





### NEW CHANCELLOR OF GERMANY HAS PEACE PROGRAM

#### TAKES FIRST PRACTICAL STEP TOWARD CARRYING OUT NEW POLICY

#### TO GRADUALLY RELAX PASSIVE RESISTANCE

#### Program is Result of Conference Held in Berlin Tues. by Afternoon

BERLIN, Aug. 25.—Chancellor Stresemann, who in his recent speech made approaches to France, has taken the first practical step toward carrying out new policy. The passive resistance in the Ruhr, which up to now has been so rigidly sustained that it was impossible to break through, will not be gradually relaxed.

It is learned from a reliable source that this program is the result of a conference held this afternoon between Chancellor Stresemann and the leaders of the Rühr and Rühr industries, among whom were Hugo Dingeldey, Fritz Thrun, and others.

But now the cessation of industry has led to Chancellor Stresemann that they will stand in the way of the fulfillment of this policy.

### CONFERENCES AGREED UPON

#### The following three conferences:

1. To lift the ban against the railroad operated by the French and Belgium, which it is hoped to bring about with the participation of German and officials of the occupied territory.

2. To request German experts through the occupied territory which have been suspended since the entrance of the French because the latter demanded that the customs be paid to them instead of Germany. The revenue from customs will not be paid to the French authorities.

3. Payment of the huge sums to Germany which the French are demanding for the French seizure of industries will be discontinued as the government is unable to keep up the payments under the present terms.

The total of these payments in the last month alone amounted to 185 trillion marks.

The result of the withdrawal of the government support will be to force the German workers to come to terms with the French.

#### Proof of Willingness

The action taken by today's conference, it is believed here, is meant as proof to France of Germany's willingness to begin discussions. In this connection it is also significant that 14 German day's permit is granted for a meeting of representatives of Prussia, Bavaria, Saxony and other German states with the Rhine and commission at Coblenz.

This conference is called by the Rhine and commission to take up the local situation in the occupied territory. This is the first since the invasion of the Ruhr that such a conference has taken place, between German, French and Belgian representatives.

These two events are regarded here as indicating the approach of a better understanding with the French and therefore are particularly welcomed at a time when the international situation is most complicated.

Once more there are threats of possible trouble on September 2 when the communist nationalist organizations throughout Germany are planning new demonstrations and when the dollar reached a high water mark by rising to 1,900,000 marks after the close of the exchange.

### OPPOSES FURTHER LIMIT ON POWERS OF SUPREME COURT

#### VIEW IS EXPRESSED BY PRESIDENT OF THE AMERICAN BAR ASSOCIATION

#### WANTS COMMISSION TO CODIFY FEDERAL LAWS

#### Other Recommendations Are Made At Annual Meeting in Minneapolis

MINNEAPOLIS, Aug. 25. (P)—Opposition to any curtailment of the powers of the United States supreme court was expressed by John W. Davis of New York in his address as president of the American Bar Association at the opening session of its 66th annual convention here today.

In addition to this stand which applies to decisions involving constitutionality was expressed the following: as well as departure from five to seven majority decisions, the president also advocated the following:

Congress should come into being immediately upon its election and the president and vice president should be inaugurated without any unnecessary lapse of time.

The bar should demand without further delay the appointment of an expert commission to codify the federal statutes.

Adoption of a constitutional amendment permitting the president of the United States to veto specific items in an appropriation bill.

Matification of treaties with foreign countries by the senate by a majority vote instead of the two-thirds vote now required.

Abolition of a constitutional amendment directly to the people of the several states or to the legislatures selected after and not before the amendment has been proposed.

He repeated the hope expressed in the association's resolution last year that "a way may be found by which the government of the United States may avail itself of the permanent court of international justice."

The address of Mr. Davis, who presided at the opening session of the three-day gathering, was preceded by the reports of Thomas W. Kemp of Baltimore, secretary, and Fred E. Washburn, Albany, N. Y., treasurer, and was followed by nominations for the general council.

Tonight the Earl of Birkenhead, former chancellor of Great Britain, will address the convention.

### MAN REPORTED TO HAVE FOUND MONEY CLAIMS STORY HOAX

#### HAGERSTOWN, Md., Aug. 25. (P)—Lee Houser, laborer, who last Thursday claimed to have discovered a box containing over \$100,000 in gold and bills while working on a road near here, last night declared the story was a hoax.

One of Houser's fellow workmen, declares he saw a coin and the box from his pocket and threw it on the ground, causing the report to be circulated that he had found a fortune.

Houser is said to have visited a lawyer during one of his mysterious absences from home recently and neighbors believe he found and has hidden the treasure fearing that the government would take it if it were found to be that said to have been buried in this vicinity by Grover Cleveland Duggold.

### POET OF GOLD GOES INTO HOLE OF MYTHOLOGY

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25. (P)—The poet of gold reported found at Hagerstown, Md., by a laborer, has gone into the realm of mythology so far as government investigations are concerned.

No money, not even the lone thin dime reputed to have been seen by other workmen, was dug up, according to William J. Burns, chief of the department of justice bureau of investigation. His agents returning today from Hagerstown after a two days investigation, were called off the scent after reporting that the whole story was a deliberate hoax.

The story, the agents reported, was invented by fellow workmen and given to a Hagerstown newspaper in furtherance of a joke planned against "Nightwing" in the gang road workers in order to make him envious. The only treasure dug up, the report said, was a rusty tin can and the only money

found was a dime which dropped from a small boy's pocket while standing near the workmen.

Allen Property Custodian Miller, who called the government investigators into action in the hope of recovering a sum of money said to have been buried in Maryland by Grover Duggold, was informed today of the results of the investigation and was told it had been dropped. Chief Burns said, however, that the search for the Duggold gold might be continued indefinitely.

#### APPEALS FOR TOBACCO TERMS TO CIGARETTES

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25. (P)—The American appetite for tobacco continues to turn in the direction of the cigarette, according to figures made public by the internal revenue bureau, which disclosed that taxes were paid on \$425,977,751 cigarettes during July, an increase over July of last year of almost \$90,000,000.

As for cigars, taxes were paid in July on \$40,176,926 large and \$1,241,926 small ones, the combined total being about 1,000,000 more than the number taxed in July, 1925.

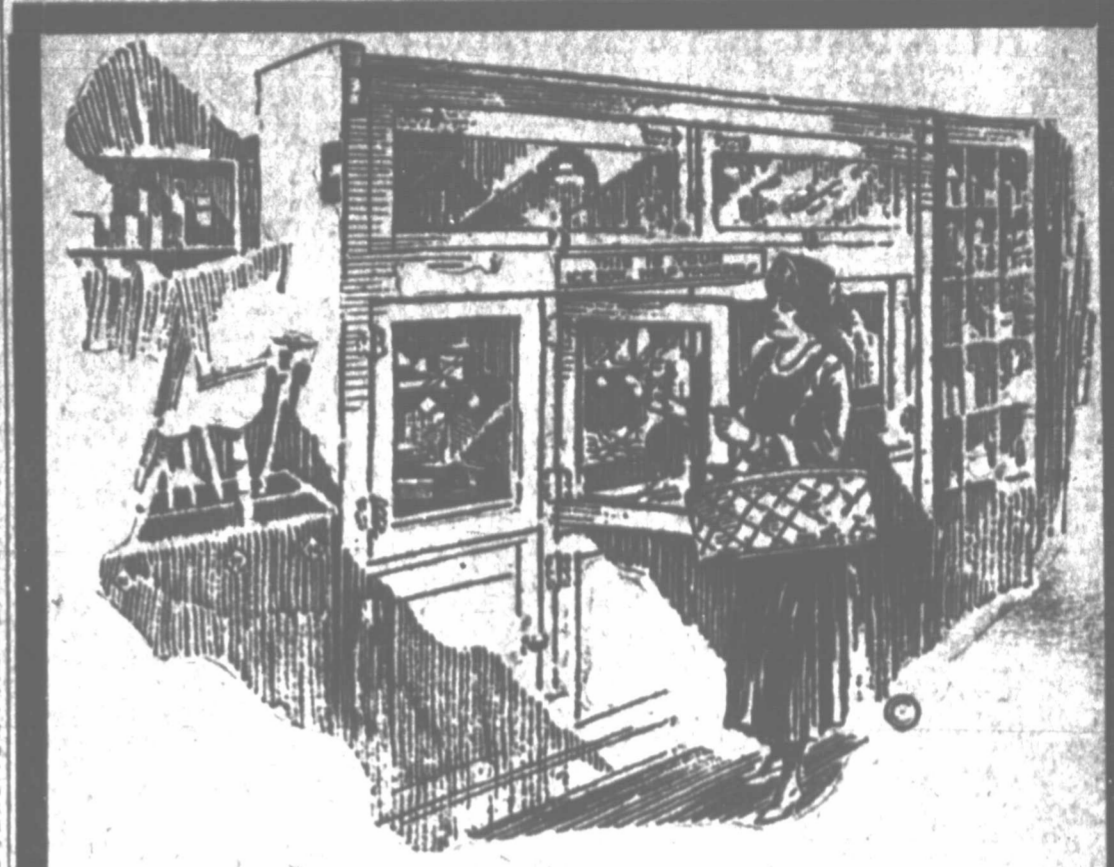

AMERICA'S own silver-voiced love lyricist, Edna St. Vincent Millay, was married—deliberately—on a Wednesday. Did Eugen Boissevain, her bridegroom, retain on Thursday the love he had won the day before? This is the question that the famous art colonies in and about New York City, including the one at Cretan-on-Hudson, where the wedding took place, are speculatively considering, as they quote again the last half of "Wednesday," the second most constantly quoted of the singer's verses:

"And why you come complaining  
Is more than I can see,  
I loved you Wednesday—yes—but what  
Is that to me?"

