

HUMAN DAIRIES IN BIG CITIES

So important is breast feedng to the new born infant that in some of our cities human dairies have been established. Mothers who have an excess of breast milk make regular visits to established centers, where they are taught how to express the milk from their breasts. This is pasteurized and resold at cost. In Detroit 8,975 ounces of breast milk were distributed in 1921 In New York City 36,266 ounces of breast milk were collected and sold at cost in eighteen months. One mother gave as much as forty ounces a day and furnished milk for eleven months. A healthy young Italian mother appeared at the New York center. Her baby was not thriving on account of being over fed. It improved at once after the mother was relieved of some of her surplus milk. The moth-
