# Midlanders Cautioned About Christmas Lights

Midland Fire Chief J. M. Little this morning warned Midlanders to be extra careful with indoor and outdoor lighting decorations during the Christmas season.

"Our records show that Christmas is prime time for accidental fires and extra precautions should be taken in decorating homes," Little said. The fire chief offers the following suggestions:

Natural trees should be freshlooking and firm-needled when selected and the trunk should be placed in water and kept in water until the tree is disposed of.

Do not rely on do-it-yourself flameproofing, as none is truly effective.

Trees should be set up away from heat and where it won't block doorways or passageways. Artificial trees should clearly be marked as made of slow burning materials and there should be a Underwriters' Laboratories (UL) label on trees when a built-in electrical system on the tree is used.

With the use of metal trees only indirect lighting should be used to avoid the possibility of shock.

In regard to lighting, check all lighting strains for facet.

What, then, is so mysterious about the telephone that has permitted AT&T to enjoy a total government-sanctioned monopoly? Why do AT&T and its defenders say only AT&T can provide such consumer products efficiently and at low

The government and growing segments of the communications industry say the mystery was stripped away by technological advances over at least the last decade. In other words, they argue that Western Electric, the equipment manufacturer owned by AT&T, is not the only company capable of making modern

There are many domestic and foreign companies making e quipment—telephones, switchboards, data transmission systems superior in capability and cheaper than Western Electric equipment offered by Bell System telephone companies.

In hearings last year before the Senate antitrust subcommittee, an executive of Montgomery Ward testified that the giant retailer is saving over \$1 million a year by buying non-Bell System equipment for data transmission linking the corporation's computers around the country.

Montgomery Ward also is replacing many of its Bell System telephone switchboards with competing equipment that has provided greater com-munication flexibility at lower cost, the executive reported.

The subcommittee, chaired by

Sen. Philip A. Hart, D-Mich., has collected evidence for several years on the alleged anticompetitive activities of AT&T. The files were made available to the Justice Department and reportedly played a role in convincing the government to broaden its suit. To Test Accuracy

The files bulge with reports of Bell System policies that effectively prevent small businesses from buying their own telephone equipment to replace what is provided by the local telephone company. The accuracy of these reports will be tested in the courtroom through the government's suit.

One such policy, approved by state regulatory agencies, ex-plains why many stores don't sell telephones. The policy, in-sisted upon by the Bell System, requires the installation of an interface device on all telephone equipment not manufactured by Western Electric.

The Bell System argues that equipment made by someone

And throwing away wormy cycle, the fish is eaten by fish is a waste of good meat,

According to officials, fishermen may find two types of worms in fish, bass tapeworms and roundworms which appear in the internal organs of fish and yellow or black grubs which are encysted along the dorsal spines

Parks and Wildlife Department fisheries biologists say that ordinary cleaning will remove internal parasites. If the fisherman finds an encysted grub, removing a slice of meat from both sides of the dorsal fin is the easiest way to get rid of them.

The "grubby fish" say of-

parasitic worms which have burrowed into the fish and formed cysts. In the next stage of the parasite's life a bird where the parasites reach their adult stage in the digestive tract.

When the eggs from these worms enter the water by way of the bird's feces, they are hatched into tiny freeswimming larvae which penetrate snails.

Within the snails the larvae go through different stages known respectively as sporocysts and rediae


The rediae form thousands of tailed larvae known as cercariae which are freeswimming and emerge from the snail. These swim about in the water and will develop no further until they encounter a suitable fish in which to continue their development and life cycle


