

#### DAILY MARKET REPORT. COTTON MARKET.

NEW YORK, Nov. 29.—The cotton market showed continued nervousness and irregularity at the opening today, first prices being 5 to 15 points higher on near months, but 4 to 13 points lower on March and later deliveries. There was further selling on unsetfied outside conditions and the weak opening of the stock and foreign exchange markets, but the unfavorable weather map and bullish spot situation led to near month covering and December sold up to 37.95, or 30 points net higher, while March railled from 33.70 to 53.96, or 10 points above last night close prices. Offerings were lighter late in the morning and prices advanced on covering with December selling up to 38.10 or 45 points net higher, while later months showed net gains of 24 to 50 points with March selling at 34.15. The close was a shade off from the best under realizing, but firm at a net advance of 12 to 50 points on hullish spot news and the better late tone of the spot market.

Cotton closed firm.

New Orleans Cotton.

NEW ORLEANS, Nov. 29.—Reports that mill operatives in New England had voted to strike caused a decline of 17 to 29 points around the opening of the cotton market today, but recent short sellers were cager for profits and their demand aupported the market and caused a reaction.
