### ATTACK UNDER COVER

LONDON, Oct. 11.—It was stated in authoritative quarters here this afternoon that a German-Russian attack on Riga was carried out under cover of a heavy bombardment by German guns, forcing the Lettish troops to evacuate the city.

The reported capture of Riga is regarded most seriously by military experts here. They say that between these German-Russian troops and the

### SHANTUNG IS MORE DEBATE

Award of Province to Japan Is Denounced In Senate By Senator Norris.

PREDICT MATTER WILL BE DISPOSED OF NEXT WEEK

Treaty Came In For Sharp Attack by Senator Brandegee Of Connectiuct.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11 .- Award of Shantung provinces to Japan came in for further denunciation in the Senate today, Senator Norris, republican, Nebraska. declaring that in "the full knowledge of all the disgraceful facts, believers in the religion of Jesus Christ would suffer death before giving approval to a treaty that countenanced

Senator Norris was continuing a speech, begun Friday and frequently there was not a Democratic Senator action. there was not a Democratic Senator on the floor, with hardly more than half a dozen members on the Republican side. Senator Lodge, who as chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee, reported out amendments designed to restore Shantung to China, had expected to add his voice in protest, but his speech went over until himder.

Predictions Made.

There were predictions tonight from Republican sources that the Shantung question would be disposed of finally question would be disposed of finally next week, clearing the way for a vote on the Johnson amendments, designed to equalize the voting power of the United States and the British Empire in the Leageu of Nations. Considering that similar precautions were made a week argument Senators said Empire in the Leageu of Nations. Considering that similar precautions were made a week ago, many Senators said that while they were anxious to expedite consideration of the treaty, they had little hope of early action.

The Senate met earlier than usual today, and in the first hour the treaty came in for a sharp attack by Senator Brandegee. Republican, Connecticut, who particularly denounced the State Department for with-holding certain information concerning the transportation system of Japan, which the Department of Commerce had obtained through one of its agents, and which it was desirable, he contended, that the country should have.

Put Under Seal.

This report, Senator Brandegee declared, "was calculated to tell us how Shantung was constituted and its relations to the great empire which we are asked to dismember." Just as soon as its nature was known, the report was "grabbed by the State Department and put under seal," said Senator Brandegee, who added that the letter from President Wilson refusing to make it public, was written the day he returned from the West, a sick man.

EXPECT ATTORNEY GENERAL TO RENDER AN OPINION

Enforcement Bill Is Effective In Ten Days.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11.-Another move to end war-time prohibition was made today in the House of Representatives. At the same time word went out from the White House that Attorney General Palmer would render an opinion on the constitutionality of recently enacted prohibition en-forcement legislation before it was placed before President Wilson for

action.

The move in the House was made by Representative Rainey, Democrat, Illinois, and took the form of a resolution which would declare it the sense of congress that the conditions necessary to the termination of the war-time prohibition act now exist, Passage of this resolution, it was said, would give the President authority to annul the law by declaring demobilization of the army completed. The resolution went over under the rules and there was no indication when it might be brought up.

Anticipate Attacks.

Decision of White House officials to have the attorney general pass on the bill covering both war-time and constitutional suforcement, enactment of which was completed yesterday by congress, was in anticipa-

### CALL FOR 80,000 ENUMERATORS FOR COMING CENSUS

The director of the census, Hon. Sam L. Rogers, announces that \$8,,000 enumerators will be needed to take the next census. The work begins on January 2 and will last about two weeks in cities, and a month of more in rural districts. Rates of pay will vary, depending upon the locality and character of the district to be canvassed. The average pay perenumerator at the census of 1910 was about \$70. At this coming census it will probably be not less than \$100. will probably be not less than \$100.
"Active, intelligent and reliab!
men and women or less than is men and women or less than 18 years of age, are needed for this task," said Director Rogers, "and, in a sense, this is a call for volunteers. The importance of a complete and reliable census, especially in these critical times when more than eyer before perhaps we need complete data regarding population, conditions, tendencies and sources, can hardiy be over-emphasized. The reorganization of the social and economic structure and the readjustment of internation of the social and economic struc-ture and the readjustment of interna-tional relations necessitated by the war must be based on accurate knowledge if we are to act wisely and deal justly with all classes and all interests. It is hoped, therefore, that public-spirited energetic people throughout the country will volunteer to act as census enumerators even though they may not care for the po-sitions so far as the pay is concerned. I should be sorry to think, and I do not believe, that all our patriotism was used up by the war and none left over for public service in times of peace."

all the expense of making the shipment, starting with the boxing or packing cost, and all other expenses incurred until delivery is made to the receiver in good order, have been overlooked.

The general traffic manager of one of the largest manufacturing concerps in the United States figured out what it cost them to ship freight by railroad and by motor truck between various eastern points. In railway freight cost he included the first cast freight rate, by which their goods would have to be shipped, plus 15 cents per hundred pounds teaming charge frow freight house, plus 15 cents per hundred pounds teaming charge frow freight warehouse to receiver's warehouse, plus 24 cents per hundred pounds increased cost of boxing to to cover shipments on account of increased weight caused by increased boxing.

Without including several other items of expense, this gave the following table of comparative freight rates per 100 pounds:


