WIFE HAD REFUSED TO RETURN TO HUSBAND

HAVE SPUDED IN 'WILD CAT' TEST IN BAYLOR COUNTY

SEYMOUR, Texas, Aug. 22.—The "wildcat" test of H. P. Wurts was spudded in Wednesday afternoon on the C. T. Porter ranch in Baylor county about nine miles southeast of Seymour. The well will be drilled to a depth of 2,500 feet unless oil or gas is found at a lower depth. 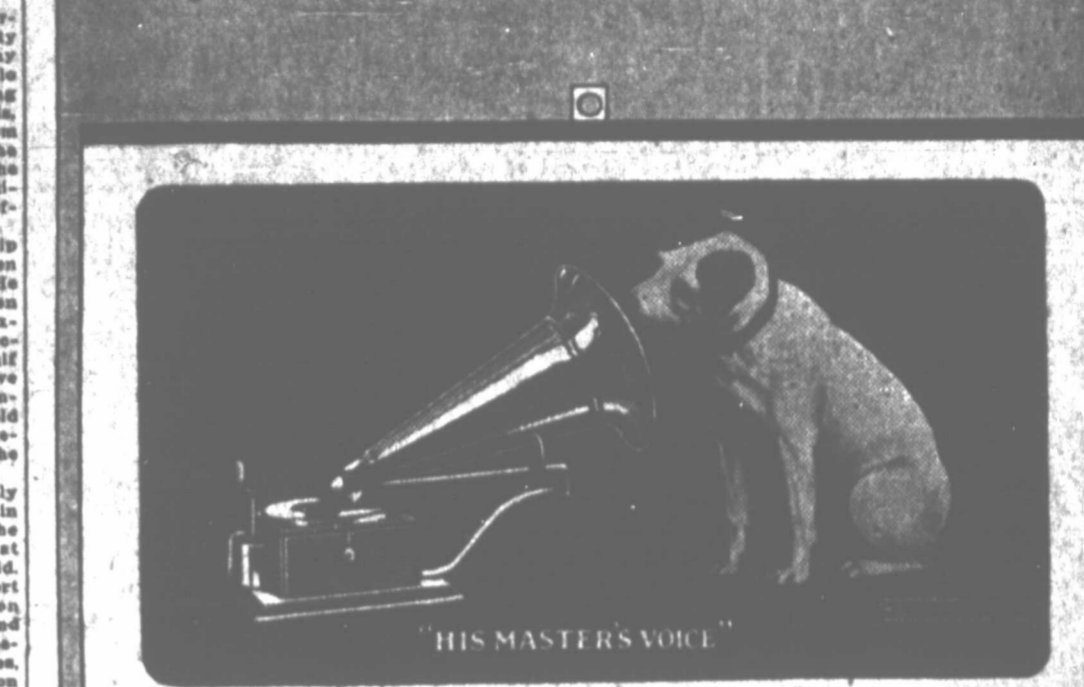

DECLINE OF 8050 BARRELS IN DAILY CRUDE PRODUCTION

NEW YORK, Aug. 22.—The daily average gross crude oil production of the United States decreased 8,050 barrels for the week ended August 20, totaling 2,323,466 barrels, according to the summary of the American Petroleum Institute.

Daily Average Imports of petroleum at principal ports were 257,514 barrels, compared with 216,871 for the previous week.

There were no changes reported in crude oil prices for the major districts, midcontinent being quoted at \$1.16 to \$1.25 a barrel, according to the gravity of the oil.

California production was 894,000 barrels, a decrease of 2,000.

Oklahoma shows a daily average gross production of 453,500 barrels, a decrease of 1,100; Kansas, 175,000, decrease of 200; North Dakota, 600,000, decrease of 2,000; Central Texas, 245,000, increase of 1,000; South Texas, 41,000, decrease of 200; Arkansas, 125,000, increase of 200; Gulf Coast, 100,000, increase of 200; Wyoming, 100,000, increase of 200; Montana, 125,000, decrease of 1,000.

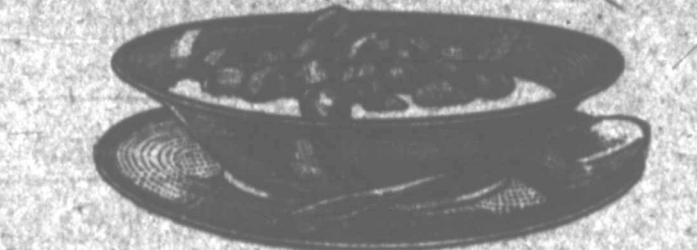
