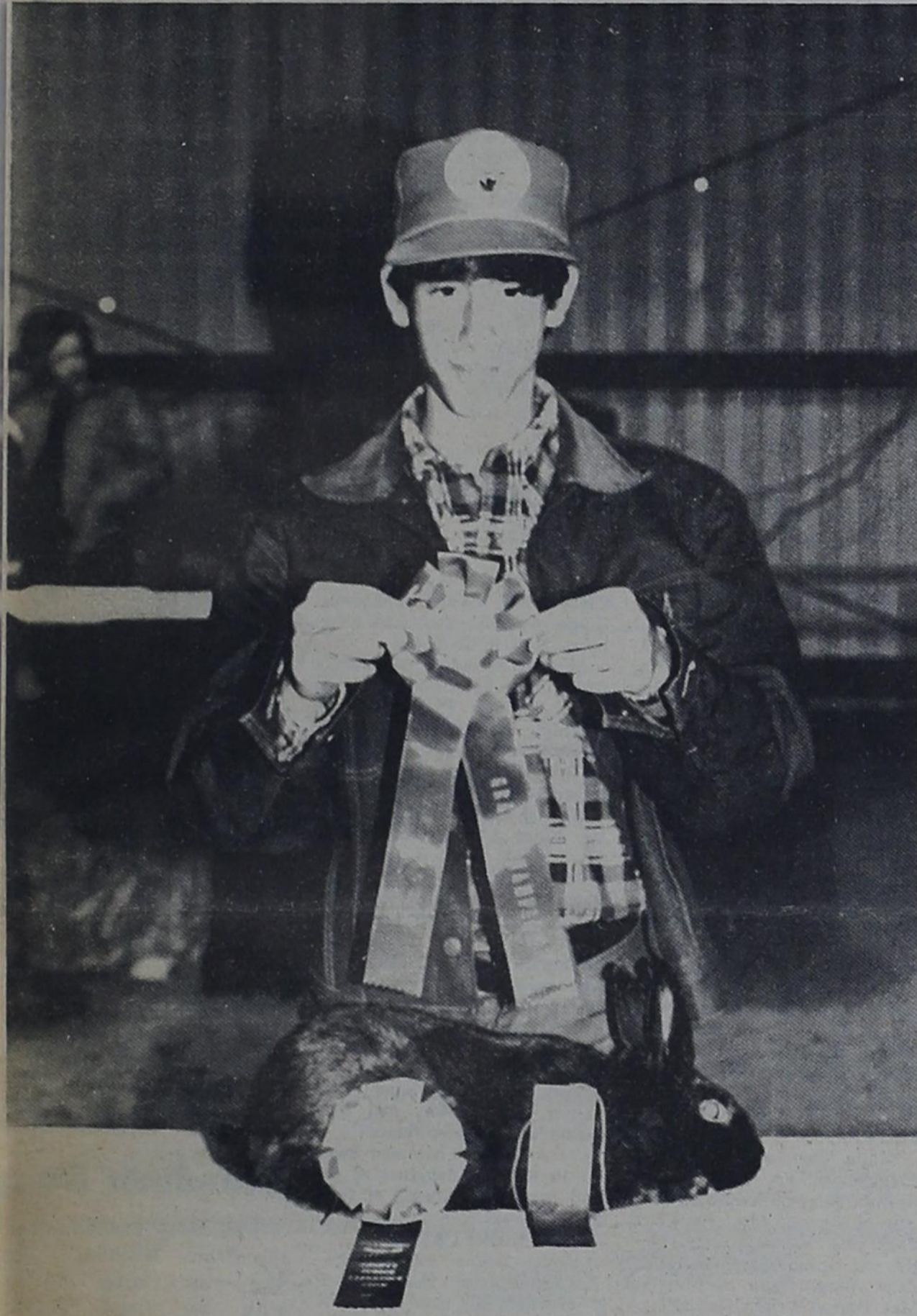

Miss Burks is presently teaching the 6th grade in Marietta, Georgia, near Atlanta, where her parents were recently transferred.

