





### PROFESSOR DOW QUILTS FACULTY OF BAYLOR UNIVERSITY

RESULT OF AN ATTACK MADE ON BOOK HE HAD WRITTEN.

#### REV. J. FRANK NORRIS LEADS THE OPPOSITION

Retiring instructor issues a statement explaining his attitude.

WACO, TEXAS, Dec. 9.—An announcement was made here this morning that Prof. Groves Samuel Dow, head of the department of sociology in Baylor university here, has resigned, effective at the end of the academic year of 1921-22. The resignation has been accepted by President S. P. Brooks of the university.

The resignation of Professor Dow comes as a result of charges made against him that certain parts of a book he has written were not in line with the teachings of the Bible and contrary to the Baptist belief. Rev. J. Frank Norris, pastor of the First Baptist church of Fort Worth, led the attack on Professor Dow. In resigning, Professor Dow charges his critics have warped his meaning, misrepresented his teachings and his attempts to live a Christian life.

The book, "Introduction to the Principles of Sociology," was published by the Baylor university press in September, 1920. Since that time it is said to have been adopted as the official text in forty-two colleges over the United States, and is stated to have received favorable criticism from eminent critics. The first attack to be made on the book and the teachings came in December, 1920, when Rev. T. T. Martin of Blue Mountain, Miss., well known as a Baptist evangelist, charged certain parts of the book were not in line with the Christian and Baptist belief.

Others have also charged the book was not orthodox and even charged the author with being an infidel. This fall Rev. J. Frank Norris took up the attack on the book and not only charged Dr. Dow with teaching heresy, but charged Dr. S. P. Brooks, president of the institution, and numbers of others were teaching and backing such dogma. The case was made an issue in the convention of the Texas Baptists and a committee was appointed to look into the teachings in Baptist institutions.

In offering his resignation, Professor Dow made the following statement:

"My critics have taken parts of paragraphs and at times even parts of sentences; they have taken these fragments out of their setting and so warped their meaning as often to express the opposite meaning from that intended. So widely have they circulated these misrepresentations and so ingeniously have they worded their attacks that the majority of Texas Baptists have apparently believed them. I offer no apology for my book, except the regret that the poor construction in places permits misunderstanding by the uneducated and misrepresentation of the unscrupulous. This construction will be changed in the next edition. I have now definitely come to the conclusion that my critics have so misrepresented my book, my teachings and my attempt to live a Christian life, that my work will be hampered if I remain in Baylor university.

"Since I felt that my work as a teacher and an author is just beginning, I think it is not for the best to allow it to be crippled by the harassing of critics by the perpetual requirement of qualifying every single statement I make or write.

"In accepting the resignation Dr. Brooks expressed the deepest regret that the institution shall lose a man of such character."

#### HOUSE ON YALE STREET IS DAMAGED BY FIRE

Damage estimated by firemen as being approximately \$1,800 was sustained at an unoccupied house at 2224 Yale street when fire broke out in the place at 11:15 Thursday night. One corner of the roof was burned away and considerable damage to interior partitions caused by the blaze before it was subdued. The building is owned by E. D. Jefferson of Haskell and was vacated only a few days ago, according to officials of the fire department.

No idea as to the origin of the fire could be expressed by firemen.

### WICHITANS' WELL IN CARSON COUNTY WILL START SOON

Work on the deep test of the Bill-Stone-Bullington company in Carson county is going on in a rapid manner, according to the contractor, Dick Delaney, who returned from Amarillo Thursday. The derrick is up, slush pit finished, the machinery has been shipped and will be installed as soon as it reaches the location. The company expects to begin active drilling in the next two weeks.

Material has arrived for the Texas company's test, which is located in the southwest corner of section 114, block 4 of the Burnett ranch in Carson county, 25 miles north of the town of Panhandle. The Matador Land and Cattle company has started drilling on their test about two miles north of Afton in Dickens county and are down around 700 feet. The well is being drilled with standard tools. Several leases in the nearby vicinity have changed hands during the last week.

### POLICEMAN WITH UNUSUAL RECORD ON RETIRED LIST

NEW YORK, Dec. 9.—Twenty-five years ago, Richard Bermingham, Fordham graduate, cut short a post-graduate course in surgery to become a policeman because, he said, he'd "rather walk a beat than be the world's greatest surgeon." He was on the retired list today with one of the best records in New York police history.

A student of criminology, Bermingham was made a sergeant of detectives, was credited with having many criminals through kind treatment. He was opposed to the "third degree" system of grilling suspects. He loved his job so well that he fought, he said, against promotion, for he didn't want to be taken off the beat. During his career he arrested more than 300 murderers, including Hans Schmidt, slayer of Anna Muller.

### RAID CHINESE DEN ARREST THIRTY AND CONFISCATE DRUGS

CHICAGO, Dec. 9.—Thirty Chinese were arrested, thousands of dollars worth of drugs confiscated and one of the most elaborate opium smoking establishments ever discovered in Chicago broken up by a raid early today led by Inspector William H. Williams and a dozen assistants.

A small five-story building on the northern fringe of Chicago's Chinatown had been remodeled with scores of tiny rooms partitioned off on the upper floors. Repeated search of the labyrinthian passages disclosed caches of opium and yen shi, many Chinese still smoking and others just leaving rooms where smoking pipes had been dropped.

One room was stacked high with cans of crude opium. Most of the Chinese declared they had recently come from California and Oregon. A truck load of drugs was confiscated. Inspector Williams declared that at retail prices the seized drugs were valued at more than \$100,000.

### TEXTILE MILLS IN EAST ARE HUMMING

Mum This Pre-Christmas Season As They Have Not For Some Time Before.

BOSTON, Dec. 9.—Spindles in New England textile mills are humming this pre-Christmas season as they have not hummed since the business slump which followed the war.

While returns from other New England industries do not reflect holiday conditions generally bright, the employment survey is authoritative for the statement "the general feeling is optimistic for a marked improvement in all lines of industry after the New Year."

Shoe industries were said to be comparatively quiet, due to the seasonal slump in business at this season. Lumber and its auxiliary products, including paper and pulp, were declared to be showing improvement.
