Officer Seriously **Wounded During Gunbattle Here**

A Midland man was killed and a policeman seriously wounded in a shootout late Wednesday night in the attic of a home here.

Officer Larry Bledsoe, 28, was listed in guarded condition today at Medical Center Hospital in Odessa where he was being treated for two bullet wounds in the upper right chest.

The victim, Bert Louis Sabvino, 25, whose last known address was in the 1600 block Hickory St., was pronounced dead at the scene by Peace Justice Robert Pine. Sabvino had been shot several times in the chest.

Pine withheld a ruling pending results of an autopsy.

Police said the shootout occurred about 11 p.m. after Bledsoe and officer Doug Glover were sent to a house at 1609 E. Oak St. when the resident, Ella Jones, reported that she had returned home from her father's house and found lights on in her home. She went back to her father's house at 204 Donald St. and phoned police. Police said the officers heard a noise in the attic. When they entered the attic they found Sabvino hiding behind an air

conditioning duct. Bledsoe and Glover reportedly told Sabvino several times that he was under arrest and to surrender. When they started to crawl over an air conditioning began firing and the police hot him.

Glover was not injured.

WASHINGTON (AP) - Atty. Gen. Edward H. Levi told Congress today that the late J. Edgar Hoover kept secret files of derogatory information about presidents, executive branch officers and 17 members of Con-

New Kind Of School Appearing: The Old School

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the final article in a two-part series on changes going on in American public schools. It describes the new fundamental schools which emphasize the Three Rs and discipline.

Associated Press Writer Across the country, a new kind of "new" school is beginning to appear: the old school.

Begun two years ago in California, basics schools or fundamental schools now are offered as alternatives by a small but increasing number of public school districts. They exist because parents have asked for

The basics schools are just what they say they are: the three Rs, report cards and discipline. The emphasis is on teaching educational skills; homework is required and checked. They list achievement, manners and moral training among their goals: honor rolls, dress codes and lining up quietly for class.

There are no more than a dozen basics schools, opened or planned, but they incorporate trends that may have broad implications for American schools: what is taught and who makes that decision, Similar programs already are

being offered as alternatives within new, multiapproach schools in some other districts. Most of the basics schools are in suburban school districts, often ones that went furthest with the "open" education of recent

years. In spirit and practice,

they stand in opposition. "When we teach children about the westward movement in American history, we don't have them spend two weeks building a covered wagon," Wallace Clark, principal of the Hoover Elementary School in Palo Alto, Calif., said recently.

The Hoover school is Palo Alto's "more structured" school (Parents had asked for a

three Rs School.) Its priorities are stated succinctly: "The majority of the school day will be devoted to the teaching of reading, writing, spelling, lan-guage and arithmetic." Specific learning goals are

spelled out for each grade at the beginning of the school year. There are regular tests, weekly reports to parents and quarterly report cards, graded

Rules for Hoover School pupils are laid down in two pages of standards. They are to line up quickly and quietly before class, eat at assigned tables in the lunch room and say good morning to the principal and other adults. There is no corpo-ral punishment, but children do stay after school if assignments are missed or rules broken.

Strip Mines **Given First State Airing**

By JACK KEEVER AUSTIN, Tex. (AP) - Surface mining-a topic that has aroused the interest of two Democratic presidential candidates-got its first review this session in a Senate committee

Two Texas Democrats, Sens. Max Sherman of Amarillo and Lloyd Doggett of Austin, presented their proposals to regulate surface mining, which has enormous economic potential in mineral-rich Texas

Sherman noted that University of Texas researchers have estimated the state could pro duce 10.4 billion tons of lignite. Federal legislation to regu

late strip mining is imminent Doggett said-"If we don't act we will only be reacting to federal standards. Sherman said Sen. Henry

Jackson, D-Wash., and Rep. Morris Udall, D-Ariz., are sponsoring strip mining legislation in Congress

80,000 Acres In Texas Sherman said 80,000 surface acres are being mined in Texas, including 55,000 acres for sand gravel, 3,200 for lignite

and 2,200 for uranium. "I am appalled by the amount of land that could be destroyed by surface mining - one million acres for lignite alone.' said Temple lawyer Jim Bowmer, a member of the special citizen-legislator committee that studied possible state regu lation of the industry.

Sherman was chairman of that committee, and his bill would put the Texas Railroad Commission-which regulates the oil and gas industry-in charge of controlling strip min-

Land Office Regulation

Doggett proposes that the General Land Office regulate the industry.

"I want a state agency at tuned to firm arms-length regulation, and to me that's the land office," said Bowmer. "I believe the land office will do a firmer and more objective job of enforcement

provision for citizen suits which Doggett's contains, and it does not permit the state attorney general to intervene, as Doggett's does.

Howard Jensen of Dallas. vice president of Lone Star Steel Co., said Sherman's bill would "serve to limit" the supply of minerals from the ground and Doggett's proposal would "eliminate the supply." Jensen, also speaking for 250 member companies of the

Texas Ad Hoc Reclamation Association, said, however, the companies are "not opposed to reasonable regulation of surface mining.

San Antonio Mayor **Snubs Re-Election,** Assails Gonzalez

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (AP) Mayor Charles Becker says U.S. Rep. Henry B. Gonzalez, "needs professional help before it's too late for all of us."

The San Antonio News quoted Becker Wednesday from an interview about Becker's decision to spurn re-election.

"General apathy, negativism, no cooperation from the media and the lunatic ravings of U.S. Rep. Henry B. Gonzalez" were cited by the mayor as the reasons he is giving up his post.

