TILLOTSON RESOLUTION OVER-WHELMINGLY ADOPTED—SEN-ATE REFUSES TO ALLOW H. C. POE STATEMENT INTO JOURNAL

Austin, Tex., Feb. 21.—With only four dissenting votes, the Tillotson resolution providing for creation of conservation, and irrigation districts, was adopted by the House. The vote was 122 to 4. The resolution submits a constitutional amendment for con-servation, drainage and irrigation districts which would be empowered to issue bonds. It had previously passed the Senate.


