in order that you may remain inside for two weeks if need be.

After the first two or three days, the X-radition from the fallout would not kill you. In very heavily dusted areas it might be strong enough to cause illness, or shorten life if you got too much exposure. Geneetic effects on later generations might follow also.

Acting on Civil Defense radioed instructions, you might be able to move away from a small, cramped shelter to areas which had not been so contaminated and were safer.

With no harm, you could make quick trips in and out to hunt necessities. Particularly so if you had a small, compacet basement shelter. For the rest of the basement likely would be receiving less radiation than the remainder of the house, or outdoor ground.

A very EXAMS FOR POSSIBLE PO definite offset, however is that sometimes the larger shelters can double as a playroom, den, storage room, or or other useable space in the basement, or underground.

The better, the sturdier and better supplied the shelter is, the more protection there is against lise of elgibles and beconsidered fallout, and even blast effects.

My own simple shelter, in which I could use sleeping bags, increases fallout protection 100 fold. But a \$5,000 shelter could give 10,000-fold protection.






