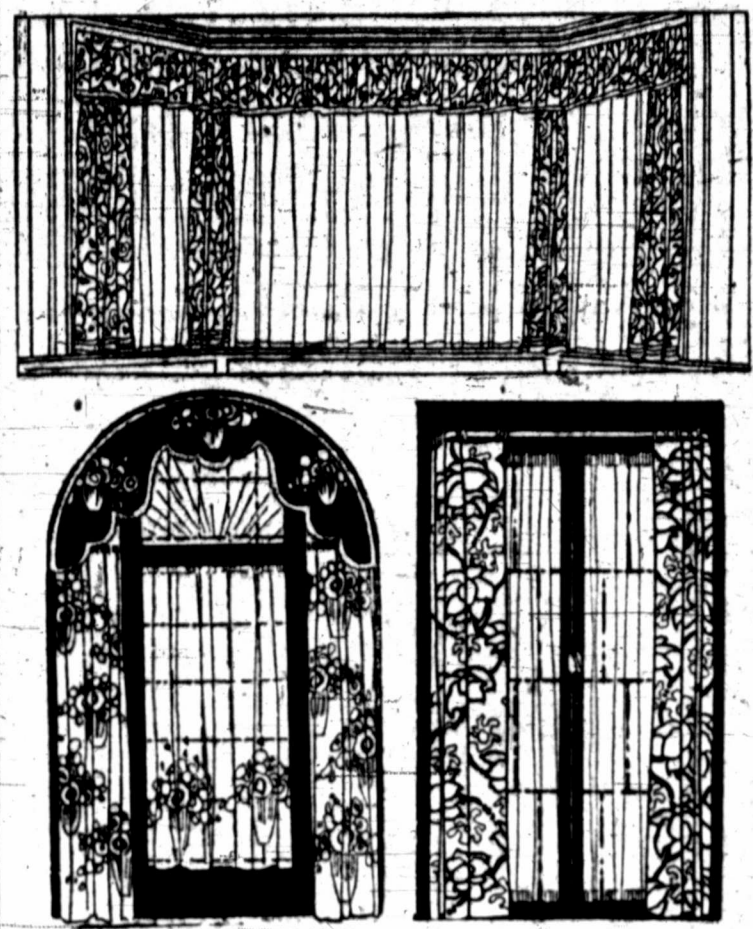

### Problem of Unemployment Costs Great Britain Half Billion Year 'Dole' Law Has Variety Loopholes

LONDON, March 28.—A general parliamentary election in Great Britain seems a long way off and even if it should prove to be just around the corner, the "Dole" Law government is giving its attention to the things of the moment. Chief among these is the problem of unemployment which is costing the government nearly half a billion dollars a year, and which seems to grow by what it feeds on.

The unemployment dole law here seems to have as many loopholes as the income tax law in America, and the beneficiaries are quite as keen to make use of them. For example, in the seaport towns there are large numbers of men who hunt the docks, who work a few hours each week in shifting the mails or in moving luggage, who receive an augmented hourly pay for their labor because of its intermittent, to say the least, nature but who are nevertheless outside the regular law which restricts the grant of the dole.

These men through their precariously certain earnings and the dole are enabled to live better than they ever did before the war, despite the higher cost of living, and a steady job carries no appeal to them, and it is these men who exist not only in the seaports but practically everywhere, and who make it for the moment well nigh impossible for British industry or British government to return to whatever is the English equivalent for normalcy.

Unemployed British workmen with families now receive as much as two pounds ten shillings a week "dole" from the government. Government aid is extended to 1,000,000 workmen. It has been publicly stated in parliament that many of these do not seek work. Put the government is not to dare to change the system.

The high cost of living holds in British table conversation the place which prohibition has with us at home. Prices are from two to three times what they were 19 years ago. England is much more highly taxed than the United States and consequently labor here in general has been able to resist the cost war of inflation in the same degree that our most carefully organized trades—namely the railway brotherhoods—have been able to resist it.

Whether the English can go on living in the existing inflated atmosphere of high prices is a grave question; but it is almost certain that the cost of living cannot be brought down except through some sort of catalytic movement which doubtless will have to be registered through a general election.

