Night News Briefs

PARIS.—The newspaper declared unanimously that the public opinion is out of sympathy with the railroad strike, which apparently is making little headway.

WASHINGTON.—Franklin K. Lane, retiring secretary of the interior, in his final report to President Wilson declared official Washington to be a combination of political caucuses, drawing rooms and civil service bureaus.

NEW YORK.—One hundred bishops of the American Episcopal church sent a cablegram to the archbishops of York and Canterbury protesting against the proposed retention of the Turks in Constantinople and the spoliation of Armenia.

WASHINGTON.—A federal reserve-board statement forecast an early ending of the general expansion which has characterized the war and immediate post-war periods.

CHICAGO.—Announcement was made that General Leonard Wood's name would be placed on the ballot in the Illinois state presidential primary April 13.

WASHINGTON.—It was announced that General March, chief of staff, had ordered drastic reductions of permanent officers of the army from their temporary rank to regular army ranks.

### OLD BRICK PLANT SITE IS PURCHASED; TO BUILD FOUNDRY

F. P. Ernest Jr., of Denver, Colo., has sold to William Holden of Vancouver the four-acre tract known as the old brick plant and for a time operated as a machine shop by the Gulf Welland Manufacturing company.

Mr. Holden's plan is to enlarge the building by the addition of a complete foundry and to erect 20 cottages for his employees.

The foundry, when completed, will be one of the most modern and fully equipped in this part of the country and will be able to take care of all forging, castings and heavy work for the oil fields.

### RIGGING UP STAR ON THE COBB FARM NEAR ELECTRA

ELECTRA, TEX., March 1.—A star rig is being put into position over the Smith well on the Cobb farm, nine miles northwest of Electra and it is reported that the well will be drilled to a depth of 2,000 feet with this rig unless oil in paying quantity is found in the sand at 1720 feet. Six and five-eighths inch casing had been set in this well at 1580 feet and five and three-eighths to a depth of 1720 feet. An oil sand was found at about that depth but the hole was apparently given up and the rig removed. Now a star is being put into position and there is considerable interest in the developments at this test.

### BUILDING OF FACULTY CLUB AT UNIVERSITY IS DAMAGED BY FIRE

AUSTIN, March 21.—Fire of unknown origin caused \$10,000 damage to the building and contents of the University of Texas faculty club here Sunday.

The faculty club, which owns the property, is composed of the university faculty, a number of Austin people and a few out-of-town members. About two-thirds of the loss was covered by insurance, and the club plans to rebuild immediately.

### BLANKET PERMIT FOR BOOZE DELIVERY EXPIRES

AUSTIN, TEX., March 1.—The blanket permit to transport and deliver intoxicating liquors under the state prohibition law which was issued by the state comptroller to the federal railroad administration and which covered for all Texas railroads, expired today when the railroads went back to private ownership.

Several of the larger systems have secured individual permits to handle intoxicating liquors, and the comptroller said that he expected all railroads of the state to apply for permits within a few days.

