WASHINGTON, Jan. 31.—Ninety-seven persons, according to a final and official list issued today by the District of Columbia authorities, lost their lives in the collapse Saturday night under a burden of snow of the Knickerbocker theater roof.

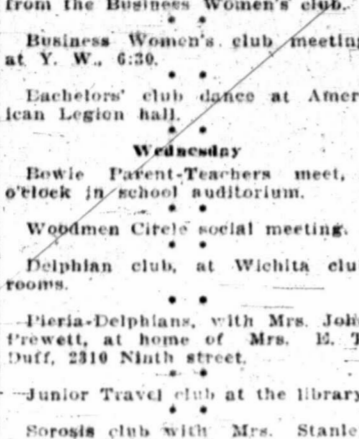

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE COMMITTEE TO HOLD MEETING FEBRUARY 10.

### BUSINESS LANDLORDS REPORTED CO-OPERATING

Believed Most of Cases Before Committee Can Be Beneficially Adjusted.

While it was felt that residence renters here have largely adjusted themselves, as more houses were built, it was thought that some complaints would be received. ## VALUE OF BOXING DEPENDS UPON AGE

One Never Too Young to Start in the Game But Age Bars the Way.

What is the value of boxing as an exercise for the civilian?  
That question is asked me more than any other by persons anxious to take up gymnasium work.

Boxing is a fine exercise for the civilian, but it has its limitations. It is not a game that is an age limit that governs its value.

One is never too young to start to learn the boxing game. Boxing makes for confidence in the youth, which is most desirable. While it is never too young to start, there comes a time when age bars the way.

Unless the man is a physical marvel I should say that boxing is more injurious than helpful. It has been proven that boxing is far too strenuous for most men after they have passed the 35 mark. It calls for entirely too much heart action.

To get the most good out of boxing, those participating must be of the physical condition. By that I mean no one should continue to box for a single second after they become fatigued.

Offers Some Good Advice  
Any exercise which is taken after fatigue has set in, is very harmful. It should be agreed between the boxers that the moment one of them becomes tired he should have the right to call time and end the round.

I have practiced that theory in developing all my professional boxers. In so doing I have used methods directly opposite to those employed by most managers and locker room boys. I have been fairly successful.

When my professional boxers are training for bouts I never allow them to watch on them to see that each round goes the required limit. Neither do I have a bell to announce the start and finish of a round.

I instruct all my boys to call time the moment they begin to tire. Likewise, I want them to immediately suspend action the moment a boxer receives a blow that has him on the verge of a knockout.

I never allow a boy to suffer a knockout in his training work. That tends to destroy his confidence in himself, the very thing that I am trying to instill in him.

The civilian who boxes merely for exercise should follow the rules that I have laid down for my professionals.

Always Use Big Gloves  
I would say that boxing is an ideal exercise up to the age of 35. If indulged in under the restrictions I have stated, it is a very healthy game.

The bigger the gloves used the better. So I would say that golf, volley ball, or setting-up exercises would be far better than boxing as an exercise.

## TODAY'S Sport Angle

In analyzing the possibilities of baseball, have you ever given any thought to the part that throws from the outfield in deciding ball games. Probably not, because when one thinks of an outfielder, he first looks him over from the standpoint of a batter, then gives him some consideration and finally passes judgment on his fitness as a foot.

As a rule one seldom pays much attention to the throwing arm. If a fielder has a strong whip and can leave the ball a great distance, the fan momentarily marvels at the throw and then forgets the throwing feature of an outfielder is of the greatest importance. It is far more than most people think. It is so much the ability of a fielder to throw a great distance, as it is for him to throw the ball to the proper place and do it accurately.

"More ball games are lost through erratic throwing by the outfielders than the majors than by muffed fly balls," is the statement Hughes Jennings made to me one day last January.

At first I thought Hughes must have been dreaming, but as I gave the matter further consideration, I was just about willing to admit that his dope was right. Inside of two months after Hughes had made his wise crack to me I counted 12 games that were lost through erratic throwing.

What is meant by erratic throwing? I will try to explain. We will assume the score is 5 to 1 in favor of the team in the field. There is a runner on second base and two men out. That makes it necessary for the visiting team to get two runs to tie the game.

In most cases a runner on second can score on a base hit. Since two runs are needed to tie, the thing to do is for the batter to come through with a base hit to forget about the runner on second and hold the batsman in first.

