PRESIDENT AGAIN TAKES UP DUTIES ENDING VACATION

INVIGORATED BY HIS FIVE WEEKS PLEASURE TRIP IN THE SOUTH. WILL CLEAN DESK FOR PROPOSED WEST TOUR

WASHINGTON, April 9.—President Harding was back at his desk today invigorated by his five weeks vacation in the south and ready to shoulder again the accumulation of official business.

The president and Mrs. Harding arrived in Washington shortly after noon yesterday from Augusta, Ga., where they spent last week.

Mrs. Harding was said to have shown only the slightest evidence of fatigue from the 16 hour journey and her improved health was further shown by the fact that she walked through the station to the automobile at the entrance where, on leaving here she was driven direct to the private car in the railroad yards.

The president is taking up the important matters now before him with the intention of disposing of as many as possible in the next two months in order to clear the way for his proposed western trip.

The middle of June is now set as the tentative time for the beginning of the trip, but the president has not definitely decided whether he will carry out the proposed tour to the Pacific Coast, with a possible extension to Alaska.

Mrs. Harding has greatly benefited by her five weeks in the south, the president is deferring a decision on the western trip until the feds assured of the advisability of her undertaking such an extended journey as the one contemplated.

In addition to the angles of the political situation which are expected to receive the president's attention in the next few weeks, the immediate order of business is the sugar price situation and plans for disposition of the government's merchant fleet.

A preliminary report from the tariff committee on the sugar question is looked for within the next week or two while time required for the president to be submitted to the president on the merchant marine problem may defer action on that for several weeks.

SEVENTY MILLIONS INCREASE IN MARCH PAYMENT OF TAXES

WASHINGTON, April 9.—A \$70,000,000 increase in the March collections of income and profits taxes as compared with the March collections of last year on which the higher income surtax rates applied, gives a practical answer to the tax problem and shows clearly what further revision should take.

Even the present surtax rates, which range to a minimum of 20 per cent and a maximum of 63 per cent normal and surtax of 25 per cent, Mr. Mellon said, are tending to hamper business and causing the large tax payers to seek every possible means of avoiding the realization of taxable income.
