Some minor difficulties among three negroes the evening of last week ago at the dance hall at Lake Wichita, ended at 12:30 o'clock Wednesday noon when one of the women shot another in the chest, the third placed in the county jail.

Laura Buford, who resided with her sister in a servant's house at 1729 Collins street in East Wichita, her sister, the Buford woman, was killed and a third woman was wounded in her foot which was covered one of her toes. The shooting took place on a vacant lot near the corner of Collins and Baylor streets.

Ely Allen, the negro who is charged with the shooting, was placed under arrest by Officers Daves and Johnson of the city police. She was turned over to the county officials and lodged in jail to await a hearing which has been set for 9 o'clock Thursday morning.

According to the officers they were summoned to the scene a short time after the shooting by a telephone call which informed them that the negroes are just killing each other out here on Collins street. After the arrival of the officers the Allen woman was captured several blocks west of the house which was turned over to the police. She was carrying a .38 caliber automatic.

While the Allen woman was being taken to the hospital, she was escorted by the two women and forced to flee in fear of her life. She said that at the time of the shooting she had a long red handkerchief.

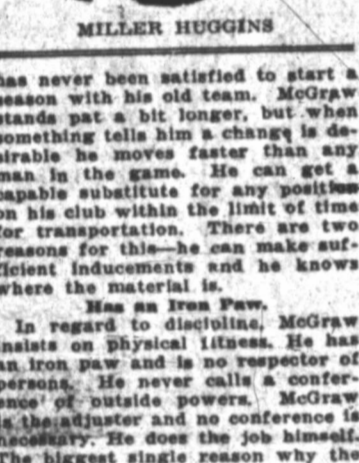

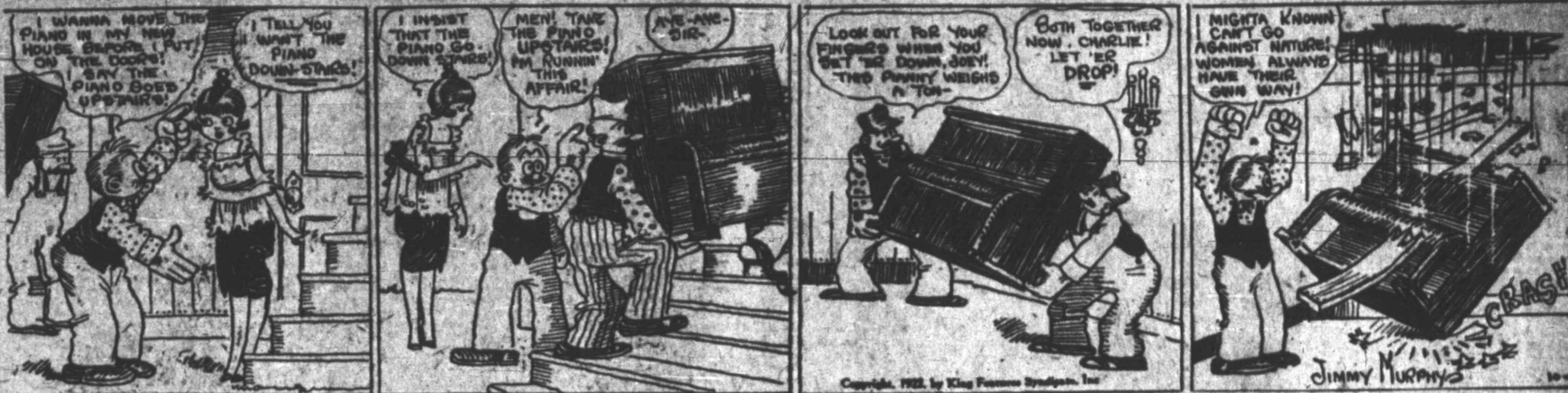