In a great many cases on such a play an outfielder will take a wild chance and throw to the plate. Such a throw seldom gets the runner and invariably permits the batsman to reach second on his hit, where he is in a position to score on a base hit and tie the game.

On the surface that seems like an ordinary play, but time and again during the season it is improperly played, and endangers many a ball game.—E. H.

## LATE TIM HURST AWARDED HONOR FOR BEST BIT OF REPORTEER ON BALL FIELD

A lot of funny stunts are pulled on the ball field. The fans would get many a laugh if they could hear the remarks that are passed between players and managers. I have heard so many good comments that it seems I could fill a book telling about them. However, to my way of thinking, the honor for the best bit of reporeer I ever heard on the ball field goes to the late Tim Hurst.

"Tim," as everyone knows, had been playing ball in a very hot hand during the season. He had pulled on the ball field. He had an answer for every one and every thing.

To get into an argument with Hurst was to lose it. It did not take him long to get into an argument with you. He would talk to you for an hour or so, and you would be left with a headache.

Series Was Very Important  
I saw late in the season and we were playing ball in a very important series. In about the eighth inning of a game in which we were leading by a run, Detroit got run-

ners on first and second with two down and Cook up.

I worked carefully on Cobb until the count was two and two. In these days I had a good curve. I started me over for what I thought was a perfect third strike. Hurst called it ball three.

As he did so I could hear the tramp tramp of Jones' feet as he dashed in from center field to protect me.

"What are you putting me out of the game for? I haven't said a word to you," I demanded.

"It is not for anything you've said, but for what you are thinking about me," replied Hurst, and Jones retired for the day.

"To retaliate, there is a certain pitcher in the American league who has the gothic almost exclusively. His pitching repertoire consists of a slippery spitball, a fast ball that is as much as a string and just an ordinary curve. The pitcher realizes the danger to his own best hit."

I have six or seven times four months in every first one. Having the curve by a spitball, even when you know it is coming. His fast ball however is very inviting. 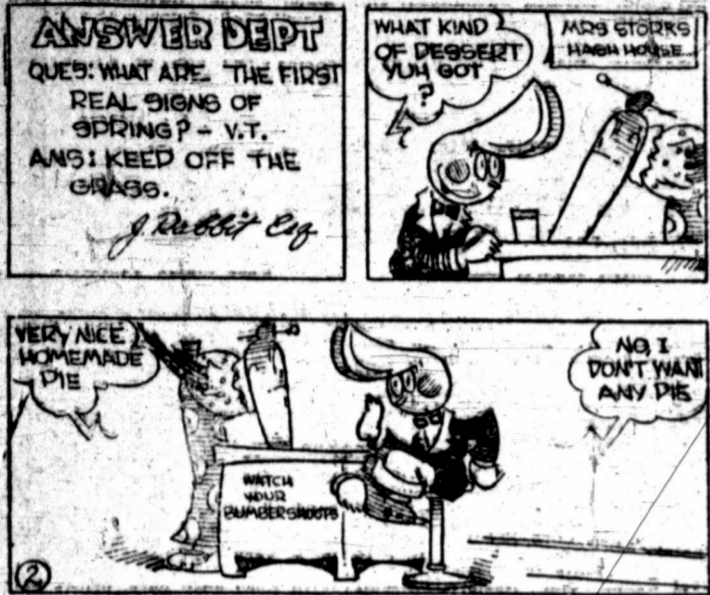

