USE OF SCOTLAND PARK FOR TOURISTS IS URGED BY BOARD

In a letter addressed to members of the city council, members of the municipal park board have taken issue with A. L. Huey on the latter's protest against using Scotland park for a tourist camping ground. The board decided to open the Scotland tract to automobile tourists when it was ascertained that the Jalisco street tract, originally acquired for a tourist camp site, could not be equipped with shade and suitable conveniences for another year, and that it would cost \$14,000 to make the needed improvements. Shade, water, cooking facilities and toilets are already available in Scotland. The park board points out, so that the temporary use of that park for automobile tourists seemed desirable. The park board also contends that in using Scotland Park as a tourist camp ground, the city is not violating its agreement with the owners of the tract as the tract is maintained as a park from year to year. The board suggests that a limit of 48 hours be placed on campers so as to avoid anyone trying to make a permanent home there. Dr. J. F. Reed, the city council's representative on the park board, is understood to favor using Jalisco park for the purpose. The matter is expected to come up for further action by the council.

NEARLY ALL POOLS INCREASE IN RUNS; DISTRICT GAIN 5,500

A gain of approximately 5,500 barrels daily is reported for the week ending in the north and central Texas fields, with a total daily average of 154,375 barrels for the entire district. Many good wells were completed in nearly all counties comprising the district. Stephens is fast getting back to its normal production of a few months ago and by the aid of several good wells, including the Mid-Kansas Tullahoma and the Texas company and Cato wells, increased the runs to over 3,500 barrels. Electra also showed a gain in the neighborhood of 1,000 barrels due to the late completions in the south pool. In the Eastland and Pioneer section a gain of 500 barrels is shown. A number of wells brought in in the latter field. The Burk Burnett field fell off 500 barrels during the week and all other fields remained practically stationary. Below is the week's runs by pools:

A woman who had left her machine in the safety zone near a downtown corner, admitted her guilt, but was so earnest in her protestation of ignorance of the law that no fine was assessed. She had been driving a car only since Monday, she told the court. The fact that she appeared in person, something which most female traffic offenders shun to do, probably had something to do with the failure to assess a fine.

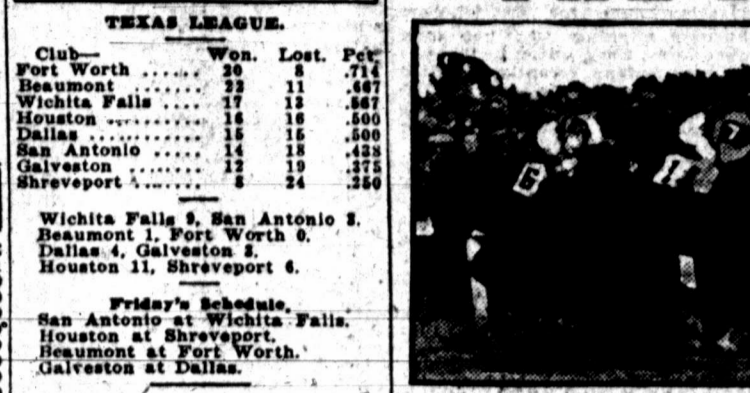