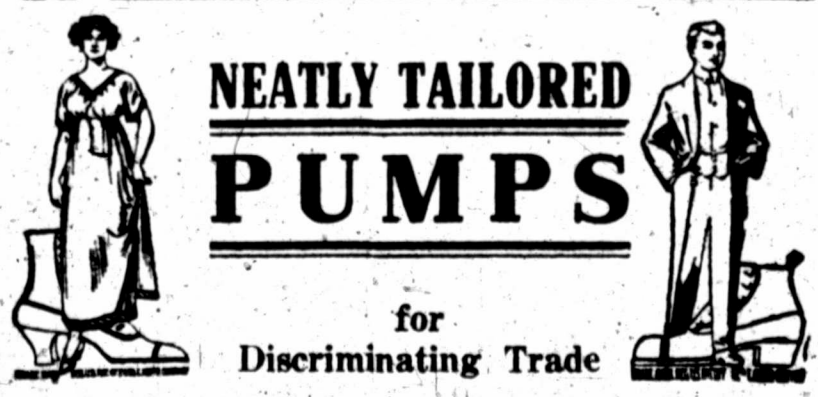

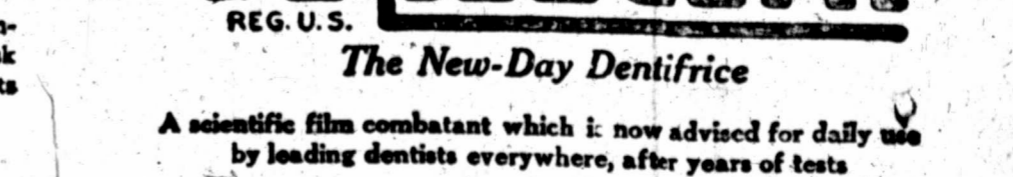

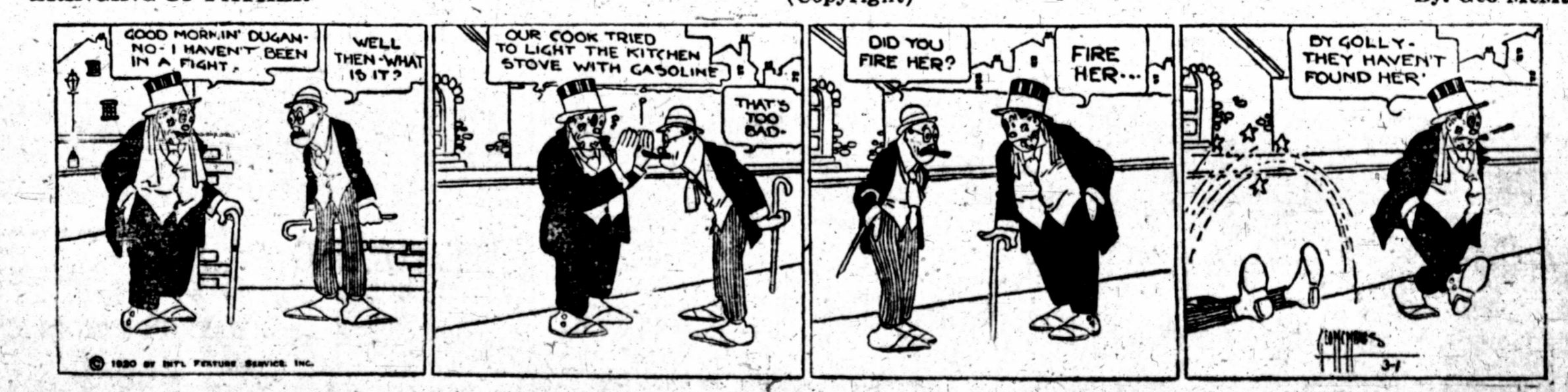

### HUNG JURY IN CASE OF BASHAM AGAINST BURK-WAGGONER CO.

VERNON, TEX., March 1.—The jury in the case of C. E. Basham vs. R. M. Waggoner, Clois L. Green, et al., for damages to the amount of \$125,000, failed to agree and were discharged Saturday night at 9 o'clock. The jury stood ten for the defendants and two for the plaintiff, Basham.

The case went to the jury Saturday morning at 9 o'clock. A week was consumed in the trial which attracted much attention.

The case had been on trial in the district court at Vernon all of last week and attracted larger crowds and received more attention than any litigation tried here for years. The trial was a legal battle participated in by some of the best trained legal talent in Texas.

The first two days were used in securing a jury, with the hearing of evidence taking up the court's time until Friday when the arguments of the attorneys took place.

Damages in the sum of \$125,000 was claimed by C. E. Basham in the suit against the above named parties, and about a dozen lawyers were retained. The defendants were represented by Weeks & Weeks and Charles Spencer of Wichita Falls, and Bonner & Storey of Vernon. Mr. Basham was represented by S. G. Lewis and Barry Miller of Dallas, and Berry, Stokes & Kilgough of Vernon.

The suit is the outgrowth of transactions incident to the organization of the Burk-Waggoner Oil Co., which took place in Vernon, September, 1918, with a capital stock of \$200,000, when R. M. Waggoner, Clois L. Green, Dr. A. P. Howard, E. H. Pigg, A. H. Muchison, Henry Evans, Leo Crenshaw, W. H. Anchor, D. H. Milton, O. P. Darro, L. P. Crenshaw, J. A. Birdsong, and C. E. Basham, formed the company with a full set of officers. J. A. Birdsong and C. E. Basham are alleged to have become insolvent before the well came in and withdrew from the company.

R. M. Waggoner, on whose land the well was drilled, and brought in a producer last April, owning up the Northwest Extension field, was president of the company, and Clois L. Green, vice president and general man-

## OIL BELT RAILROAD HAS SIXTY MILES OF THE GRADE FINISHED

RANGER, TEX., March 1.—At the close of February the Wichita Falls, Ranger & Fort Worth railroad had completed sixty miles of grade and laid track on twelve miles of it. It had filed tariffs with the state and interstate commissions and had become a common carrier. On March 1st the first passenger train on this road was run from Ranger to Edhobby twelve miles south, making three round trips.

It is the intention of Jake L. Hamon, president of the road, to have sixty miles of the road in operation by the last of March or early in April, the date being to an extent dependent upon weather conditions, as there are now no material problems confronting him all these having been disposed of by receipt of the materials.

If the hopes of Mr. Hamon shall be realized the new railroad will have regular train service between Dublin and Frankell in Stephens county, a distance of approximately sixty miles, by the middle of April. That will leave about forty miles to be built in order to connect at Newcastle with the Wichita Falls line already in operation that is owned by the Hamon & Kell interests.

The new railroad is an oil fields line built to reach the development that is continuous along its lines. It will reach the established towns of Dublin, Ranger and Breckenridge and the new towns so far established by Hamon & Kell on this line of Jakehamon, Edhobby, Frankell and Breckhamon, all in the oil fields and all important centers for the oil industry.
