"You have asked why I have not sent a check in payment of the bill I owe you and are threatening to turn off my current. Let me explain:

"The present condition of my bank account is due to lawsfederal laws, state laws, county laws, city laws and trade association laws. The only laws that do not affect my small business are outlaws. We have never been robbedillegally; only by elected officials.

"Because of these laws of many kinds I am compelled to pay taxes-a business tax, amusement tax, head tax, bank tax, school tax, gas tax, light tax, water tax, sales tax, excise tax, auto tax, phone tax, sewer tax, garbage tax, fire tax, highway tax and three kinds of income tax-federal, state and

"These laws also require me to get a license at varying fees ness license, refrigeration license, retailer's license, sanitation license, inspection license, weigher's license, dairy license, carter's license, delivery truck license, and interstate deliverer's license, I bought two licenses voluntarily, a marriage license and a dog license.

"For the sake of my bank, my creditors and my business, I am required by law to carry life insurance, property insurance, liability insurance, burglar insurance, fire insurance, accident insurance, windstorm, flood and earthquake insurance and freezer-loss insurance.

"I must pay these premiums promptly or my insurance coverage, like my electricity, will be turned off.

"I am inspected, suspected and disrespected, and though I am bled white maintaining a constant flow of money to other people, there simply does not seem to be enough to go around.

"Please do not turn off my electricity, for due to a miraculous stroke of good fortune, you will get your money. While chopping out a loin of pork this morning, I was lucky enough to miss and completely sever my thumb. It was insured. The money will arrive next week, at which time I will endorse the check and forward

"I shall be grateful for your patience.

tinued to expand rapidly for the past 2 to 3 years. The major reason for this expansion has been because of the feedlot growth and its need for cattle to feed.

Stocker calf operators, farmers and others interested in learning about how to better manage a stocker program will want to attend a beef cattle meeting Thursday, January 22, at 7:00 p.m. at the Bovina High School Auditorium

Of special interest will be a discussion on the problems of health and nutrition of stocker cattle, says Ronny McNutt, Parmer County Agricultural Agent. Presenting the discussion will be Dr. Dale Furr, nutritionist for the Hi-Pro Feeds Inc.

"Irrigated Pastures" will be another topic of discussion which should attract wide interest. Zee McCasland, a successful livestock producer and feeder from Clovis, will speak on this subject. McCasland has a very successful irrigated pasture program and will discuss many of the practical aspects that should benefit local stocker operators.

Sources of stocker cattle is a concern to the present stocker operator and also the prospective stocker operator. Ed Garnett, area farm management specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service will be on hand to discuss "Sources of Replacements." Garnett was in the livestock and farming business before being named to his present position.

Rounding out the program will be a talk on "Cattle Feeding Outlook" by Jack Carrothers, manager of the Friona Feed Yards. Carrothers has just completed a term serving as president of the Texas Cattle Feeders Assoc.

The information that will be presented will be beneficial in helping stocker cattle producers manage their operations. The event is being sponsored by the Parmer County Livestock Committee and the Parmer County Extension Service. Members of the Committee are Bob Wilson of Bovina, C.E. Bank Deposits Top Year-End Record

Deposits at Friona State Bank set a new record for the end of the year, according to the quarterly figures announced this week by bank officials.

Total deposits on December 31, 1969 stood at \$10,777,873.98. This was an increase of over a million dollars-\$1, 006,151.13 more than the deposit figure of \$9,771,722.85 which was shown on the statement for December 31, 1968.

Total assets at the bank stood at \$11, 911,881.42 at the year's end. This was up \$1,372,039.46 over the figure of \$10, 539,841.96 a year earlier.

Another major category showed that loans increased from \$7,198,754.65 a year ago to \$8,391,292.73 at the present time.

January Proclaimed Blood Donor Month

If you want to observe this month as something besides January, you can celebrate it as National Blood Donor Month. It has been so proclaimed by President Nixon in recognition of the vital role of the volunteer blood donor.

This was requested by the American Association of Blood Banks with endorsements by the American National Red Cross, American Medical Association, American Hospital Association and other organizations interested in a safe and adequate supply of blood in every community.

The importance of the volunteer blood donor cannot be overestimated. Surgery and therapy require more and more blood. A wire service item noted that 30 pints of blood were used in an effort to save the life of writer Jack Kerouac, who died recently in St. Petersburg, Florida.

