

MAHON WANTS NEW DISTRICTS
Congressman George Mahon, from this 19th district, is making preparations to introduce a bill in Congress creating an eighth division of the North Texas Federal District court with headquarters at Big Spring. The court would sit in a proposed

new federal building in Big Springs. Borden, Dawson, Howard, Mitchell and Scurry counties would be shifted from the north district and Andrews, Gaines, Midland and Glasscock from the present western district.
Mahon also has a bill before the House Judiciary committee to create a new district court in West Texas.

Bailey County Grand Jury Questioned 35 Witnesses; 5 Charged

The Bailey County Grand Jury, appointed for the spring term of District Court reported a total of five indictments, found all officers performing their duty well and the court house kept in good order, according to their report, as follows:

We members of the Grand Jury, duly appointed for said term, May, 1933, beg to submit this our final report, as follows:

We have been in session a total of four days, and have examined 35 witnesses. We have made careful investigation of all law violations coming to our knowledge and have true presentation made of such cases, as under our oaths, we believe should be indicted. We have returned a total of five felony indictments.

We have made a careful inspection of the county court house, finding it in good and upkept and sanitary condition, and in our opinion, the various officers of the county, domiciled therein are all performing their duties in an acceptable manner.

We thank the Court for its kind cooperation and assistance. We thank the county and district attorneys for their assistance. We commend the sheriff, for his efficient work in law enforcement, and commend all peace officers for their diligence. The good work of the sheriff and county attorney in taking care of misdemeanors, by complaint and summary conviction, of our time to be devoted to such cases. On the whole, we find law abiding to be in a good state in Bailey county.
Having finished our deliberations, we respectfully ask that we be excused for the term.

State Convention Of Democrats Held For Four States

New Cotton Report Shows 1934 Decline Says U. S. Dept

Revised estimates of the 1934 cotton crop released by the Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C., last week placed production at 9,636,000 of 500 pounds growth weight, compared with 13,947,000 bales for 1933. Ginnings were 9,636,073 bales of 500 pounds each for 1934.
The area of cotton in cultivation the last year was 27,883,000 acres, compared with 40,852,000 the previous year, and the area picked was 26,987,000 acres, compared with 29,978,000.
Production of lint cotton last year was 1793 pounds per acre, compared with 208.5 pounds the previous year.

RE-START OF WELL TEST

Further work of developing the Claudell-Willis oil test well in Roosevelt county, N. M., just across the line from Bailey county, was begun last week.

The giorietta sand will be given a thorough test for oil, and in the event it does not prove a producer at that depth, it will be plugged back to a depth of 3300 feet and the acid treatment given.

Just before the shut-down a few weeks ago, the well showed a strong flow of gas and every confidence is expressed the well will become a producer.

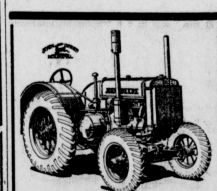

State Doctor Gives Warning Against Fevers of Season

Austin, May 28.—This is the season when an increase in undulant fever cases may be expected, according to Dr. John W. Brown, State Health Officer. An undulant fever patient complains of warmth and has fever. There may also be chills sensations or severe shaking chills and sweats. The patient loses weight and feels weak. If illness is of mild type, the patient finds it hard to remain in bed. He tries to keep on with his work but has "no pep."

Symptoms often continue for a number of weeks before recovery occurs. Fortunately undulant fever has a low death rate. Body temperatures may reach a higher mark each day than the day before, and then gradually return to normal over a period of several days. Fever may be absent for some days and come back again to act the same way as before, registering higher each day and then gradually going lower. The patient's temperature chart as kept by the nurse in home or hospital, may resemble smooth waves or undulations. The appearance of the temperature curve in typical cases has given this disease the name undulant fever. The term "Malaria" fever has been in common use in recent years but the name undulant fever is more accurate.

Undulant fever is one of the infectious diseases known to be transmitted from animals to human beings. In cows and hogs, the germ causes a disease of great economic importance known as contagious abortion. When this germ invades the human body, the resulting disease is undulant fever. Prevention is dependent upon (1) eradication of the disease in farm animals, (2) careful pasteurization of dairy products and (3) avoidance, insofar as possible, of direct contact with infected animals.

20 CCC Men To Be Selected From This County On June 15

Bailey county has a quota of 20 young men to be furnished the CCC government camps, and application for such memberships will be taken by Pat R. Bobo, at the court house on June 10. This is the largest quota of men for this service ever allotted to Bailey county, and represents this county's portion of the 26,880 CCC men to be called to government service from the State of Texas. This state's former quota was 14,200 men, but was recently increased by President Roosevelt when he called for a total national enrollment of 600,000 men.

While applications will close June 10, actual enrollment will take place between June 15 and August 31, applicants from this county, after having been accepted, probably going to Lubbock for final physical examination, Bobo said.

Men between the ages of 18 and 28 years will be accepted. Those having had as much as five month previous service in the Citizens Conservation corps, and not more than 18 months, if they have an honorable discharge, will be eligible for reenlistment.

Mr. Bobo emphasizes the excellence of this opportunity for many young men who are new out of employment, and expresses his regret that even more may not be allowed the privilege of this governmental service. "It is certainly an opportunity for the young man who is fortunate to get in this service," Boba said. The CCC officials give the very best attention to the young men, their general supervision is of the closest type, they have opportunity of outdoor life, good physical development, no excessive work, no typical hardships of any kind, free sick and hospital service, and at the same time receive wages sufficient that from \$20 to \$25 may be sent back each month to their homefolks.

The general attendance and co-operation of all people throughout the entire county is solicited by those in charge, people from all over this section, regardless of church denomination and affiliation, being urged to join in making this a great spiritual as well as social event.

Rev. Fort has the reputation of very successfully handling some previous camp meeting events which have resulted very favorably for the church in general and have been of great inspiration to those attending.
