

DEMOCRATIC TAX SUBSIDY OF THE PLAN SHARP CONTRAST

FAVORS SMALL TAX PAYER TO DISADVANTAGE OF THE WEALTHY.

INCREASES EXEMPTION OF HEADS OF FAMILIES

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7. (AP)—A Democratic substitute for the Mellon tax revision program is before congress and the country. It presents a sharp contrast to the Mellon plan in favor of the small taxpayer and to the disadvantage of the large taxpayer.

An increase in the exemption of heads of families from \$2,000 to \$3,000 and single men from \$1,000 to \$1,500.

A maximum tax rate of 44 per cent on incomes in excess of \$50,000, but with the actual rate starting at \$12,000 instead of \$10,000 as proposed by Secretary Mellon.

An allowance of 10 per cent on earned income with this provision extended to include farmers and small merchants who combine capital with personal services.

More sweeping repeal of the so-called nuisance taxes than is proposed in the Mellon bill.

The treasury tax draft proposes no changes in the existing exemption allowed heads of families and unmarried persons, while the reductions in normal tax rates are smaller than proposed by the Democrats.

It would reduce the present four per cent on incomes of \$4,000 or less to three per cent and the present eight per cent rate on incomes in excess of \$4,000 to six per cent.

The income allowance proposed in the treasury draft is limited to 25 per cent and would not apply to farmers and tradesmen.

The Democrats also urged that consideration be given during the present session of the Mellon bill for reductions of a number of tariff duties which they declared were the single factor in the existing high cost of living.

"These monstrous high rates," the statement said, "constitute a curtailment of the means of the people for the maintenance of a standard of living which they are entitled to."

The Democrats in outlining their program said they would give wholehearted support to many of the recommendations of Mr. Mellon, particularly with reference to tightening up certain technical features of existing law to prevent tax evasion.

These provisions are now under consideration in the way and means committee and Mr. Garner's statement said they were being taken up in the most "non-partisan spirit."

The committee reassembled today under a program which calls for a preliminary session of the Mellon bill provisions before it determines whether a soldiers' bonus is to be applied to the military.

However, that decision would be made by a conference of house Republicans to be held Thursday night on petitions presented by a group of former service men who are members of the house and who want immediate action on the bonus.

Residents Eastern Part Archer County Ask Bond Election to Build Highway Direct to Wichita Falls

Believing that a direct road from Wichita Falls to Windthorst would be the best means of the eastern part of Archer county, residents of a strip the length of the county and seven miles wide, have signed a petition for the building of the road and the employment of Watkins and Walsh, Wichita Falls attorneys, to handle the case.

The petition calling for a road bond election of \$300,000 and for the formation of Archer County Road District No. 1, was filed in the Archer county commissioners court at 3:30 o'clock Monday morning by the attorneys. Seventy-nine signatures, or more than one-fourth of the residents of the district have signed the petition. It is said.

According to the petition, the citizens propose to build a concrete highway from Windthorst to Wichita Falls on the line of the present road, which is now owned by the Jackson, which passes through Scotland and Windthorst, but is impassable during bad weather.

It is pointed out that the citizens stated that it is hoped that the state highway commission will route highway No. 5 over the concrete road if it is believed that the road is of sufficient width to handle the traffic.

The petition proposes the building of three roads, No. 1, from the Wichita county line to Windthorst; No. 2, from Windthorst south to the county line; and No. 3, from Windthorst to within four miles of Archer City.

RECENT DISCOVERY MAY SOLVE MYSTERY OF VIRGINIA DARE

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7. (AP)—One of the unsolved mysteries of history has been called to the attention of the Smithsonian institute as the result of the discovery of a stone of lead here three feet under ground bearing an inscription which may throw light upon the disappearance of Virginia Dare, the first white child born in America.

Digging in his back yard, Donald Kautz discovered the slab, which is one eighth of an inch thick, 14 inches long and six inches wide. When cleaned by acid the following inscription apparently cut with a hot instrument, was disclosed: "Virginia Dare."

"Charles R. Virginia Dare was the granddaughter of Governor John White and daughter of one of his officers, established an agricultural colony in England in 1587, arriving in the summer at Roanoke Island, Virginia, where the child was born the same year. Governor White soon left for England and returned on the following voyage, but he was unable to find any trace of the colony or the child.

Officials of the Smithsonian institute are desirous to express their opinion on the genuineness of the find pending a more thorough examination next week.

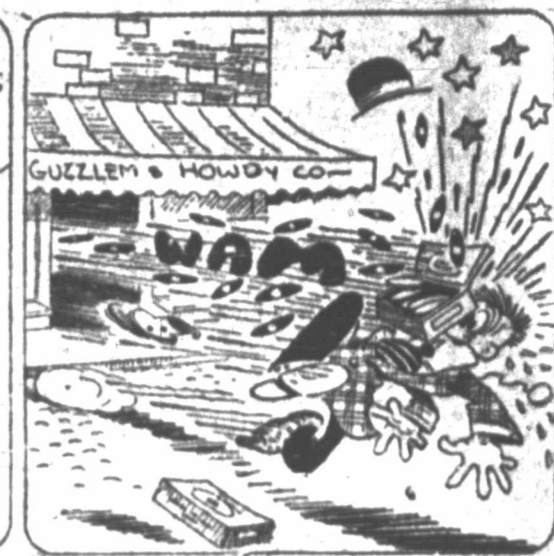

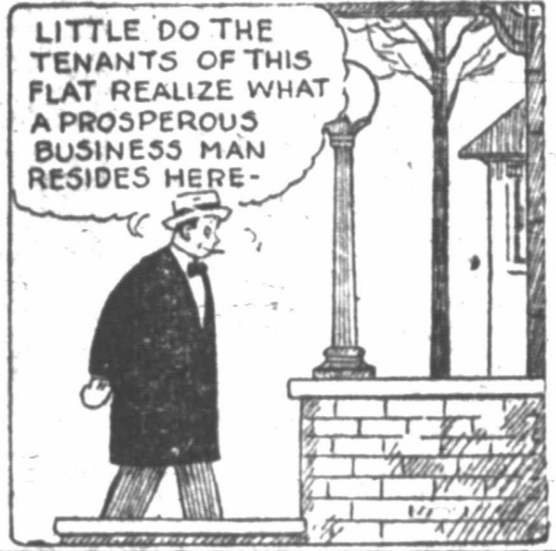

January 1 to March 15 is the period set by the department of internal revenue for filing returns on income for 1923. A suggestion is being made by the department to taxpayers that one of the new year resolutions be to file income tax returns early.

Directly making out an income tax return reduced to a minimum. Form 1040 is to be used by persons, any part of whose income for the year 1923 was derived from business or profession, farming, sale of property or rents, regardless of the amount, and in all cases where the net income was in excess of \$5,000, regardless of the source.
