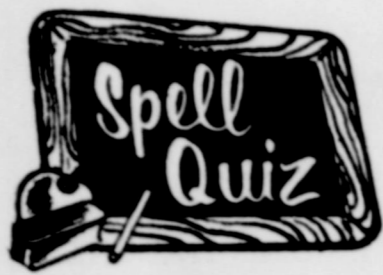
"Any woman interested in the work of the WSCS is urged to attend this program and tea," said Mrs. Payne.
