

NORTHWEST TEXAS EPWORTH LEAGUERS CONFERENCE ENDS

CLARENDON MEETING LARGELY ATTENDED AND VERY SUCCESSFUL.

CLIFFORD B. CASE OF AMARILLO PRESIDENT

Ablene District Is Awarded the Efficiency Banner Sunday Afternoon.

CLARENDON, TEXAS, June 12.—The first annual assembly of the Northwest Texas Epworth League closed here Sunday after a successful season that has set high precedent in the league work.

Saturday night was stung night and the Clarendon district leaders won the first prize with a farce representing a group of Knights of the Ku Klux Klan coming unexpectedly upon a group of negro gamblers. The stunt was considered all the more up-to-date in view of the fact that the Ku Klux had paraded here only two evenings before. Amarillo won the second place in the contest and Lubbock third.

Efficiency banners were awarded Sunday afternoon and the Ablene district won with more than 100 per cent efficiency leagues than any other district. Sweetwater district won the banner in the poster contest, which consisted of exhibiting the most attractive posters inviting an attendance at a league service.

The officers installed for the following year are: Clifford B. Casey, Amarillo, president; Miss Llewellyn Deason, Amarillo, secretary; Miss Thelma Longham, Abilene, treasurer, and Mrs. J. W. Hawkins, Stamford, superintendent life service work.

Fiducies for the African missionary work amounted to almost \$4,000, although the confidence goal had been set at only \$2,500.

The total number of life service volunteers who pledged themselves to some definite work during this conference was more than 50.

Rev. H. B. Watts of Lockney occupied the pulpit at the morning hour. Following his powerful sermon more than 250 leaguers consecrated themselves to the work of the church.

At the close of the business session Sunday afternoon the leaguers stood and with great feeling sang "God Be With You Till We Meet Again," following which came the benediction.



ADMINISTRATION OF REILY ENDORSED BY PORTO RICAN LABOR

CINCINNATI, OHIO, June 12.—The administration of E. Mont Reily as governor of Porto Rico, was endorsed in reports submitted to the 42nd annual convention of the American Federation of Labor today by Santiago Iglesias, president of the Free Federation of Workers of Porto Rico.

Declaring that organized labor in Porto Rico had been dealt with fairly by Governor Reily whose administration has been attacked both in the island and in the United States, President Iglesias asserted on behalf of his federation that "so far as we have been able to observe his official acts in Porto Rico we believe that they have been inspired by the best of motives and that it has been his aim to promote justice and fair dealing for every one."

Governor Reily is opposing separation of Porto Rico from the United States, Mr. Iglesias said, "took a position which had been sustained for more than 20 years by Porto Rican labor." Other acts of the governor praised by the Porto Rican labor leader included appointment of a mediation and conciliation commission with regard to representation of bona fide organizations, labor grant of pardons to a number of strike leaders; assistance in conferences at Washington in efforts to settle strikes of cigar makers, railroad workers and longshoremen, demanding the resignation of certain judges and police officers "whose conduct has been improperly hostile to labor," and appointment of a new chief of the insular bureau of labor from the ranks of organized labor.

M'CAULEY MAN IS IN STAMFORD HOSPITAL RESULT OF SHOOTING

PORT WORTH, June 12.—John McClung is in a sanitarium at Stamford as the result of being shot four times early last night at McCauley, Fisher county. A message from Stamford this morning stated that his recovery is doubtful.

C. M. Millap, county commissioner of precinct No. 2, went to Roby and surrendered to Sheriff Lambert, who placed him under appearance bond of \$1,000. The cause of the shooting is not known.

REVELATION SERVICES NORTH SIDE METHODIST CHURCH

On Saturday night the congregation attending the North Side revival services were regaled with a thrilling account of the social and religious life in Cho-sen, as the native call Korea.

The engaging recital of a Methodist missionary's experiences and work was given by Rev. E. M. Anderson, a medical missionary who is on furlough in the Orient after seven years labor in that distant Asiatic peninsula of 84 thousand square miles and about 15 thousand souls, seeking by education and western civilization to become independent of the tyrannical domination of Japan.

At the evening service of Sunday, Evangelist H. C. Hand gave the large and deeply interested audience a searching sermon on the "Revival of a Dead Church," Revelation 3:1. The supreme test of a live church is not the building of organized forces however splendid in equipment, but soul-winning. No other way justly claim to be a church of Jesus Christ.

A brief biography of Wesley, Luther, Whitfield, and other flaming evangelists was used to substantiate the preacher's contention. He said the same divine power shall be ours today, if we pay the price. The cause of spiritual deadness in a church he claimed was simply failure to maintain its covenant relation with God. Simon failed when he severed that relation, and when a church or individual lays its head in the lap of Belial, the loss of power inevitably follows. The neglect of the daily study of and delight in the word of God also woefully weakens the spiritual strength.

SECOND LETTER IN CONNECTION WITH WARD-PETERS CASE

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., June 12.—District Attorney Weeks, investigating the death of Clarence Peters, whom Walter S. Ward confessed shooting as the outcome of a blackmail plot, said today if the evidence warranted, he would ask the grand jury to return an indictment against Ward.

A second letter in possession of the county authorities, which is said to bear on the case, was found on Elwood Heffner, of New Rochelle, who was arrested Saturday night on a charge of forgery. It bears the signature of Ward. It was addressed to Arthur J. Blute at Jamaica, N. Y., and to the Westchester county authorities. Heffner said the letter was in answer to one he had delivered 40 Ward on May 14, two days before the killing of Peters.

The police say that Heffner, who acted as a go-between for Blute and Ward, was a follower of the race track.

Among other things found in the letter on Heffner, was the following: "Am not interested in any further information of that kind. My letter addressed to H. G. Byrnes, general delivery, Louisville, Ky., was returned to me. Is that your address you have for him?"