That her wedding coach was an ambulance and her honeymoon lodge a hospital, whether she journeyed upon the very day of her wedding to undergo an operation for appendicitis, possibly may have injected new temper into the opinion of the usually fleeting quality of love Miss Millay entertained. However, the small company of writers and stage people who were in the confidence of both the bride and groom...

out that at least one unique feature was accomplished in her marriage which is bound to endure. Eugen Boissevain, fascinating and wealthy Dutch importer has succeeded in successfully marrying two of the most talented, popular and beautiful young women ever to appeal to the imagination of this country. And both of them had vowed never to wed!

The lovely Ines Milholland, known as the "most charming suffragette," was a proclaimed man-hater, and publicly asserted that never,

never would she bind herself in the throes of matrimony. She kept to her single way until she met the "Beau Brummel of Importers." After her marriage she doubled her efforts to secure the franchise for women, finally wearing herself into illness and giving her life to the fight for equality seven years ago.

Like Ines Milholland, Edna St. Vincent Millay has received rather more than her share of admiration. Petite, pretty and blonde, her charm lies chiefly in her luminous eyes and exquisite voice. It is said that since she left college, when she was only twenty, but famous, because the public already was reading her first book of poems in which appeared her famous "Renaissance," she had been courted by hundreds, all of whom failed to win more than a passing regard.

The toast of critics, fellow-writers and columnists; the center of a faithful and determined few in Paris' Montparnasse district, where she held court in the famed Cafe Rotonde last year, her always repeated sentiment was "Life can be exciting and free and intense." She held to her resolution against marrying for ten years—she is thirty now—when along came a middle-aged, widower and captured the prize!

In less Bohemian quarters of the Big Town it is being suggested that the entire Boissevain family is directed in its marriage ventures by a special star which makes a point of bringing about the unusual.

New York City society still talks of the romantic union of young Mynhart Boissevain, son of

the "Four Hundred," who lived in a fifty-dollar-a-day suite at the fashionable Hotel Vanderbilt, and the former Lydia Helen White, petite dweller in a Bronx one-room walk-up dress designer and struggling art student.

Of course, Mynhart is only distantly related to Eugen—third cousins or some such loose link connects them. Nevertheless, by every astral law he is bound to exist under the Boissevain family marriage star, and this is the reason, most likely, why he found happiness in repudiating the young women of his own exalted "set," who were

either bored or shocked when he quoted Swinburne to them, and marrying almost secretly and on impulse the little unknown of Ridgefield, Conn.—following the wedding with a honeymoon trip on a Staten Island ferry and a subway ride.

Then there is the romance of Mynhart's younger brother, John Magee Boissevain, whose marriage to the pulchritudinous young social star, Estelle B. Carroll, has been considered eminently right and fitting in the aristocratically staffed atmosphere where they live. Estelle is the granddaughter of the late John Vincent Carroll, owner of the famous "Forestwood Stables"—a string of thoroughbreds that captured many blue ribbons in their day. She traces her ancestry straight back to the ubiquitous Carrolls of Carrollton.

To many who find fascination in the same-clearness of diction and intense beauty of the poems gathered in four little volumes, "A Few Yips from 'Tithonus,'" "Miscellany," "The Ballad of the Harp Weaver," for which the Pulitzer prize of a thousand dollars was awarded recently, and in the fourth volume, "April Second," the startling quality of Miss Millay's imagery is in her unusual attitude toward love.

No conventional base of feminine fidelity distorts her candor. Her ground and lofty ideas of the permanence of affection trouble her reveals in the emotion itself. She sheds no tears over the betrayed, and apparently cares nothing for the maiden too timid or too ragged by conscience to plunge into the flood-tide of love. In her poems remembering is never accompanied by regret—only by triumph, with an occasional cool acknowledgement of the transience of passion. So she writes:

"I know I am but Summer to your heart  
And not the full four seasons of 'he year;  
And you must welcome from another part  
Such noble moods as are not mine,  
My dear,  
No gracious weight of golden fruits to fill  
Have I, nor any wise and wintry thing;  
And I have loved you all the long and well  
To carry still the high sweet breast of  
Spring!"

And again she wrote, with her subtle suggestion of chiaroscuro:

"Wherefore I say: O love, as Summer goes,  
I must be gone, steal forth with silent  
drums,  
That you may half anew the bird and rose  
When I come back to you, as Summer  
comes.  
Else will you seek, at some not distant time,  
Even your Summer in another clime,  
And perhaps the most startlingly frank of all  
her love lyrics is this:

"What lips my lips have kissed, and where,  
and why,  
I have forgotten and what arms have lain  
Under my head till morning; but the rain  
Is full of ghosts to-night, that tap and sigh  
Upon the glass and listen for reply;  
And in my heart there stirs a quiet pain  
For unremembered lads that not again  
Will turn to me at midnight with a cry."

It had been pointed out that in such verse the poet neither requests nor demands equality in love—as in other spheres—for women with men, but takes equality for granted and sees in it only beauty. Her genius rises above the commonplace of what the world considers propriety to spaces where her femininity is free.

However, it is a more tense bit of verse from the pen of the new Edna St. Vincent Millay Boissevain that is quoted most frequently wherever two or three friends meet round the festive board to revel rhythmically of an evening:

"My candle burns at both ends;  
It will not last the night;  
But ah, my foot, and ah, my friends—  
It gives a lovely light!"