Here, therefore, we have the combination; a possible upset to the government on a question which, though of minor importance intrinsically, would yet carry implications which would warrant an appeal to the country wherein the whole issue would turn upon whether England is to come down to earth in her industrial activities. This combination may never present itself. It may develop tomorrow. But whether it does or not, all England is preparing to assert and reassert its dominance in the markets of the world and the city of London in particular is preparing to reestablish itself as the seat of tribute for all the globe.

It should afford small comfort for those who contributed to the defeat of the ship subsidy bill in the American senate to know that the largest factor which gives to England and to London its greatness of certainty is the knowledge that the only people who share with the English a flair for the sea have committed time-honored. Yet such is the fact.

At the moment when the United States, possessed of most of the gold of the world, is being so actively stimulated by the war to the highest point ever known by any nation in the world, we deliberately threw away the only instrument by which we could maintain that supremacy. We had we have, a superb merchant fleet. Tomorrow we shall have none. But England has and will have one equally superb and we shall begin again to enrich her by the tribute which we shall pay to her for the peace.

### Guards Expelled From Oklahoma House Chamber

OKLAHOMA CITY, March 28.—Members of the lower house of the Oklahoma legislature went back to work today freed from the threat of armed guards who were posted about the floor during part of yesterday's session after Speaker Murray Gibson had discovered a case of Canadian whiskey in one of the house committee rooms.

The guards were expelled from the chamber by a vote of the house. Many members protesting that speakers action in availing in the special guard force. Several representatives asserted the presence of the guards cast suspicion on the entire membership and was a direct insult.

The attitude of many members toward the incident seemed to be summed up by Representative W. I. Cunningham, of Creek county, who worked up debate on the resolution to expel the guards by saying the discussion was "creating much ado about nothing." Cunningham was heartily applauded.

Speaker Gibson told newspapermen that he acted to prevent drinking in the corridors of committee rooms during the remaining days of the session. Final adjournment is scheduled for Saturday noon. The speaker said he poured the confiscated liquor into the sewer.

At an executive session early in the week the house discussed a decree alleged to have been held by certain members in the cloak room.

### DISCOVER CASE OF WHISKEY IN ROOM HOUSE COMMITTEE

OKLAHOMA CITY, March 28.—Adjournment of the ninth Oklahoma legislature set for noon today was postponed in what was to have been its final moments when both houses adopted a resolution ending the session later in the week. The resolution, originating in the senate, was amended by the house and the hour for adjournment is uncertain, pending adjustment of the difference.

The house was in a feverish mood when the resolution was received from the senate because of the presence of several extra-sergent-at-arms. Speaker Murray Gibson told newspapermen that he had discovered a case of whiskey in a committee room and ordered the additional officers on duty. He denied a charge by Representative Stovall of Cherokee county that they were armed and asserted that the "only guns in the chamber are in the pockets of members."

Both major appropriations bills and several other important measures are still in conference.

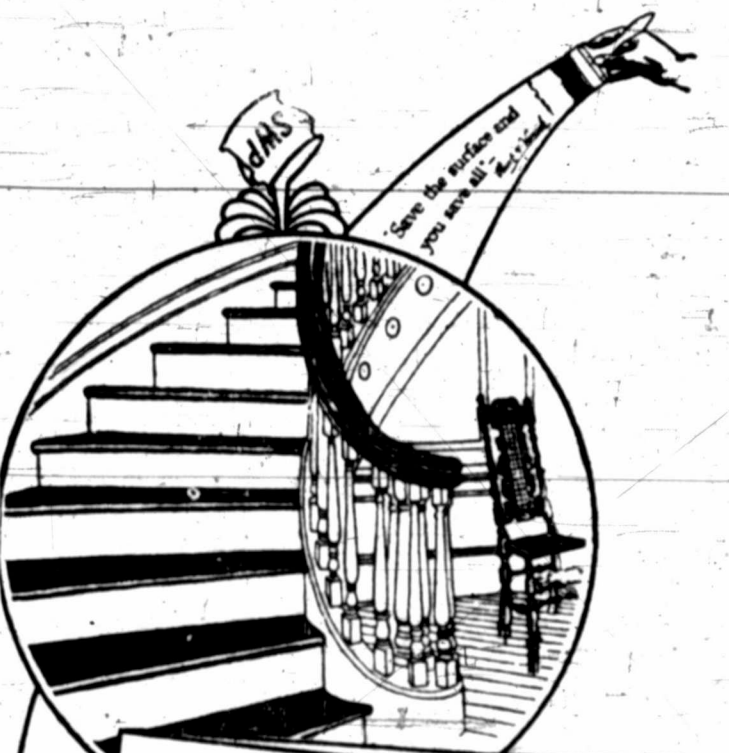
For recreation he swims, plays tennis and checks a bit, and considers the intricacies of chess a "delightful and easy diversion."



