Star Lites

The current recession has slowed growth of state tax revenues in nearly every state. As expected, politicians and bureaucrats in states without personal income taxes use the opportunity to "prove" that an income tax is necessary for the continuation of essential state services. Texas and Florida are the two largest states without an income tax; the other income tax free states are Alaska, Nevada, South Dakota, Washington, and Wyoming. Connecticut, New Hampshire, and Tennessee do not tax wage or salary income.

Certainly an income tax will fuel the expansion of state government. Based on the experiences of the eight most recent states to adopt an income tax, we can expect that adopting even a modest 3 to 4 percent state tax on personal income will increase state spending over 20 percent over the next decade. So if expanding the size and scope of state government is the goal, an income tax is a very effective way to achieve it.

But a state income tax is also a strong prescription for slowing economic growth. Taxing income discourages individuals and families from undertaking additional work or more demanding jobs, adding to their savings or investments, undertaking the risk of new enterprise, or expending more time and energy in generating new income. These disincentives are accentuated in state taxation because individuals and firms confronting state income taxes have the option of migrating to states without income taxes or initially locating new enterprises in these states.

A computer simulation undertaken for the Texas Public Policy Foundation estimated that a Texas state income tax would reduce personal income 8 to 9 percent below otherwise forecast for the year 2000, an annual loss of nearly \$40 billion to the citizens of the state.

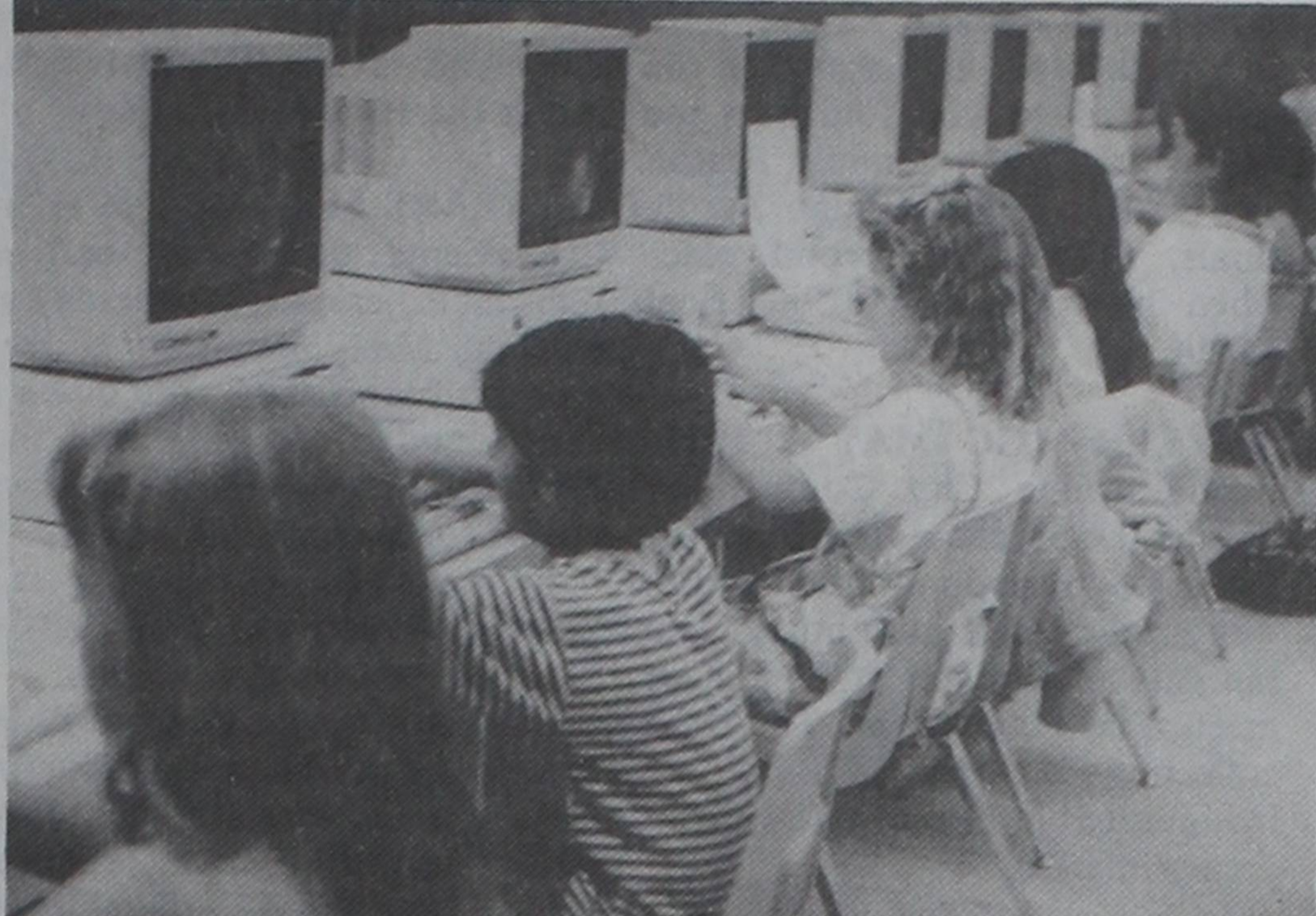
Whatever the problems confronting Texas state government, they are certainly not caused by lack of tax revenue growth. State tax collections rose 9.6 percent from 1980 to 1988, while the cost of living rose 43.5 percent in that same period.