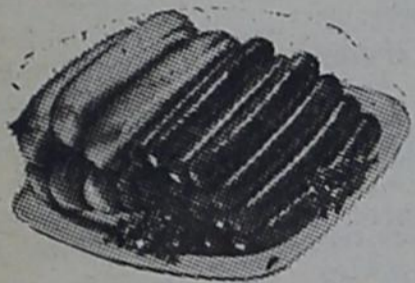

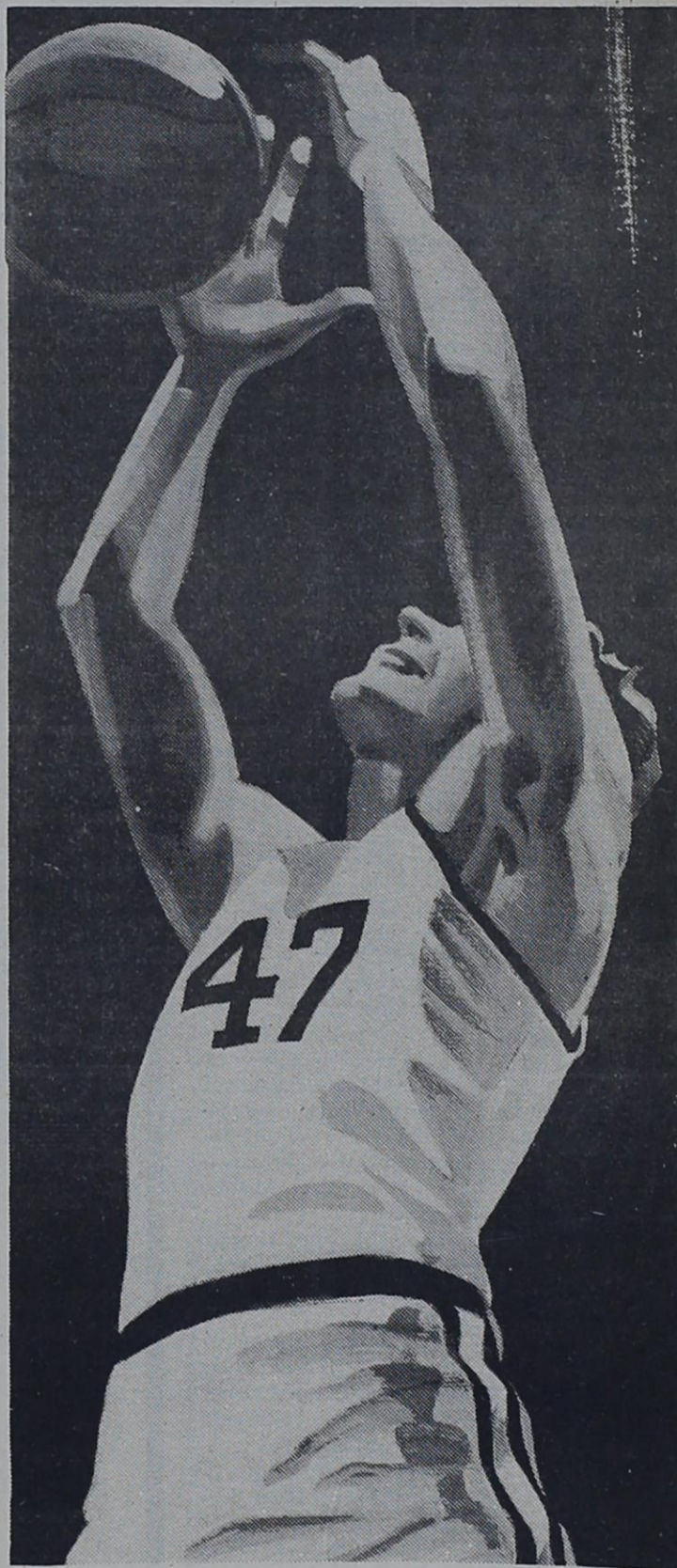

