WHEN YOU SEE A PICTURE PLAY BACKWARDS

BACTARY POMANICE

THEN I see people coming out of a picture theater with impassive faces and hear them say of the feature, "Oh, pretty good," in a languid sort of way, I ronder how many have seen the picture backwards.

Seeing a picture backwards means entering a theater during the last third of its run and starting there. Now this is unfair to the patron himself who wants to get the most enjoyment out of his drama, and is a rank injustice to the director who builds his play up with the purpose of cumulative effect on the emotions.

Much of this effect he hopes to get by withholding the course of events and turning the plot so as to create pleasurable surprises. But how is he to accomplish this if patrons of the theater walk in toward the end and see his climax first? With that as his starting point the play-goer can round the homestretch with the picture and start in at the beginning so "wised up" to the culmination of the story that all the efforts of the author and director to surprise him and keep him alert with suspense are heavily handicapped.

I have no patience with the writers who sometimes say that their plot creations are manhandled in the stuto the screen wholly different things. Directors may sometimes take too great liberties with stories, but usually they have a conscientious regard for the author's line of thought and try to-

follow it. Making Stories Possible.

"The director thinks with the picture mind, the novelist with the literary mind.' In writing, the author may digress and ramble to the pleasure of the reader because of his charm of narrative style; but for pictures the action must be straight-forward and continuous. Instead of spoiling stories, directors make most of them possible for the screen by skillful rearrangement.

"These changes may burt the vanity of the author, but usually they 'put over' what otherwise would not go over, The best thing in many a film is the interpolated stuff-action or ephode that has come to mind as inspiration during the filming-and the reason able author is glad to have them adder to his work, if it is discreetly done."

Study the screen if you want to test your capacities as a writer of photoplays. Scenario schools and other similar media of instruction are very good as far as they go, but real benefits along this line are best obtained! by putting into use one's faculties of! analysis, Charles A Dana, the great editor, made the remark that the best school of journalism was a newspaper office. Dans meant that it is practice more than precept that draws out one's abilities and frains them. So it is with writing for the silent drame.

Being Able to Analyze.

I would advise aspirants along this line to pick out one of the best pictures made by a recognized master director, watch it unroll two or three times with a critical eye, then go home and try to write out the continuity scene for scene from memory. Then go back and see it again to compere this work with the film.

Next take the results of this comparison and analyze them to discover why its episodes have been treated as they were, why the fadeouts, cutbacks ! closeups and so forth were used.

If you can understand why, you may be pretty sure that you will demonstrate your capacity to prepare your stories to the satisfaction of the scen rio departments.
