NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP)-Leaders of the Turkish Cypriot community proclaimed a separate Turkish Cypriot state in northern Cyprus today but said they wanted to federate it with a Greek Cypriot state.

The proclamation was made jointly by the council of minis-ters and the legislative assembly of the "Autonomous Tur-kish Cypriot Administration," meeting in joint session in the Turkish Cypriot quarter of Ni-

The proclamation came seven months after the Turkish in vasion of Cyprus. It ended in Turkish occupation of the northern 40 per cent of the island and the de facto partition of Cyprus. Hundreds Cheer

Hundreds of Turkish Cypriots in the main square of their sector of the divided capital cheered as the proclamation was read over loudspeakers. Rauf Denktash, the leader of the Turkish Cypriot community and the vice president in the lon g-defunct Greek-Turkish island government, was unanimously chosen head of the new state by the joint session, the loudspeakers said.

Partnership Seen The proclamation made it clear that the new state was envisaged as a partner with a similar Greek Cypriot state, provided the Greek Cypriots went along with such a settle ment of the Cyprus problem

An attorney who specializes in malpractice cases says large court verdicts and settlements protect the public by preventing good doctors from practicing poor medicine and by forcing incompetent doctors out of the medical profession.

The attorney, George Goldberg, is a partner in the Los Angeles law firm of Cheren

"On a contingency basis," he said, "I stand to lose as much as I gain. In the Walker case, for example, close to \$50,000 came out of our pockets for preparation, expert witnesses and the cost of keeping Mrs. Walker alive pending the trial."

He said that if an hourly fee were charged, as is customary in most legal work, the client would have been charged in advance.
