TOOK TITLE HOLDING CLUB TO TRIMMING IN NATIONAL BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT BY SCORE OF 35 TO 22.

CRESCENT IS ELIMINATED

Brooklyn Quintet Defeated by the East Kansas City Team; Swann, Californian Made Majority of Goals for Los Angeles.

ATLANTA, Ga., Mar. 11.—The New York University team put the title-holding Los Angeles athletic club five out of the running in the national basketball tournament of the American amateur athletic union here today, defeating the Californians 35 to 22.

The East Crescent athletic team from Brooklyn was eliminated, 21 to 19, by the Kansas City (Mo.) athletic club quintet.

The New York University five led the champions from California practically all the time. The physical condition of the collegians seemed better than that of the athletic club players.

Goeller and Money led the scoring for New York, while Delaney and Baker played wonderful games at guard. The Californians often used long passes and usually a New Yorker intercepted them.

Indianapolis Boat Winner.

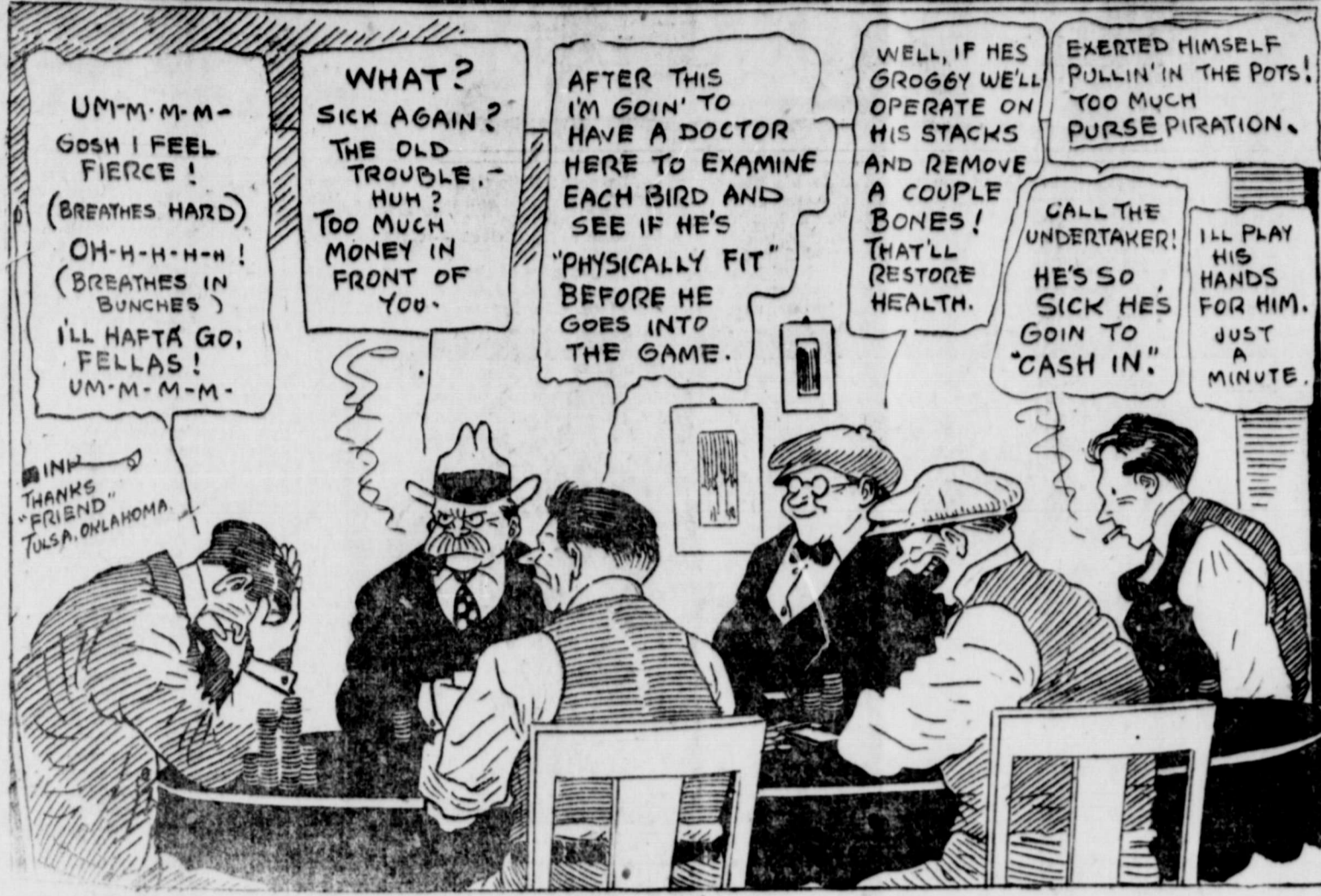

RAW MATERIALS IN RUSSIA. Blockade Not the Explanation of Collapse of Industry.

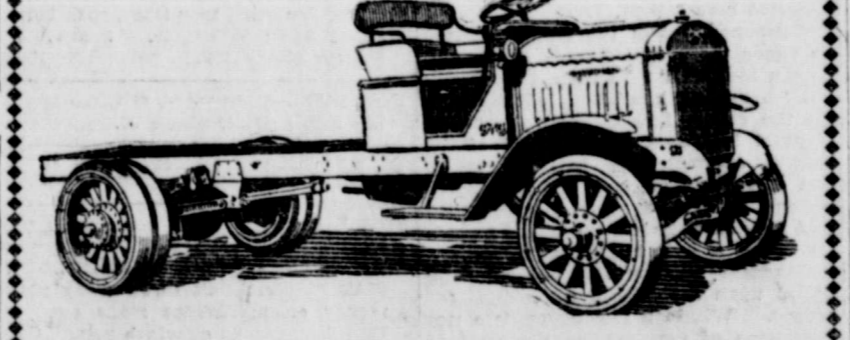
