COMPLETE CONTROL OF WHEAT CROP BY THE GOVERNMENT

Washington, August 13.—The government will take over this year's entire wheat crop, it is necessary in order to conserve the supply for America's fighting forces and the allies and to reduce costs to the consumers of the country, according to an announcement by Herbert Hoover, regarding the policies of the food administration, the chief features of the program include the elimination of trading in futures, establishing of buying agencies at principal terminals, licensing of elevators and mills, establishment of exchange and fixing of fair prices.

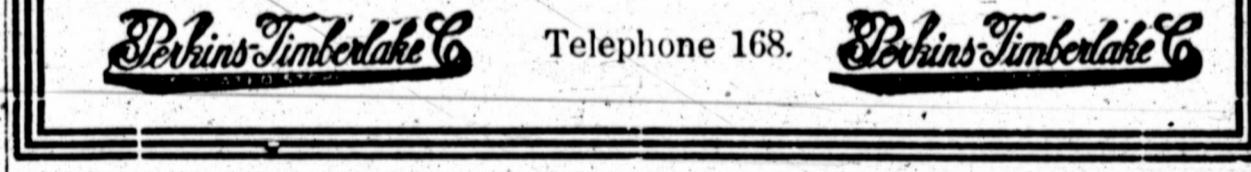