But if Texans are convinced that additional revenues are required, user fees and consumption taxes will have a much less damaging effect on the economy. The often-repeated argument that consumption taxes are regressive overlooks the fact that sales taxes in Texas and most other states exclude food, shelter, and medical costs—items that account for over 70 percent of the expenditures of low income families.

Of course, revenues from user fees and consumption taxes do not keep pace with state spending during economic recessions. Largely for this reason, politicians and bureaucrats regularly seek a more "elastic" source of revenue, that is to say, one that allows them to keep up spending during good times and bad.

But if American families must do a little belt-tightening during recessions, we might expect state governments to do the same. Indeed, a recession presents an opportunity for policy makers to undertake some serious government cost-cutting. Political leaders in Texas, Florida, and other states stand at crossroads. They can use the current budget squeeze to impose new taxes on their people, or they undertake the much more difficult task of making state government more efficient.

## Noted Artist Will Have Local Display

Noted artist, sculptor, author, Kenneth Wyatt, will have a one-day exhibit of his work at the Friona State Bank on Thursday, June 6.

A western artist working in oil, water-color, pencil, pastel, charcoal and sculpture, Wyatt produces his work for the public in original form, prints, note cards, limited edition sculpture and through his books as author and poet. His book exhibit will include "The Apostles," the most recent publication by Wyatt.

Wyatt's water-color and oil paintings are characterized by their fine attention to small details, feeling of intense emotions and depiction of realistic scenes from western life.

Wyatt has been interested in horses since his family raised Shetland ponies on their Texas farm. He turned to painting after 32 years as a Methodist minister, serving churches throughout Texas.

Both President Reagan and Queen Elizabeth of Great Britain have been presented Wyatt paintings, which show cowboys wearing yellow slickers in a rainstorm; riding their horses while herding cattle.

"I like to think, when Queen Elizabeth visited President Reagan, she may have spotted my painting of him on a wall and said, 'Oh, I have one of those.' It may have been the only thing they had in common to talk about," said Wyatt.

"I first started doing portraits. One day, someone asked me, 'Can you paint a horse?' and I said, 'Yes,' although I never had done one," Wyatt continued. "I figured it couldn't be that much more different than painting people."

Eventually, Wyatt's second career as a professional artist—he contends he never has had a formal painting lesson—developed to the current stage where he is a one-man western enterprise; creating sculpture pieces, designing belt buckles and western-style jewelry, painting western scenes and publishing his own art books.

In recent years, the Tulsa artist and sculptor gained national

recognition when he was commissioned to paint "Offer Them Christ," commending 200 years of Methodism in the United States. Following this, Wyatt painted portraits of the 12 apostles, Paul and Jesus.

Each portrait was painted after the artist saw a man he considered to be "just right" for each apostle. Each portrait is the culmination of extensive research conducted by the artist. With his clergy background and training, Wyatt knew many of the sources to tap for information of the apostles' ages, appearances and personalities.

Some of his investigation took him to Episcopalian and Catholic libraries and clergy. "I wanted to get to the legends, too," Wyatt said. "For instance, legend says that Bartholomew always wore a white robe with a purple stripe that never got dirty." The portraits have inspired the artist to consider another similar project—fourteen paintings of women from the Bible.

The works of Kenneth Wyatt will be available for one day only during banking hours on June 6. The public is invited to take advantage of this outstanding exhibit at Friona State Bank.

## Friona Man Dies In Collision

A head-on collision between a car and a tractor-trailer rig late last Friday night claimed the life of 31-year-old Javier Rivera of Friona, police said.

Rivera was pronounced dead at the scene at 12:25 a.m. Saturday by Justice of the Peace Frances Euler.

The driver of the truck, 37-year-old Patricia Sowers of Akron, Ohio, was taken by ambulance to Parmer County Community Hospital in Friona. She was treated for leg bruises and released, police said.

The accident occurred at 11:29 p.m., nine miles east of Friona on U.S. 60, according to State Department of Public Safety reports.

Rivera was westbound at a high rate of speed in a 1984 Pontiac four-door automobile, and Mrs. Sowers was eastbound in a 1989 Freightliner that was hauling a van trailer, according to reports.

Rivera, who apparently was in the eastbound lane at the time, collided head-on with the truck, reports said. The impact knocked his vehicle back 167 feet and the Pontiac caught fire, police said.

A passer-by stopped and extinguished the fire before emergency personnel arrived. Friona Volunteer Fire Department firefighters used a Jaws of Life to free Rivera, said DPS Trooper Trey Ellis.

It took the volunteers a considerable amount of time to free Rivera's body from the wreckage.

The collision also caused the tractor-trailer to block both lanes of traffic for a time, Ellis said.

