## YARD OF MONTH PLAQUE GOES TO MRS. McAULEY

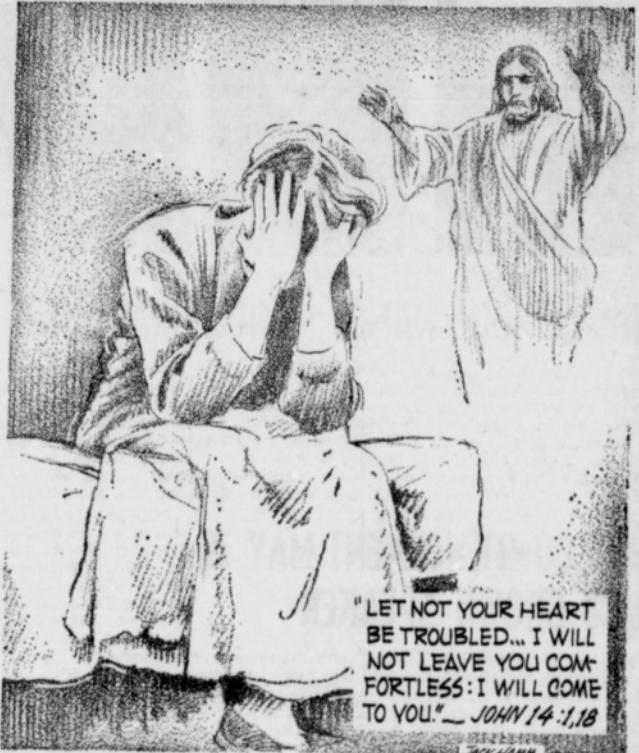

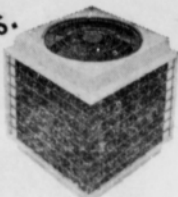

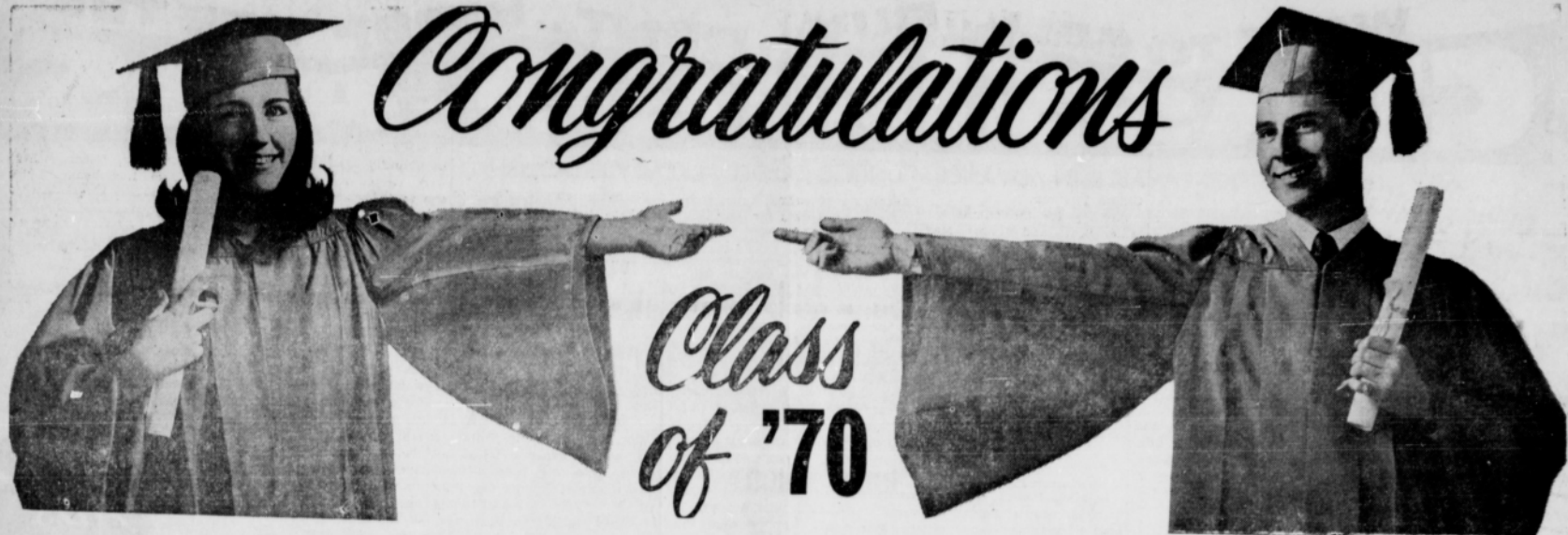
