Foreign Minister Aguilar, who also has accepted the post of governor of Vera Cruz, has organized additional relief expeditions to care for the sick and homeless and begin work of reconstruction.

ARE TWO ESPECIALLY MENACING DEVELOPMENTS

Denekin's Army is Cut in Two and Blosheviki Claim Capture of Krashovodsk

LONDON, Jan. 8.—The situation in Russia is about as bad as could be, from an anti-Holshevik point of view, according to British war office reports, and there are few signs indicating any likely improvement. There are two especially menacing developments. In the first place General Denikine's army has been cut in two through the Bolshevik push to the sea of Azov at Taganrog, and its flanks have been thrust back, leaving a large gap. In addition there comes a claim from the Bolsheviki of the capture further east of the town of Krasnovodsk, on the Caspian sea, and while this is not confirmed, it is generally accepted as true.

Grave Possibility.

The espture of this important port of Krasnovodak, it is pointed out, creates the grave possibility that the reds may overus northern Persia and occupy Teheran, which probably would mean the establishment of Boishevik rule in Persia. The taking of Krasnovodak permits the reds not only to control a large part of the important K mahnofodak hiera railrhad but gives them free secret to the Caspian. There seems little then to prevent them from gaining control of the Caspian. There remains only a small British force and the poorly organized Persian forces between the reds and the occupation of Teheran and purifier Persia, and the possibility of their obtaining control of the whole country.