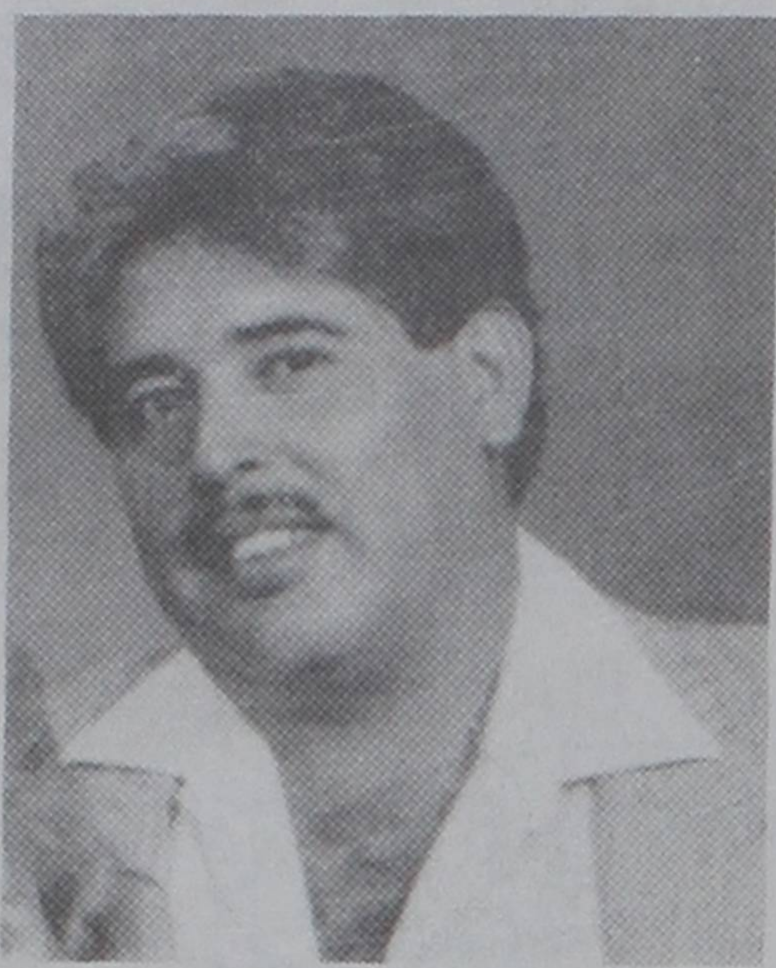
## Rites Held Mon. For J. Rivera

### 60 YEARS AGO--MAY 15, 1931

Judging has been completed in the Friona Star's letter contest on the subject of "Where Should the County Seat Be Located so as to Serve the Greatest Number of Parmer County Citizens With the Greatest Convenience?" Prize winners were Joe Mimms, who received \$10 in gold, and Miss Jeannette Williams, who received a \$5 gold piece. All of the letters agreed that Friona was the logical place for the Courthouse, and their reasons were many.

### 55 YEARS AGO--MAY 15, 1936

Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Roden have moved their household goods from Friona to Hereford, where they will make their home indefinitely. Ralph is connected with his brother, J.J. Roden, in the drug business here and now also at Hereford, and has been here for the past year assisting in the City Drug Store of this city.

### 50 YEARS AGO--MAY 16, 1941

Twenty-eight seniors will receive their diplomas on May 23 at commencement exercises at Friona High School. Leading the class of 20 girls and eight boys with an average of 94.1 is Jacquelyn Wilkison, who will deliver the valedictory address. Betty Ann Taylor, with a 92.5 average, will give the salutatory.

## Screening Program Scheduled Locally

The Breast Cancer Screening Program of the Don and Sybil Harrington Cancer Center and High Plains Baptist Hospital of Amarillo will continue community outreach clinics for early detection of breast cancer.

Funding is available through the Texas Cancer Council for screening mammography for Texas residents qualifying for financial assistance.

Early detection of breast cancer is the major goal of cancer control for each woman seen in the clinic. The clinic provides low cost screening which includes a breast exam by a Registered Nurse trained in breast cancer detection, teaching of breast self-examination and a mammogram.

Currently, the most effective method known to win the battle against breast cancer is early detection. Early detection is best done by following the guidelines recommended by the American Cancer Society for breast cancer screening for women who have no signs or symptoms of breast cancer. The guidelines are:

1. Learn and perform breast self-examination every month.
2. Have a physical examination

every year.  
3. Have a mammogram according to the recommendations by age. Ages: 35-40, one baseline mammogram; 40-50, a mammogram every 1-2 years; over 50, yearly mammograms.

A clinic will be held in Friona on Wednesday, June 19, from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. at the Parmer County Community Hospital. Exams are done by appointment only. As a member of the Delta Delta Delta National Sorority, she served on several committees; was scholarship chairman, social development chairman, and was "Pledge of the Week."

