



MEETING OF WICHITA COUNTY MOTOR CLUB IS HELD TUESDAY NIGHT

### J. A. KEMP THANKED

Appreciation of His Recent Gift is Voiced—Membership Campaign is Postponed

"As soon as it is flashed over the wires that this little county of Wiehlta has voted \$700,000 good road bonds, every mickels worth of property in the county will have an enhanced value of at least twenty five per cent said Bert Bean, speaking to the Wichita County Motor club at their semi monthly lunch-eon at the Se James last night. Mr. Bean, while discussing the advantages of good reads to the small towns, also made as brief survey of the general made a brief survey of the general advantages of a good roads system in summing up the advantages of the good roads system to the small towns he pointed out that it widens the territory of the small town merchant brings him late touch with the outside world, brings the salesman to whom he has previously been maccessible to his door with products which will see tis door with products which will prove of advantage to him and his community and is one of the chief factors in the development of the town in attracting travel, the travelling public being enable led to see opportunities existing in a place and thus attracted as wermanent setflers. Mr. Bean also remarked that the small town merchant suffers that the small town merchant suffers more than any other from the ravages of the mail order business, and assert ted that the farmer would not so frequently pick out an article from a mail order catalogue if he had good roads to travel on to his trading place. In discussing the cost of the proposed bond issue Mr. Bean pointed out that the average cost of \$44.000 per year, which pays the interest and creates a sinking fund for the retiring of the bords, figures out at approximately 6, 1-2 per cent. He contrasted this with the 8 per cent rate paid by business men for money with which to

business men for money with which to carry on their business, in addition to which they have to pay the principal back. The latter is a profitable transction for the business man, Mr. Bean ails to see how the other could fail to be more so for the county.

"Just as a chain is no stronger than its weakest link, so is a road no better than its worst spot," declared Mr. Bean, referring to the necessity of cooperation in road building. In other words it would do Wichita county little good to build good roads if the adjoining counties did not do likewise. However he declared his belief to be that the people of this county need have no fear on this point, being firmconvinced that a road built from the 'tay county line to the Wilbarger ounty line to the Wilbarger, county line or across the county in other directions would automatically pring about the building of good roads by the people of those counties after little travel over the good roads.
