A law passed by the Fortieth A naw passed by the Fortest Legislature but not generally understood by most of us relating to buying, selling or trading for second hand cars is as follows: "An act providing that whoever shall sell or trade or offer for sale or trade a second dead water which shall bear in the selling of the selling that the selling the selling that the selli hand motor vehicle shall have in his actual physical possession the tax collector's receipt for the license fee for the year in which the sale or trade is made and shall deliver to the purchaser the said copy of the same.

"Also that whoever should buy or trade for a second hand motor vehicle shall demand and receive the tax collector's re-ceipt for the license fee for the

ceipt for the license fee for the current year,
"Failure to comply with this law shall be punishable by a fine of not less than ten nor more than two thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than one year or both."