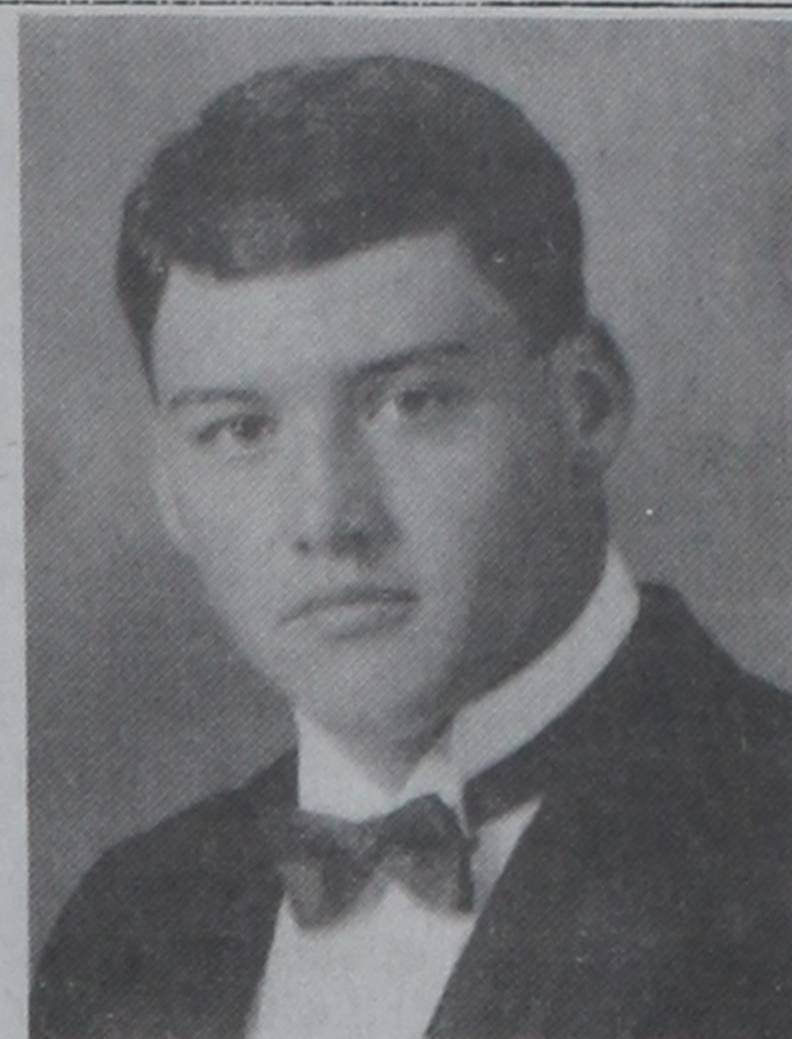
Miss Osborn was active in intramural basketball, playing on the campus championship team, 1990.

