**Judy Geye Seriously Hurt
In Friday Night Car
Crash Near Here**

Judy Geye of Gatesville was seriously injured with a broken back in an accident about 10 p. m., Friday night. With her in a '64 Ford pickup was Charles Houk of Hamilton. The other car involved was driven by Troy Sheffield of Gatesville, who was only slightly injured, with a reported broken knee cap.

The accident happened 1.7 miles south of Gatesville on St. Hwy. 36 at the Ft. Gates Water Supply Corporation tank location.

Miss Geye was thrown clear of the wreckage, and Houk was pinned in the pickup for some 45 minutes. Damage to Sheffield's car was \$250 and the pickup totaled at \$900.

Investigation has not been completed according to St. Hwy. Patrolman J. K. Hamilton, investigating officer.

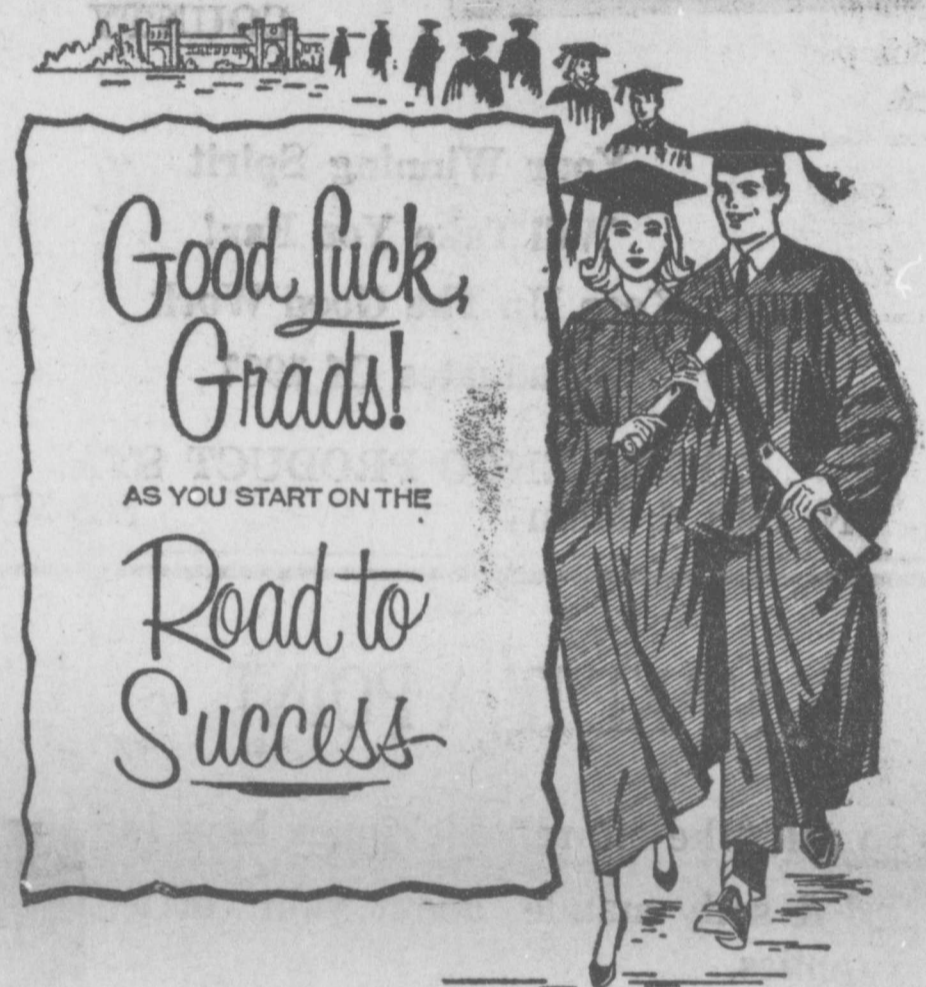

After several minutes of firing, the Strauss moved seaward. As a result of the firing, two large shore batteries were destroyed and secondary explosions were observed.
