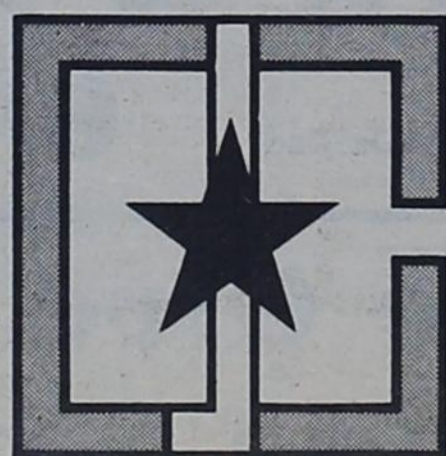

Odom pointed out that high school seniors are urged to go ahead and register in advance even though they have not completed graduation and their transcripts may be submitted later.

Meeting Monday through Thursday will be: History 113 (History of the United States to Reconstruction); English 213.3 (Readings in English Literature); Math 113 (College Algebra); English 113.3 (English Composition and Rhetoric); Government 213.3 (American National Government); Math 103 (Intermediate Algebra) Psychology 113.2 (General Psychology); P.E. 111 (Golf) P.E. 211 (Golf); Speech 113 (Voice and Diction); Business 113 (Introduction to Business); Drama 112 (Rehearsal & Performance) Business 233 (Introduction to Business Law); Psychology 213 (Child Psychology). Meeting on Saturdays only will be Sociology 123, with lab (Social Welfare as a Social Institution).

The first morning classes will meet from 8:15 a.m. to 10:10 a.m., and the second morning classes will meet from 10:15 a.m. to 12:10 p.m. Exceptions to this will be the P.E. class, with time yet to be arranged, and the Saturday Sociology class which will meet from 9:00 a.m. to

12:00 noon and from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. combining lecture and lab.

Night classes meeting Monday, and Wednesday will include: English 113.4 (English Composition & Rhetoric); English 213.4 (Readings in English); Sociology 223 (Social Problems); Business 113 (Introduction to Business); Government 213 (American National Government) and Art lab 213 (Design lab).

Classes being held on Tuesday and Thursday evening will be: English 243 (American Literature) History 113; Business 213 (Principles of Economics); Speech 123 (Public Speaking); Art 213 (Design and Color); and Math 113 (College Algebra). All evening classes will meet from 6:45 p.m. to 10:15 p.m.

The Cisco College's low state-supported costs for tuition and fees will, as usual be in effect. They are: 1 hour, \$44.50; 2 hours, \$44.50; 3 hours, \$47.50; 4 hours, \$53.00; 5 hours, \$56.00; 6 hours, \$59.00; and 7 hours \$65.00. These do not include lab fees for P.E. classes.

Mr. Odom reminded prospective students that a class must have at least fifteen students in order to be held, and that any course offered in the Cisco Junior College catalogue could be held providing at least fifteen students want it.

Final exams for the classes are set for July 5 and 6.