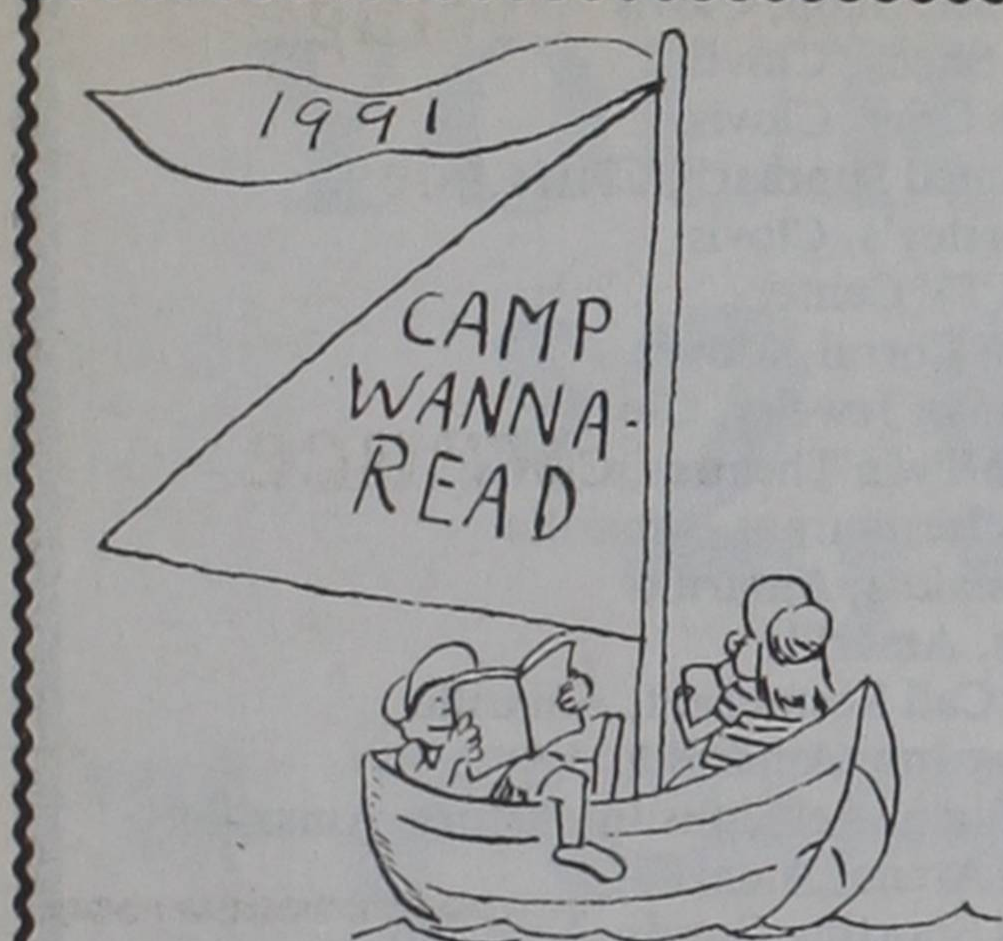
## Local Girl Is Honored

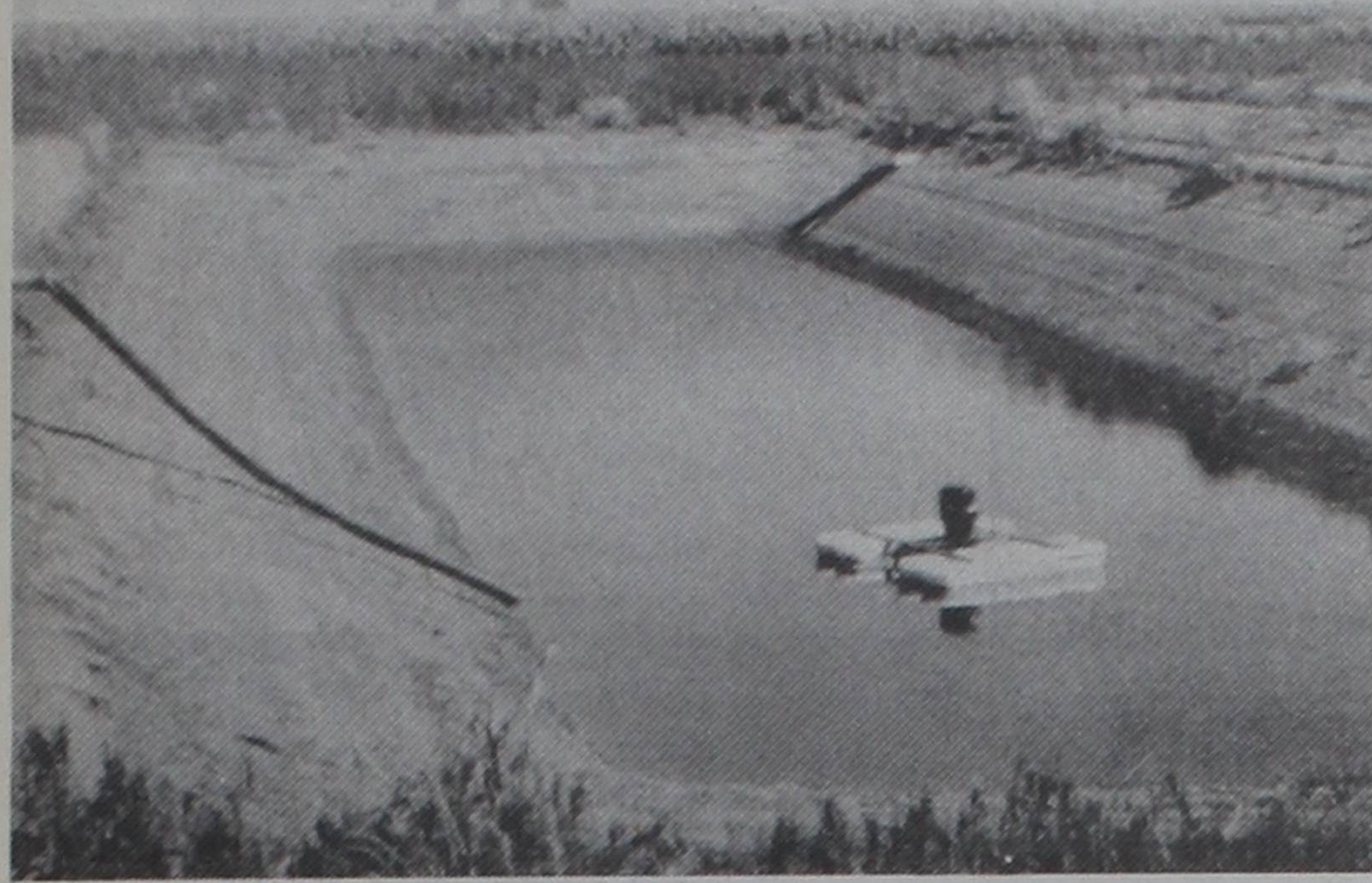

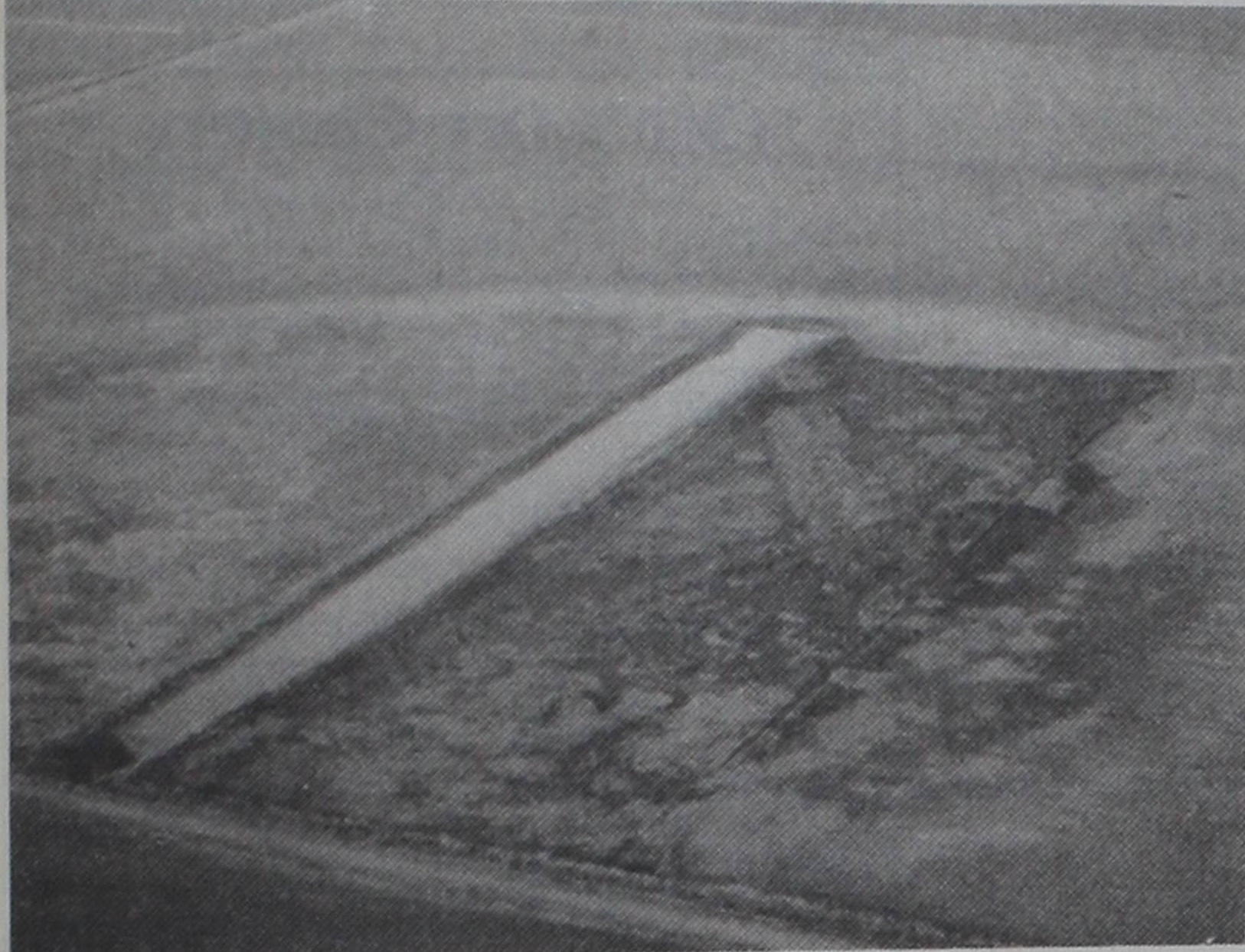

## Tailwater Pits, Lakes Stop Waste

Approximately 1,444 tailwater return pits and 1,289 modified playa basins are currently being used to capture irrigation tailwater and rainfall runoff for reuse within the 5.5 million acre High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1 service area, according to a recent district inventory.

Deaf Smith County leads the water district with 451 tailwater return pits, followed by Parmer County with 338 and Castro County with 309.

There are approximately 300 modified playa basins in Floyd County. Castro County follows with 263 modified playas and Parmer County has 186.