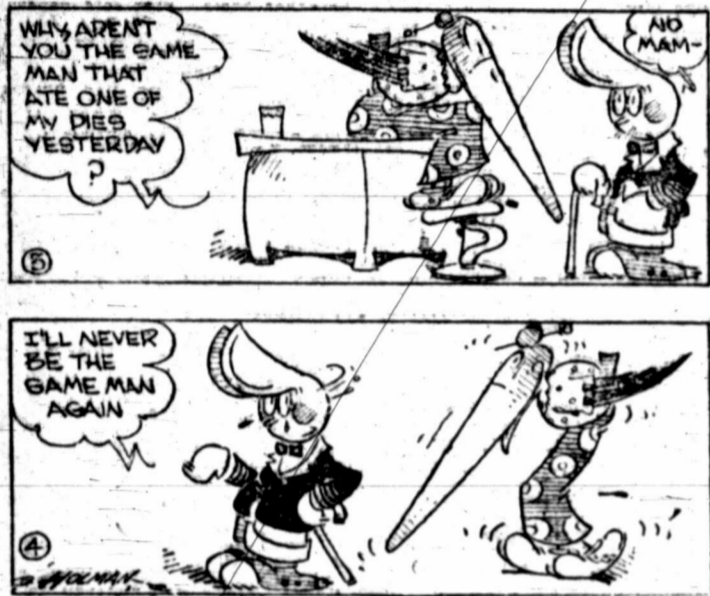

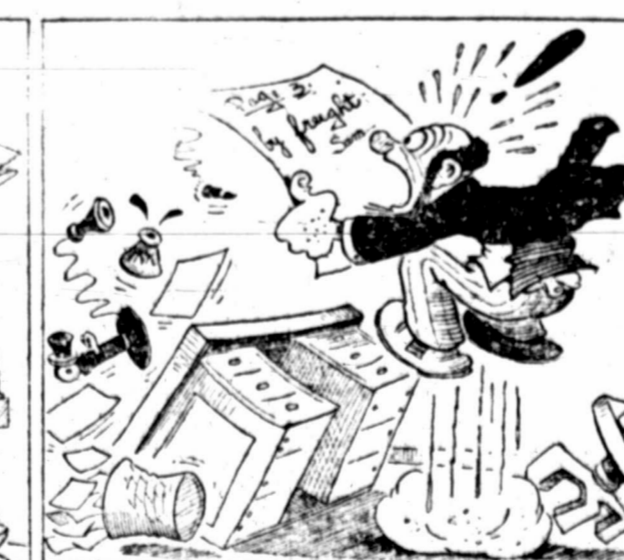

### ADMIT 7 PATIENTS TO INSANE ASYLUM TUESDAY MORNING

#### WOMEN FROM THIS COUNTY ARE FIRST TO BE RECEIVED AT INSTITUTION.

### EXPECT CAPACITY TO BE REACHED SHORTLY

Superintendent Warns Officials Not to Send Patients Here Until Authorized.

Seven women from Wichita county were moved Tuesday morning to the Northwest Texas Insane Asylum at Lake Wichita, being the first patients to be admitted. They were removed there from the county jail. There are nine other patients from this county to be transferred shortly.

Patients will be admitted in small numbers for the next two months until the capacity of the institution, about 150, is reached. Dr. P. S. White, superintendent, Tuesday repeated his former warning to officials not to send inmates here until notified that they will be received.

Dr. White estimates that there are enough inmates in the jail at present to fill up the asylum here. The buildings erected at the lake constitute but one unit of an asylum that will have a capacity of about 3,000, but it will require a number of years to complete the institution.

### Up to Date Equipment

Comfortable beds in clean, well-ventilated wards, plenty of substantial food, and expert attendance and treatment, are provided for the patients. Two of the hospital buildings are now ready for occupancy. In addition to the administration building, the four buildings of the hospital proper, being practically alike in construction and arrangement. The south end of each building is used for wards, of which several are individual. In some other arrangements to accommodate up to half a dozen patients. At the north end, on the lower floor, is the dining room, which is furnished with tables and chairs. The arrangement of the upper floor is similar, except that the north end is used for an operating room.

### Assistants Named

The administration building is used for the office and for living quarters for the superintendent and his assistants. For the present, Dr. White will have two assistants, Dr. J. W. Moore and Dr. J. F. Fullingim of Decatur. The ground floor will be used for the administrative offices.

### Directly in charge, administration building is a structure used at present for a storehouse. R. E. Munsch has been appointed storekeeper and a large supply of medical supplies has already been placed in the building. An ice machine, a bakery and a small cold storage plant are also in the building.

### As the institution grows, the second floor of this building will be used for a central dining hall, but will be used for storage purposes for the present.

### On the third floor of this building is a hall, with a small stage, where entertainments will be given and where such diversion as is suitable will be provided. Dr. White expects to install a moving picture machine later.

### Will Rejoice Grounds

A commodious and equipped home for the nurses, a heating plant and a laundry complete the list of buildings.

### Driveways and walks are now under construction, and Dr. White plans to start the planting of trees and shrubbery within a short time. It is his hope to make the grounds as attractive as possible and to beautify them from time to time as funds permit. In front of the administration building, and extending the lawn, a gravel driveway is being laid, and gravel roads and concrete walks will connect all features of the institution. The site at present is a rather bare and unadorned one, and it is part of Dr. White's program to remedy this condition as speedily as possible.
