This formal opening will be held soon and everybody will be invited, the books will be opened and the citizens will be told the facts in regard to the plant as they now stand.

We find that the City water plant is a great asset to the town. During the month of June the net earnings of this department after all expenses had been paid, was around \$700.00 for the month. There is a monthly intallment of \$525.00 to be paid each month on the new wells and pumps which were installed during the winter. This leaves about \$150.00 per month to be placed in a fund to went up in smoke. take care of future needs. We have a daily supply of over a million gallons, and we do not know of another town in West Texas, the size of Spur that has that much water supply.

We feel that the present report on the city's business is very reliable since the books have just been started by an independent accountant who is not interested in whether the light plant is making \$100.00 or \$10,000 per month. One pen was fed a regular laying mash along side of seven other pens as a check to see just what the comparison would be. The result was that the hens which got the milk and nothing but the grain laid the same number of eggs as the other pen. One pen fed on Barley, wheat and oats laid 334 eggs in 365 days. At that time it was a record so far as official records in the U. S. were concerned. If it has been broken I have not heard of it. And now from this information it shows that if you have as much as four gallons of milk per day per hun dred hens and if you have them where you can make them drink i and give them all the grain they want you should produce 150 eggs or more per bird.
