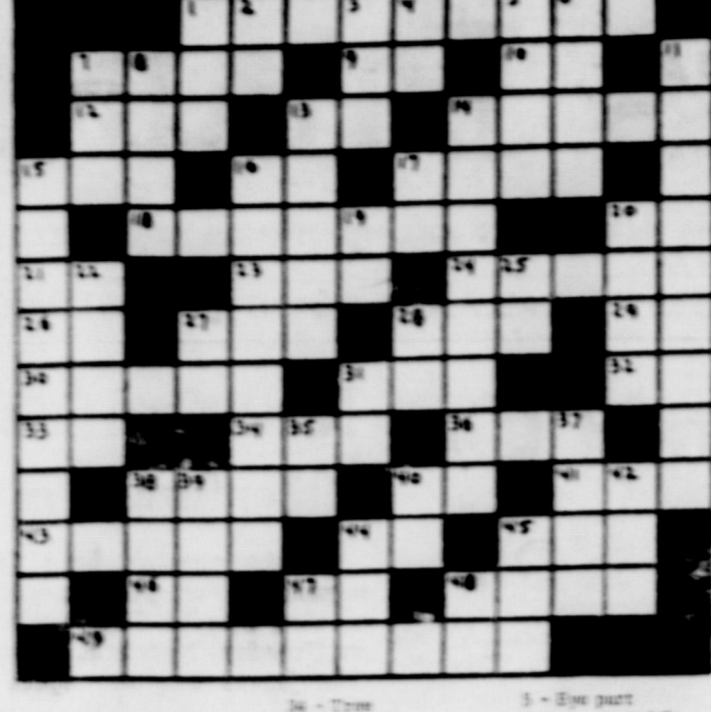

HOME HINTS

FROM HIGGINBOTHAMS

Today's column is a continuation of last week's list of stain treatments for polyester fiber carpet:

LATEX PAINT: Blot excess with tissues or soft cloth. Sponge with mild detergent solution; blot with clean cloths. Repeat process until spot disappears. If possible, lift carpet to permit air circulation. Force-dry with electric fan.

CANDLE WAX: Apply steam, using a steam iron. (Do not set the iron on the carpet.) Blot with tissue. Then sponge with drycleaning fluid; blot with issue.

21-BARREL WELL HIT IN CROSS CUT SECTOR

Pitcock Inc., of Graham has completed an oiler in the regular field in Brown County as No. 3 Williams, about five miles southeast of Cross Cut.

Site is 2,010 feet from the north and 1,515 feet from the east lines of T. J. Swindell Survey.

Daily potential was 21 barrels of 41.5 gravity oil, pumping from perforations at 1,157-65 feet. The Cross Cut Sand producer is bottomed at 1,172 feet.

SHOE POLISH: Sponge with paint, oil or grease remover (available from a drycleaner or professional carpet cleaner) and blot with tissue. Then sponge with drycleaning fluid; blot with tissue. Finally, sponge with detergent solution; blot with tissue.

TAR: Sponge with drycleaning fluid; blot with tissue.

Ex-Local Man Buried At Hamlin Thursday

Art Carmichael, 62-year-old prominent Abilene businessman and former Cross Plains resident was buried in Hamlin Cemetery Thursday following funeral at the Highland Church of Christ in Abilene at 2 p.m.

Mr. Carmichael died in an Abilene hospital at 7:48 p.m. Tuesday of last week after entering earlier that day.

Born in Ardmore, Okla., Nov. 27, 1910, the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Roy Carmichael, he and his late brother, Stanley, who died Aug. 22, 1972, built a business including about 50 firms primarily in auto sales scattered from Port Arthur to Artesia, N.M.

The family moved to Cross Plains in 1925 when it was an oil boom town and operated a cafe. Both brothers finished high school in Cross Plains. Art served as captain of the football team for two years and was president of the Class of 1928.

Both the Carmichaels studied to be doctors, but the depression forced their return to Cross Plains. They moved to Hamlin in 1933 and branched into the auto business there.

Mr. Carmichael, an active church member and trustee and board of Abilene Christian College, married Lucille Burkett June 27, 1935, in Coleman.

Survivors are his wife of the home; one brother, Harry, of Sweetwater; one sister, Mrs. John Howard King of Lake Havasu City, Ariz., and four nephews and two nieces.

He was preceded in death by a son, Stephen Arthur Carmichael, who died May 15, 1960.