Nearly every big hospital has a few children with leukemia or grave forms of anemia, who are being kept alive by blood transfusions. In all we are now using blood at the rate of 6.5 million pints per year with at least 80% of this coming from the volunteer unpaid donors, who are being honored this month.

Besides saving millions in medical costs, voluntary donations greatly reduce the hazards of infection. in transfusions; there is no reason for a volunteer to misrepresent his medical

We join Dr. Enold Dahlquist of Providence, Rhode Island, president of the American Association of Blood Banks, in urging everybody to join in observing this month.

Have you registered so that you will be able to vote in this year's elections? If not, be sure and do so before the end of this month. County Tax Assessor Hugh Moseley brought us some forms for voter registration and we would be happy to share them with all who need them.

Since the beginning of the New Year there has been so much said and written about a slogan for the new decade. It would be interesting for us to know what Frionans would suggest in

this direction. Let us know your ideas. Perhaps the suggestion I would make would be to adopt the slogan, "The Sobering Seventies." If those of us who are older would seriously consider some of the mistakes we have made during the past ten years and start right now trying to refrain from repeating them, some improvements would be

evident by the end of the decade. If anyone is thinking "It's too late to correct what has already been done," I'd be the first to agree. However, I feel sure if we are honest enough to acknowledge some of the errors we've made, we can refrain from making the same ones over again in many instances.

One authority has charged us with being too lienent and indulgent with our children. I'm of the opinion we have, in far too many instances, followed the path of least resistance and failed to be good examples.

F.B.I. Director J. Edgar Hoover recently reported a nationwide crime increase of ten per cent. This indicates that crime is increasing five times faster than our population. He also reported that crime among juveniles under eighteen years of age jumped eleven per cent last year. Dr. M. Norvel Young, president of Pepperdine College, Los

Angeles, recently asked the question, What can WE do about it? Then made the following suggestions: I. You can teach your children to obey the laws of the land,

and you can be an example in this respect. 2. You can encourage the officials of government by commending those who do an outstanding job in law enforcement or in upholding the basic law of the land, the Constitution.

3. You can encourage judges and attorneys who show courage in combatting crime and dispensing justice. 4. You can write to editors and commentators and encour-

age those who take a stand for law, order and justice. 5. Through Bible classes, you can stress the teaching of the Scriptures that Christians should respect duly constituted authority. "Let every soul be subject unto the higher powers. For there is no power but of God: the powers that be are ordained by God. Whosoever therefore resisteth the power, resisteth the ordinance of God; and they that resist that receive to themselves condemnation" (Rom. 13: 1-2).

6. You can follow the scriptural infunction to visit those in prison. There are more people in prison today than ever before-more young people in prison than in college. Many of these people need friendship, teaching, and encouragement in doing right. Some of our students at Pepperdine College are working with prisoners at every level of our correctional institutions. There is a great need for Christians to prepare

themselves for a life of service in the field of corrections. 7. Above all, you can pray for those in authority and for those who are being tempted into a life of crime. Render honor to whom honor is due, custom to whom custom, and pray for rulers. Our nation is facing a great threat from lawlessness and crime. Surely all of us do more by prayer than this world dreams of.

8. You can help young people obtain a Christian education, There is no doubt that many teenagers turn to a life of crime because they drop out of school and have no job. Let's do more than talk about the crime crisis!

# NOTICE TO PARENTS Of School Age Children

The school census is being taken during the month of January this year. All children who are six years old on or before September 1, 1970, but will not be 18 or older on or before that same date should be counted in this census. It is very important that all children six to 18 years be counted in this census. The child should be counted even though he may not be in school and even though he or she may be married,

If you, as a parent, have not received and filled out a school census blank on or before January 31, you are being overlooked and should do one of the following:

1. Phone the school office and ask for a census blank,

2. Call in person at the School Tax Office and get a census blank and fill it out. Remember if your child will be six years old next September 1, he should be counted in the census now even though he is not in school now. If he is six but not 18 or older next September 1 he should be counted now. All children from six to 18 should be counted. The six year olds who start next September to school are the ones most overlooked in the census. Failure to count them costs the school and taxpayers extra money. Please help us not to overlook anyone.




### Loan For Telephone Co-op Work