Excess irrigation water, or "tailwater," running off the end of a field has been a serious concern of the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1 since its creation in 1951. The primary cause of tailwater were furrow runs in excess of about one-half mile which required large flow rates to literally "push" the water through the furrows.

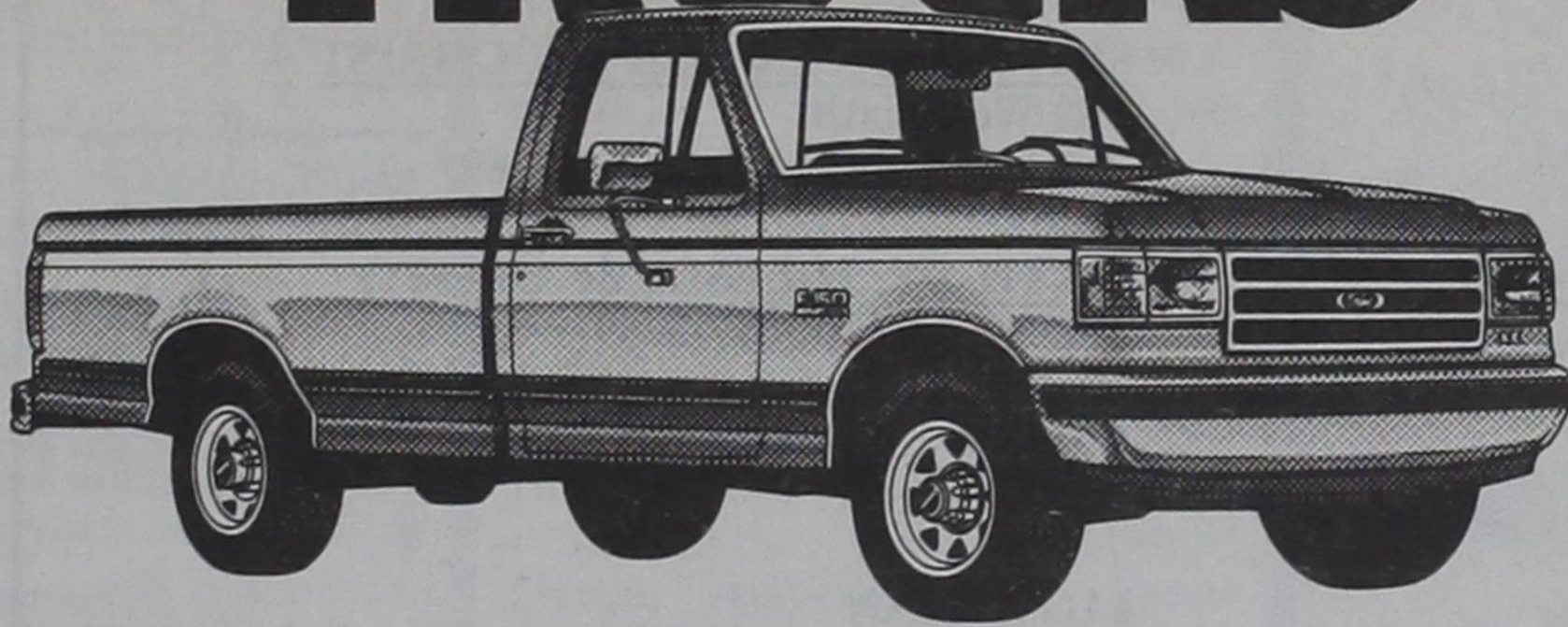
In the mid-1960s, the water district constructed V-notch weirs and placed them in county bar ditches to measure actual tailwater losses. Flood gauges installed in front of the weirs measured the height of the water flowing through the weir. Signs showing the conversion of the inches of water passing through the weirs into gallons per minute were placed inside each installation.