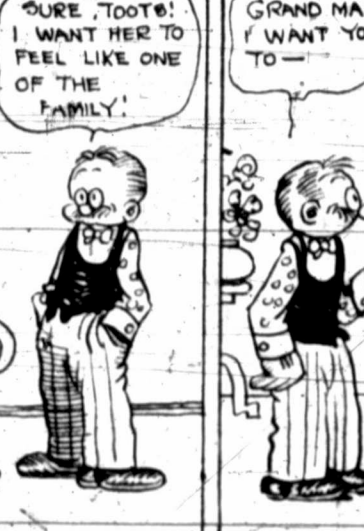

### EFFECT OF FREEZE SEEN IN PRICES OF TRUCK THIS WEEK

Local retailers report this week that cabbage is higher than they have known in this section for a long time and going higher all the time. This is due to the freeze and to the fact that in the cabbage raising sections the crop has been short this year. It is said—

All local truck stuff has received considerable setback from the recent freeze and garden stuff in the southern markets has suffered to a great extent also, according to reports. Lettuce is running 16 cents a bunch or two for a quarter this week, celery 16, 15 and 20 cents a bunch, turnip greens, and parsley 10 cents a pound, carrots radishes and turnips 10 cents a bunch and small celery two for a quarter. Green beans are 20 to 25 cents a pound and Florida English peas 30 cents a pound.

egg plant is bringing 30 cents a pound, tomato 20 to 25 cents and cauliflower 25 cents a pound. Home grown onions are two bunches for 15 cents and local spinach is two pounds for a quarter. Bell peppers can be had for 20 to 25 cents a pound, also green chilies 25 cents a pound. Fresh tomatoes are 20 to 25 cents a pound, and new potatoes are 20 cents a pound or two for 35 cents. Cabbage are 10 cents this week and Florida strawberries are 25 cents a quart.

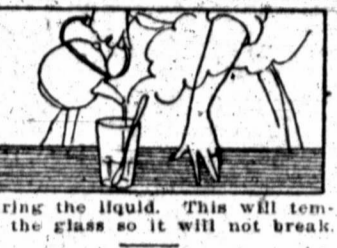
#### Shamrock Rolls

Pour a cup of scalded milk over two tablespoons of sugar and a half teaspoon of salt, and when it is lukewarm, add a half cake of yeast soaked in two tablespoons of warm water, and a cup of flour. Stir until smooth, cover, let stand in a warm place until the batter is full of bubbles, adding then two tablespoons of melted butter, a slightly beaten egg, and two more cups of flour. Knead until dough is smooth and rises from lumps, return to bowl and rise until it has doubled in bulk. Then take onto board again and divide into 18 pieces, divide each piece into three equal parts, and shape them into smooth, round balls. Place three of these balls in each muffin tin and let rise until light. Bake for 20 minutes in a quick oven, brush over with melted butter, and bake one or two minutes longer.

When filling a glass with hot liquid put a silver spoon in before pouring the liquid. This will temper the glass so it will not break.

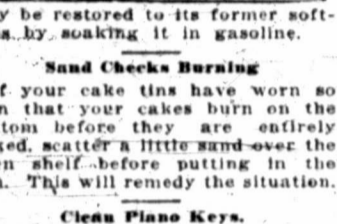

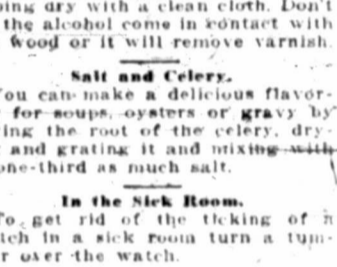
#### To Keep Flannel Soft

#### TEXAS GRAPEFRUIT SUPPLY NEARLY EXHAUSTED NOW

The Texas grapefruit crop is just about exhausted according to reports from local fruit dealers. The small quantity left are going at 15 cents, and Florida grapefruit at two for 25 cents, and a little better grade at two for 25 cents. Bananas are 25 cents a dozen, lemons 25 to 40 cents a dozen and oranges 50 to 60 cents per dozen. Winery apples are three for a quarter and delicious apples are three for a quarter and another quality, can be had for 50 cents a dozen.

