RESERVATIONS EMBODIED IN: LODGE RATIFICATION PROGRAM

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 3.—The Lodge resolution for ratifica-tion of the treaty of peace, placed before the Senate today, contained reservations already adopted by a majority of the Senate aiting as a com-nities of the whole.

The resolution as formulated in committee of the whole now before the Senate proper, whore a two-thirds vote will be necessary to pass.

The plauses of the resolutions are:

Preamble: Requiring written assent of three ailied powers to reser-vations.

b—Requiring congress to appropriate all funds contributed to the League.

10—Limitations of armaments ordered by the League not to apply to the United States in event invasion or war is threatened.

11—Reserving the right of American citizens to continue relations with nationals of a covenant-breaking state provided they are not living in their native country.

12—Specifying that nothing in the treaty shall interfere with rights of American citizens. This is designed to safeguard interests taken over by this alien custodian during the war.

13—Withholding assent to labor clauses of the treaty.

14—Equalizing voting strength within the League when the United States is affected.







FIVE THOUSAND FAIL TO FILE INCOME TAX RETURNS SAYS AGENT

ESTIMATES BASED ON FINDINGS IN "DELINQUENCY DRIVE" HERE.

DELINQUENTS MUST EXPLAIN

Commissioners to Decide Whether Fines and Penalties to Be-imposed.

Five thousand residents of Wichita county failed to file income tax returns due to be turned in to the internal revenue collector last spring, according to the estimate of Deputy Collector A. F. Bowden.

The estimate is based upon a list compiled after a careful investigation or "delinquency drive," underway during the past few months.

Complication of the figures now in the hands of the government required the services of three special assistants who are still at work bringing the drive to a conclusion. The assistants are E. C. Jordan, G. S. Murphy and J. J. Alexander.

The law requires single men who made \$1000 or more and married men who made \$2000 or more to file returns. Each delinquent is to be summoned before the revenue collector and asked to explain his failure to file returns.

The full extent of the law governing such cases calls for a fine of \$1000 for failure to file without a reasonable excuse, additional penalty of 25 per cent of the taxable sum, and further fine of \$10,000 if the delinquent is adjudged guilty of wilfully trying to evade the tax.

The revenue officers here are authorized to receive the explanation of alleged delinquents, assess the 25 per cent penalty and submit the question of the additional fines to the commissioner in Washington who is the final judge as to the acceptability of the excuses effered.

In some cases citizens are exempted

In some cases citizens are exempted even from the twenty-five per cent fine, but only in well defined and intrequent instances.

Mr. Bowen expects the majority of the list he has compiled to be able to offer legitimate excuses. The government dees not publicly define what it considers "reasonable" explanation, leaving the collector and commissioner free to use his own judgment.

"Decisions are based on circumstances," Mr. Bowen states, "although the law is of course the general rule "by which we are guided."

In discussing the work of next year in collecting 1919 taxes, Mr. Bowden said he expected Wichita county to pay as great an income tax as any other county in the state, judging from the information he has already in hand. He and his corps of assistants

ESTIMATES BASED ON FINDINGS IN "DELINQUENCY DRIVE"

DELINQUENTS MUST EXPLAIN

nmissioners to Decide Whether Fines and Penalties to Be Imposed.

Five thousand residents of Wichita county failed to file income tax returns due to be turned in to the internal revenue collector last spring, according to the estimate of Deputy Collector A. F. Bowden.

The estimate is based upon a list compiled after a careful investigation or "delinquency drive," underway during the past few months.

Complication of the figures now in the hands of the government required the services of three special assistants who are still at work bringing the drive to a conclusion. The assistants are E. C. Jordan, G. S. Murphy and J. J. Alexander.

The law requires single men who made \$1000 or more and married men who made \$2000 or more to file returns. Each delinquent is to be summoued before the revenue collector and asked to explain his failure to file returns.

The full extent of the law governing such cases calls for a fine of \$1000 for failure to file without a reasonable excuse, additional penalty of 25 per cent of the taxable sum, and further fine of \$10,000 if the delinquent is adjudged guilty of wilfully trying to evade the tax.

The revenue officers here are authorized to receive the explanation of alleged delinquents, assess the 25 per cent penalty and submit the question of the additional fines to the commissioner in Washington who is the final judge as to the acceptability of the excuses offered.

In some cases citizens are exempted even from the twenty-five per cent fine, but only in well defined and infrequent instances.

Mr. Bowen expects the majority of the list he has compiled to be able to offer legitimate excuses. The government does not publicly define what it considers "reasonable" explanation, leaving the collector and commissioner free to use his own judgment.

"Decisions are based on circumstances," Mr. Bowen states, "although the law is of course the general rule "by which we are guided."

In discussing the work of next year in collecting 1919 taxes, Mr. Bowden said he expected Wichita county to pay as great an income tax as any other county in the state, judging from the information he has already in hand. He and his corps of assistants
