May 1 Deadline

All students who live in one school district but attend school in another adjoining district, or wish to, should pick up the transfer forms in the school office, complete them, and return them to the school office by May 1. This is for the 1982-83 school year.

A student may transfer to an adjoining district but not across another district. Thus students living in Clyde could transfer to Baird or Eula, if it is agreeable with both schools, but not to Cross Plains or Abilene.

The forms may be picked up in any school business office. The forms should be returned to the school office before May 1 then they will be acted upon by the proper school board.

Roadside Park Site Of Attempted Robbery Monday Night

Two young men were attacked and beaten Monday night at the East bound Roadside park on I-20.

Victor Blank and Jerry Wade McDaniel were in the process of moving to Clyde with a female friend, when they decided to stop at the park facilities.

McDaniel was attacked in the back of the men's room, kicked and beaten. His assailant took his wallet, discovering no money threw it away.

Black was attacked upon entering the men's room by another subject, kicked and beaten also, and his wallet removed.

The female companion, name unknown, was in the victim's pick-up when two men ran out and one of them yelled, "We're

sorry about this!", and sped away in a 1972 green Ceevrolet pick-up.

At 11:49, Jerry Williams, stopped at the same park, and was also attacked by 2 men fitting the same descriptions as Black and McDaniel's assailants.

One suspect is described as, white male, 6 foot, 150 pounds, with dark brown hair and a mustache, wearing blue jeans, dark blue T-shirt with insignia and boots. He also wears glasses.

Number 2 was 6'3", 160 pounds, blonde hair and glasses, wearing jeans, a bright colored western shirt and boots.

Victor Black was treated at Hendrick Medical Center for a broken nose. Black and McDaniel suffered multiple cuts and abrasions to the head and face.

County Scales Pass Inspection By Dept. of Ag.

Callahan County people can count on getting their money's worth in weight through the year if the products are weighed on local scales or gas pumps, Agriculture Commissioner

Reagan V. Brown said today. In the county there are 168 weighing devices of different types, ranging from 104 fuel pumps to 52 supermarket scales.

"Our department regularly checks the commercial scales in the county and has found that they conform to our previous surveys across the state. Of those that were above or below tolerance, not many scales were off by significant amounts. Also, as many were giving the customer too much of the product as were giving too little. Because of frequent checks

scales are not out of calibration very long," Brown said.

"Business owners are glad to see it come in because as often as not, they have been losing money if their scales were not accurate," Brown said.

The Texas Department of Agriculture has inspectors assigned to every county. They are trained to check all different types of scales—from those for medicines in a pharmacy to those

for livestock and grain.

The inspectors also spot check packaged goods, such as cereals and crackers, to make certain that the weight stated on the label is accurate. If on the average the weights of the packages are below the amount stated on the label, the shipment is put on a Stop-Sale order. The store owner then either returns the items to the processor or as is the case very often, gives them to charitable organizations. Meat packaged in the supermarket as well as processor packs are also checked by Department inspectors.

VA Answer Questions Concerning Benefits

The Veterans Administration is often asked questions concerning their benefits. The VA has decided to answer some of these questions that follow:

Q--My GI Bill benefits are not enough to offset school expenses. Are there any other VA programs that can help me?

A--You might be eligible for a work-study program which pays mini-

mum wage for a VA-related work. Disabled veterans receive preference.

Q--I had a school overpayment dating from 1975. Recently, when I applied for a GI home loan, I was told it could not be processed until I repaid the overpayment. Is this legal?

A--Yes. It is VA policy to reconcile all outstanding debts prior to approving a home loan application.

Q--In enlisted in the service in December 1980 and got out in December 1981. Is it true that I am not eligible for hospital treatment?

Generally, benefits are denied to persons enlisting after September 7, 1980 is they do not complete the shorter of 24 months continuous active duty or the full period for which they signed up.

This does not apply to veterans who were discharged for a disability incurred in line of duty, for the convenience of the government or for reasons of hardship.

If you have a question you would like answered, go to any VA office. Their counselors will be happy to answer any questions that one might have.