### QUEEN FRITTERS

To make queen fritters, take: One-quarter cup each of boiling water and flour, one-eighth teaspoon of salt, two eggs, and fresh fat or lard. In a sauce pan place the butter, boiling water and flour, and place over the stove; as soon as this reaches the boiling point stir in the flour all at once, and continue to stir until a thick batter is formed which leaves the sides of the pan. Remove from stove, cool for a minute, then add eggs un-beaten one at a time, beating thoroughly between the addition of each egg. If this mixture is allowed to become very cold it will puff more when fried. Drop from a tablespoon into hot fat, fry 10 minutes, and drain thoroughly on paper. Sprinkle with powdered sugar. The fritters should be golden brown and thoroughly cooked in the center. It is best to try one, and see if it is cooked, before removing the others from the fat.

### APPLE FRITTERS

Mix a cup of flour, a quarter teaspoon of salt and a teaspoon of baking powder. Then slowly add a well-beaten egg and two-thirds of a cup of milk, until a smooth batter is made. Next add two apples, pared, cored and cut into small pieces, and drop the mixture from a tablespoon, having all the spoon will hold into hot fat. Fry four minutes and drain on soft paper. Sprinkle with powdered sugar. The fritters should be golden brown and thoroughly cooked in the center. It is best to try one, and see if it is cooked, before removing the others from the fat.

Press firmly together, and put in a cold place until time to serve; then cut these piles into slices one-fourth inch thick. If it's necessary to keep the sandwiches for some time wrap in a napkin wrung out of hot water, or in wax paper. Ribbon sandwiches can be made

TESTIMONY DEALS WITH AGGRESSION OF ARMED GUARDS

By Associated Press. MARION, Ill., March 30.—The defense in the Herrin riots trial today couched its introduction of testimony regarding acts of aggression on the part of the armed guards at the mine of the Southern Illinois Coal Company immediately preceding the outbreak last June which resulted in the slaying of twenty-five men.

Several of the witnesses described the shooting at the mine the afternoon of June 21. When three union miners were killed. They said they witnessed the shooting from the lip of another mine above the West.

John Baker, a miner, said he had watched the men in the mine place a machine gun in a mine dump connected behind a bush. He testified he later heard firing and identified the sound as coming from a machine gun.

COMPLAINTS ABOUT BLOCKED CROSSINGS AIRED AT MEETING

Switching crews in local railroad yards are persistently violating the law relative to blocking crossings, according to information given out at the business council luncheon Friday.

County Judge E. D. Sartin indicated that the county was considering either a viaduct or a tunnel at the crossing in North Wichita. Figures compiled by a special watchman, employed by a local oil man who uses the road considerably, showed, Judge Sartin said, that autoists were sometimes occasioned delays of 10 minutes or more at the crossing.

One member complained of the practice of making "flying switches" in some parts of the yards, predicting that a serious accident would result if the practice were not checked.

Al Ellis reported that on the Shriners patrol's recent trip to Electric, the North Wichita crossing was blocked for 15 minutes while a train of cars was shunted back and forth.

WHEAT GROWERS TO COORDINATE EFFORT IN MARKETING GRAIN

KANSAS CITY, MO., March 30.—An agreement to coordinate their efforts in the marketing of grain has been reached by the United States Grain Growers, Inc., and the American Wheat Growers Association, Inc., Newton Jenkins, general counsel for the American farm bureau federation announced here today.

According to the agreement the American Wheat Growers Association will federate their grain dealings to wheat. They will handle wheat in the northwest district in certain states agreed upon. The United States Grain Growers, Inc., will deal in wheat in certain states allotted to them and in coarse grains in all states.

The states in which the wheat growers federation will handle the wheat are Washington, Oregon, Montana, Idaho, North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas and Colorado. The states allotted to the grain growers association are Ohio, Illinois, Iowa, Indiana, and perhaps Minnesota.

