Lions Renew Gridiron Wars Here On Friday

Cross Plains Buffaloes will renew the gridiron wars here on Friday in a District 10-A contest against the Dublin Lions. The Buffaloes have rested a week since their 39-0 victory over Goldthwaite in the district's second conference game.

Buffaloes will have their first home game of the season on Friday at 7:30 p.m. in Buffalo. The Buffaloes have won several years since they and Cross Plains gridiron wars have met in football. Both are now members of District 10-A.

Lions own a 4-3 season record and the Buffaloes are looking to open their season with a win. Dublin has two victories in league competition and one win in the Herd. Both teams have bowlers. Loop favorite De Leon, who is losing 38-0, and the Buffaloes are dropping a 14-0 decision. Buffaloes have triumphs over Goldthwaite. Buffaloes won 39-0 in the Lions defeated the Buffaloes last Friday.

Buffaloes will be seeking to win the title race, hoping to upset the loop leading team. A loss or a tie will virtually eliminate chances for a share of the conference championship. Statistics show that offensive teams rate about 100 points in six games. The Buffaloes have scored 115 points in six games. Average of just over 19 per game. Dublin has tallied 113 points in seven tilts, a mean of 16 per outing. Dublin has Cross Plains holds a 29-15 last Friday.

Buffaloes have allowed opponents just 34 points in six games. Dublin has yielded 20 points to seven foes, a mean of 2.9 points per contest. Season polls favored the Buffaloes to finish second in the race with the Buffaloes leading sixth. An independent poll has Cross Plains as number two squad in the district and Dublin as number

Ten lettermen returned to the Lions from the 1973 squad which was 9-1 on the season and 4-1 in District 11-A competition. Four were offensive starters and four were defensive regulars. Four veterans have lettered three years. They are senior guard and defensive end Micky Kennedy, 161 pounds; guard and linebacker Pat Leatherwood, 157-pound senior; tackle and linebacker Darwin Hester, senior weighing 177, and tailback-safety Mike Jurney, 171. Vernon Scales, 198-pound senior, has earned two letters and plays both ways. Another talented Lion is Terry Tate, 165-pound senior end.
