SSB AND MV SCHOOLS TO GET TOTAL PAYROLL OF \$3.7 MILLION; 14 PCT.

September 1 SSB and MV Schools will have a total payroll of home \$3.7 million—\$3,745,564. A 14 percent pay hike. With 508 employed the total employee load is expected to number 570 when the new Sycamore unit opens June 8. Annual payroll at SSB then will be \$2,883,349.

Mountain View's 152 workers will have a yearly payroll of \$862,215, and the Classified positions will call for \$688,088, unclassified \$152,627, business manager and assistant superintendent \$9,500 each, and the superintendent \$12,500.

758, unclassified \$480,591, business SSB will be classified \$2,3303, manager \$10,500, 6 unit superintendents \$8,00, and general superintendent \$13,500.

CITY SUES CITY OVER WATER RIGHTS: G'VILLE FT. GATES GO AT IT

Two 'neighbors' are going after each other in suits and counter

suits filed in 52nd District Court. Gatesville filed a suit asking annexation ordinances by Ft. Gates City Council taking tracts owned by property owners into the 20-month old city limits be declared

null and void. No hearing dates have been set. Bob Cummings, attorney claims Gatesville, as a home rule city has extra-territorial jurisdiction over all the area within a mile of the city limits. Tracts annexed by Ft. Gates are within a mile of Gatesville.

The 'rumble' started first May 11 when Gatesville filed a suit to enjoin Ft. Gates Water Supply Corporation from extending its water lines into presently unserved areas between the two cities within a mile of Gatesville, and 5 days later Ft. Gates Council passed 2 ordinances annexing 43 tracts within a half mile of Ft. Gates' city limits but also within a mile of Gatesville. They maintain Gatesville does not have a population of 5,000 and can exercise extra-territorial jurisdiction of only that area within a half mile of the city limits.

While "Beau Charger" was underway, pilots from U. S. aircraft carriers in the South China Sea and Tonkin Gulf flew air strikes over the area, and attacked targets indicated by the ground forces below.

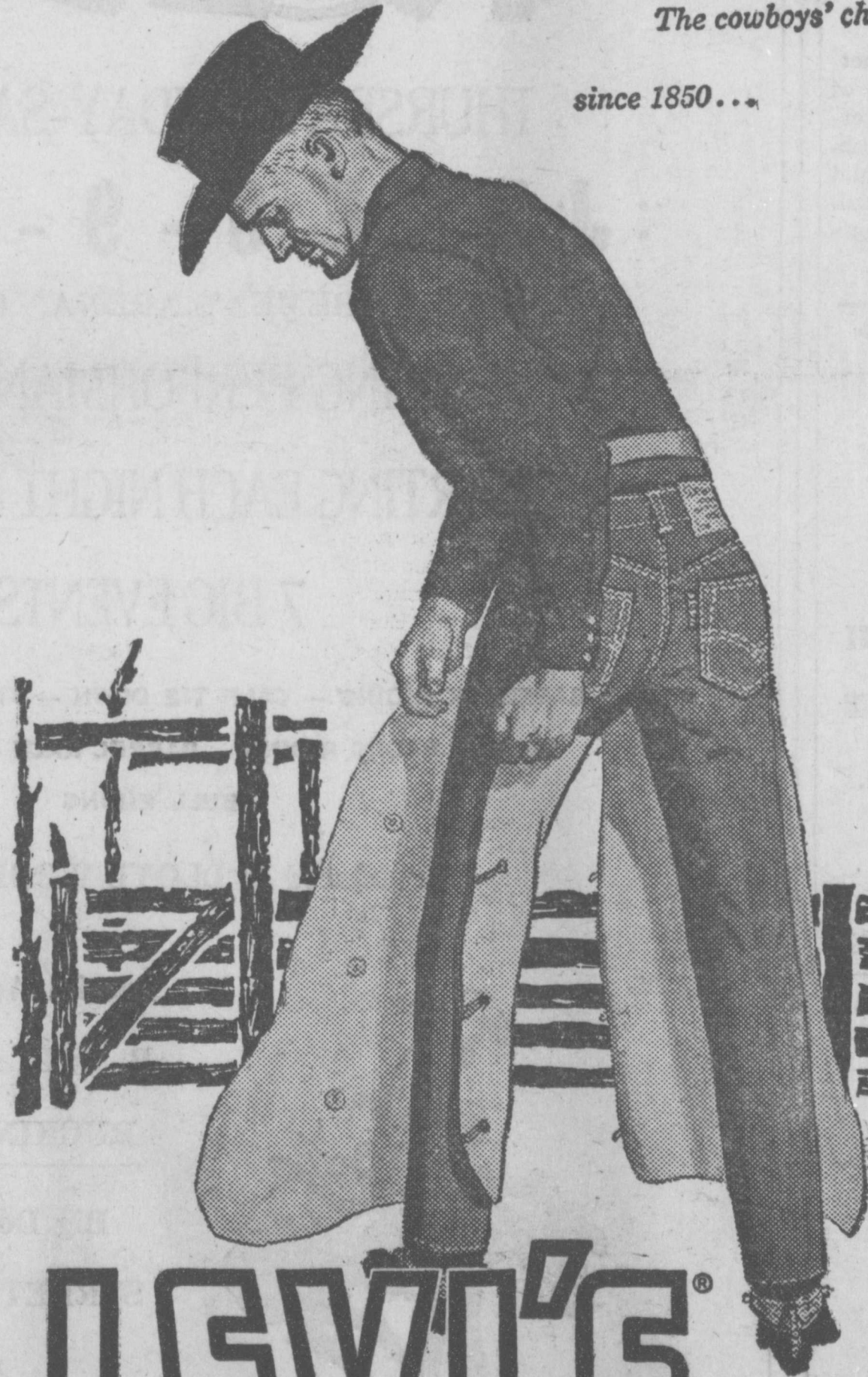

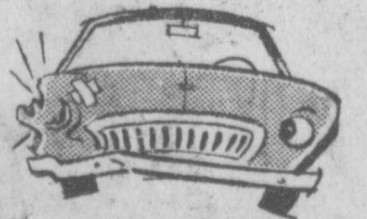