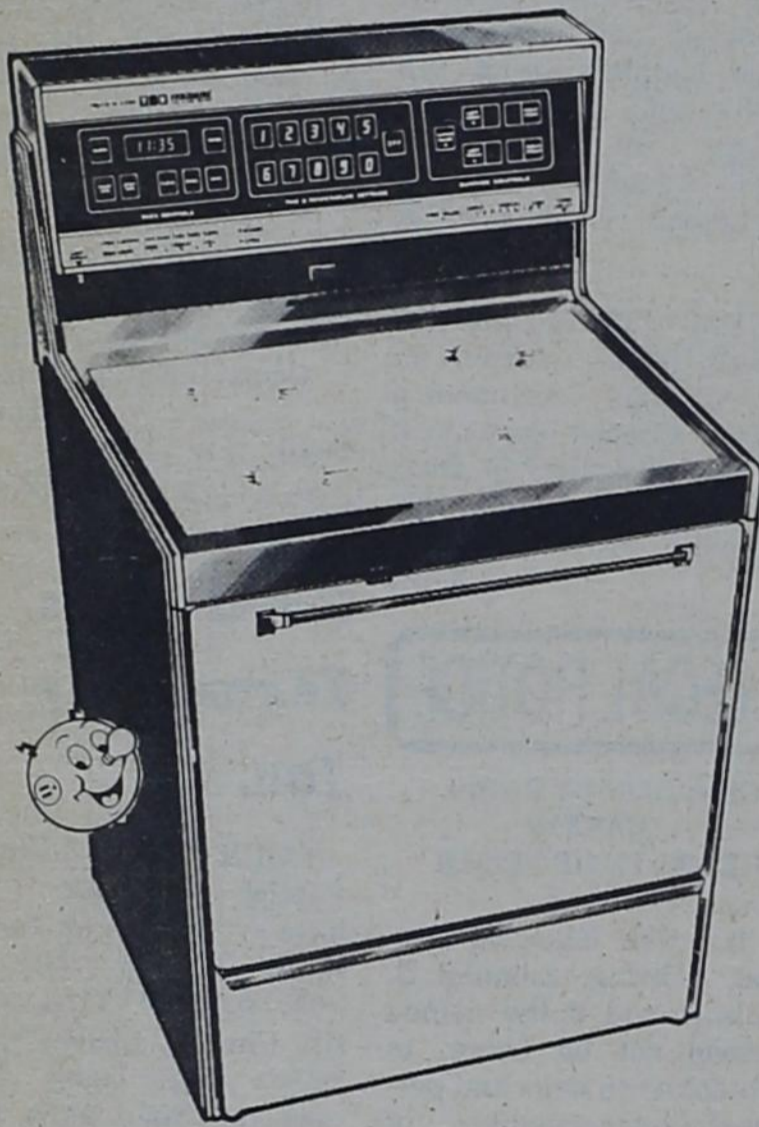
Omar Burleson Approves Grant

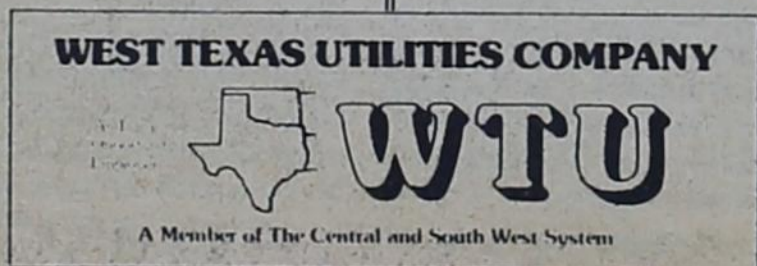