The district's study concluded that as much as 20% of the volume of water pumped by an irrigator could be lost as irrigation tailwater. In addition, it was discovered that tailwater waste encouraged soil erosion.

Since then, the district has actively promoted the use of tailwater return systems to stop accumulation of silt in bar ditches, flooding of county roads, damage to neighboring fields and to conserve precious groundwater resources.






The water district designed and constructed several tailwater return demonstration systems in the 1960s. Public tours of these demonstration systems was one method used by the district to promote the adoption of this water conservation technique. The positive results obtained from these first tailwater return pit installations convinced many irrigators to install and use tailwater return systems on their farms.

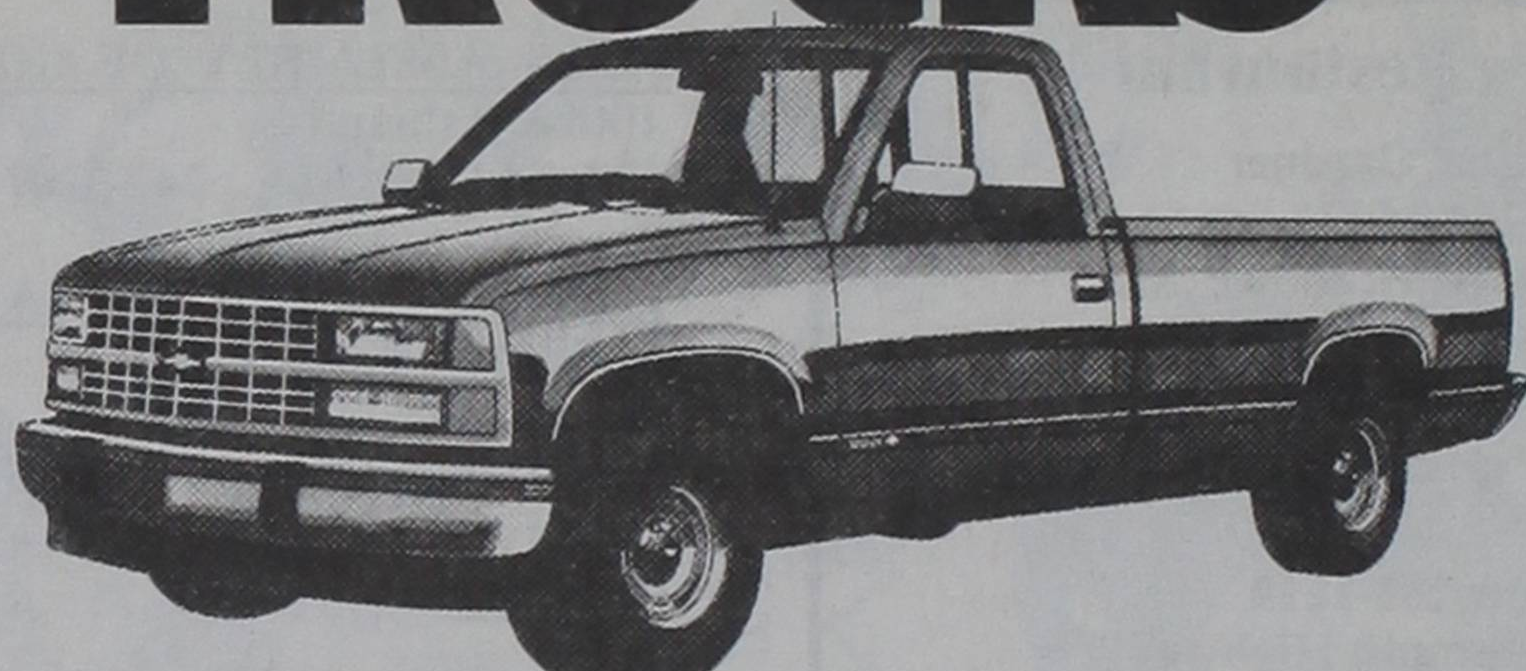






Oklahoma Christian University of Science and Arts has announced names of 220 students who have been named to the honor roll for the spring 1991 trimester.