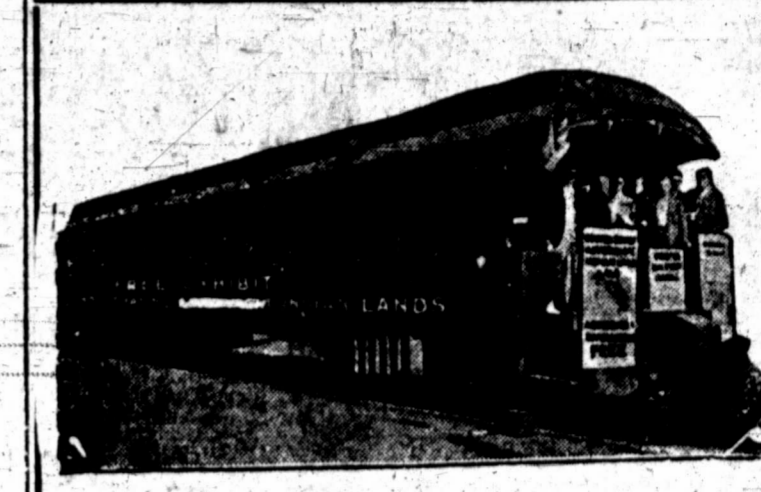

### Passover, Significant Time in Jewish Calendar, to Be Observed Here Beginning Next Sunday

Local members of the Jewish faith will next Sunday begin observance of Passover week, the opening of which falls this year on the same date as Easter. The following on the significance of the occasion has been prepared for The Times.

Passover, known in the Synagogue as Pesach, falls due this year on Sunday, April 1. It is one of the institutions of Judaism which has long since received the approval and approval and is observed for a period of seven days by the more liberal and eight by those more ritually inclined. The first and last days, however, have a special ritual observance in connection with Temple service, the keynote of which is liberty and redemption from bondage.

During the Passover week all Jewish families do without leaven in any form, using instead a large flat, water-soaked bread called matzo, as a more ritually correct. The first reminder of the hasty exodus of their fathers from the land of Egypt is the ceremonial Seder which is held on the evening of the first night of Passover. For this ceremony there is a traditional ritual called the "Haggadah" which contains richly adorned tales of the deliverance and a number of rabbinical reflections on the Providential signs of liberty unfolded in the exodus. There are likewise many songs of great antiquity, and the festival board, about which revolve the tales of the exodus, is set with specially prepared dishes, each symbolic of the stages of the Passover feast and the exodus.

The festival services are held by the Synagogue as a means of commemorating the Jewish home to God, and Redeemer and Protector of Israel who witnessed the overthrow of so many proud and powerful nations, and who has ever been a valiant champion of liberty to those chafing under the chains of tyranny. Coming as it does in the springtime of the year, Passover fits each creature with joy and hope. It foresees an era when liberty will be the common heritage of all humanity. The modern Jew utilizes this feast as an assurance that with law weakening of social justice and responsibility in our generation there is a promise of a better future for all children of men. In this spirit Passover is observed among the Jewish people of America, who welcome the opportunity to make it known that liberty—the priceless heritage of all human beings—should be a right of all, free, the duty of all who love their fellowmen.

The dominant thought of liberty and redemption from bondage, ignorance and oppression. The observance of this feast recall that no matter how brutally the tyrant may oppress the sons of Israel, the cry of their persecution will be heard in the heavenly heights. Safety is vouchsafed and they will be led in to their heritage as the priests of God's laws of justice.

A festival of such significant spiritual possibilities has in course of time evolved an elaborate minutiae of ceremonial observance, especially in regard to the prohibition of leaven. But at no time, not even in the darkest days of medievalism, was the synagogue or the home burdened by these observances. On the contrary, home and synagogue resound with song and thanksgiving. Young and old participate in the symbolism of the feast and welcome the advent of Passover.

The most conspicuous of these minutiae observances is the Seder, first observed on the eve of the first day of Passover. For this ceremony there is a traditional ritual called the "Haggadah" which contains richly adorned tales of the deliverance and a number of rabbinical reflections on the Providential signs of liberty unfolded in the exodus.
