2 WILDCAT OIL TESTS SLATED NORTH PUTNAM

Two Callahan County wildcat locations have been staked by ACR Exploration Inc. of Abilene. Both are slated for 4,200 feet.

No. 1 Bobby Moore will be drilled eight miles northeast of Putnam on a 325 acre lease. Drillsite is 380 feet from the south and 330 feet from the east lines of Section 3196, T&E.L. Survey.

Other wildcat is No. 1 Fred Wylie, located nine miles north of Putnam on a 120 acre lease. Drillsite is 987 feet from the south and 330 feet from the west lines of Section 123, University Lands Survey.

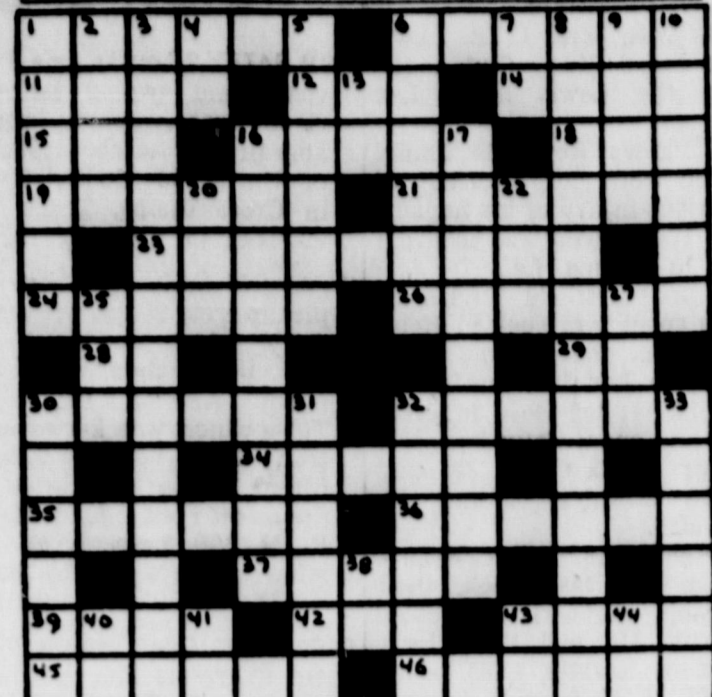