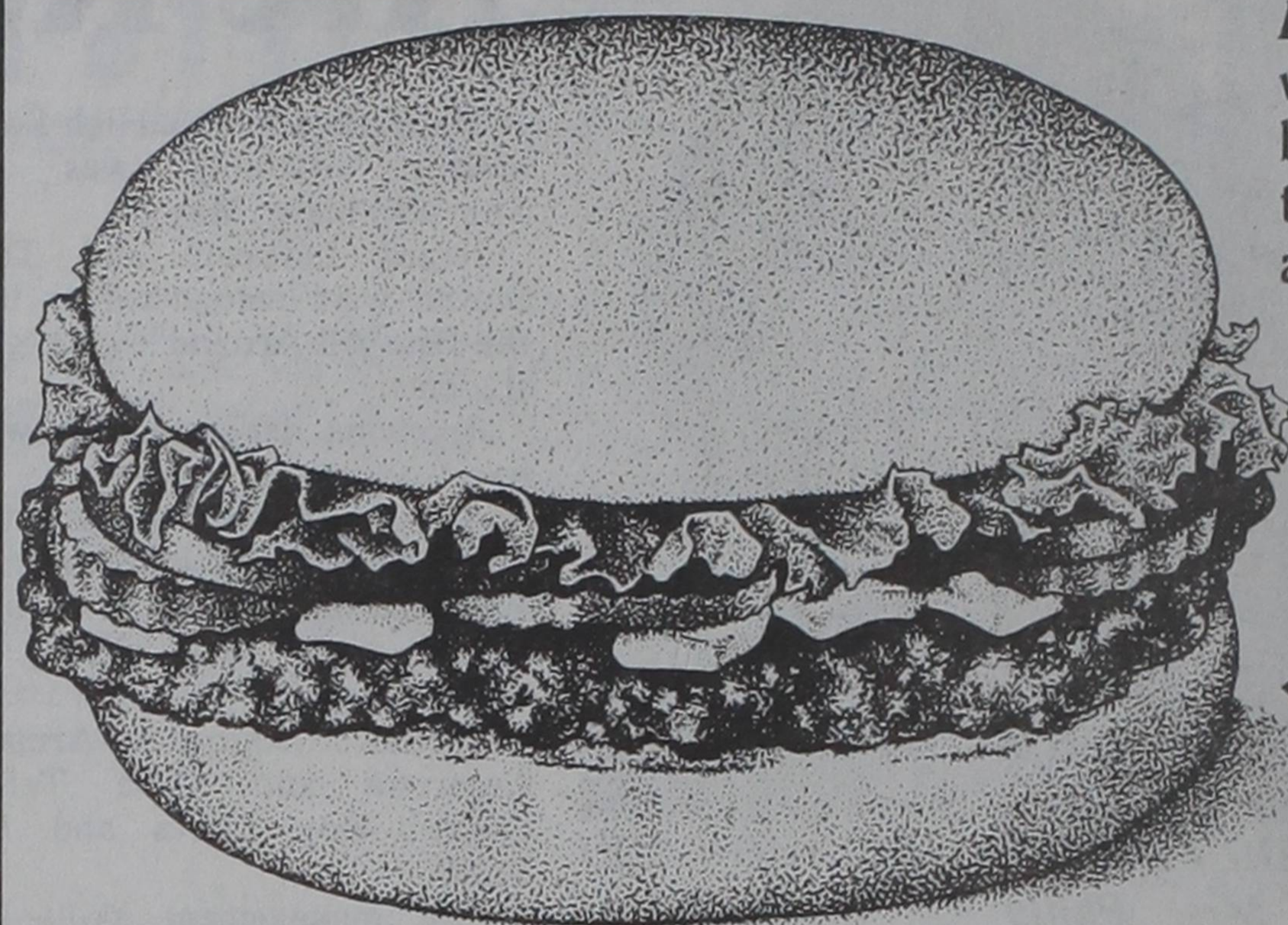
The honor roll consists of students who have earned a grade point average between 3.40 and 3.84.

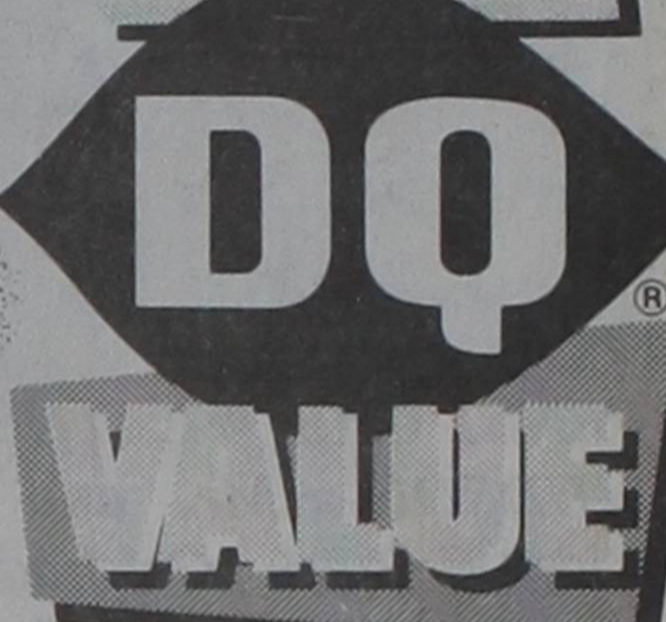

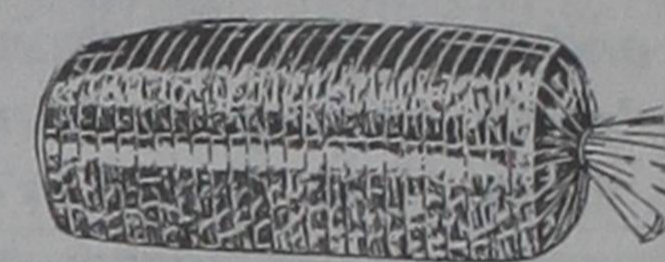