Natural Gas Shortages Gonzalez has been attacking several South Texans speeches from the U.S. House floor in recent weeks about natural gas shortages, especially about the city's controversial supply contract with Lo-Vaca Gathering Co.

-Lo-Vaca curtails supplies sometimes during heavy use periods and the city has sued Lo-Vaca and its parent company. Coastal States Gas Corp., for \$150 million.



cial security recipients.

The provision limits the earnings a person between the ages of 65 to 72 can collect before losing certain social security

It limits persons in that group to an annual outside income of \$2,520. Thus, person earning more than \$210 a month lose \$1 of benefits for every \$2 they receive in excess of earnings

"In my judgment, Sen. Henry Jackson can no longer be looked to for solutions to our energy problems, for he has himself become a very large part of the problem."

This was the comment of Jim C. Langdon, member of the Texas Railroad Commission, in addressing the Abilene Kiwanis Club recently.

He said further that he is "appalled by the candidacy of people like Senator Jackson for the presidency of the United States" because of the Washington Democrat's position on oil and gas pro-

Missing Heir Note Could Be Expensive

By JOHN L HILL

Texas Attorney General AUSTIN - Imagine getting a letter indicating that you and your family might be heirs to the estate of a distant relative you never even knew existed! It sounds like the basis for a movie or novel but it could be the basis for a consumer complaint instead.

That's because in may cases, if you receive a similar letter, you're far more likely to lose money than to gain it.

Some companies sending out such mass mailings are specialists in what are called "missing heir" schemes.

Most complaints involve the company's mailing letters across the country to persons with common surnames such as Smith, Jones, Brown, Wilson, or

The letters tell recipients that they could be heirs to money being held unclaimed in bank accounts-money which had been deposited by someone with the same surname as theirs.

Along with this initial contact letter comes an agreement form entitling the company to a finder's fee if the money is recovered by the person. In order for the company to research and process the claim, however, the recipient must send from \$10 to \$20 along with the signed agreement.

The consumer complaints indicate that when the recipient returns the agreement and fee he usually receives very little for his money.

WASHINGTON — The pepperpot chairman of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, John Powell, has been censured secretly by his fellow commissioners for his bizarre behavior.

The secret minutes of a Feb. 11 session show he was censured by a 3-0 vote after he twice stalked out of the meeting. The censure motion accused him of leaving the room "to break a quorum," exceeding his authority and indulging in "intimidation of personnel."

Ironically, the commission was established 10 years ago to protect minorities from discrimination and intimidation by employers.

Greybeard government veterans tell us that the censuring of a regulatory chairman is unprecedented in the federal establishment. But Powell, who still has almost four years of his term to serve, has been an unusual chairman.

We have established from weeks of investigation that he went behind his own general counsel's back to negotiate an attempted settlement of a delicate case for a big manufacturer. He also tried to fire Julia Cooper, who won the 1974 Tom Clark Award as the most distinguished "line" lawyer in govern-

The censure episode, as revealed in the secret minutes, began not long after the Feb. 11 meeting convened. Suddenly, "Chairman Powell announced the meeting was adjourned," states the minutes, even as Commissioner Raymond Telles was trying to introduce a motion

Powell strode out of the room in a huff. His startled colleagues quickly assembled a quorum of three commissioners and reconvened the meeting. Then just as suddenly, according to the minutes, "Chairman Powell re-entered the room and. . . vehemently declared the meeting adjourned and demanded the staff to vacate the room."

The staff obediently hustled out and Powell magisterially "ordered the tape (which was recording the minutes) to be turned off. The chairman said 'have available at the Chamber of Commerce fun' to the three commissioners as he

When the abandoned trio recovered from their astonishment, Commissioner Ethel Walsh introduced the unprecedented censure motion and Telles seconded it. The vote was unanimous.

Aside from his arbitrary ways, Powell has taken some strange steps recently to inspirit his troops.

Footnote: Powell, in a long rambling conversation, told us: "I believe in the dignity of men and women, black and white. . . That (censure meeting) was a rump session. I do not as chairman recognize a rump session."

He refused to discuss the Carey memo except to abuse us verbally for asking about it. (United Features Syndicate)

"escheat" laws which apply to unclaimed bank accounts, other personal property, and real property. "Escheat" is the process by which real and personal property pass to the custody of the state when there is no other valid claim.

According to Texas law, if a person dies without a will and has no heirs, or is absent seven years and is believed dead, his property passes to the people of Texas. The state, however, is aggressive in its efforts to see that people who are entitled to property get it.

The escheat process as applied to bank accounts works in the following

When a bank determines an acount has been inactive for seven years, it must report the property to the State Treasurer. Sixty days after a report is received, the treasurer mails a notice to the sheriff of the county in which the bank is located, and the notice is posted in the county courthouse for 30

In 120 days after filing of the report, notice of abandoned property must be published in a newspaper in the county. Persons claiming it can then present proof of the claim to the bank within 60 days. If the property is not claimed after another 90 days have passed, only then is it considered permanently abandoned and escheated to the state. Anytime after that, however, a person with a valid claim still can recover the property.

A person who believes he has a claim to an abandoned bank account first should write the bank to find out if it has been escheated to the state. If it has, contact the State Treasurer, supply the name of the bank and the city in which it's located, and indicate that a claim is to be made.

The treasurer will send the proper forms to be filled out, notarized, and returned. If the treasurer and the attorney general determine the claim is a valid one, payment will be made to the claimant by the state.

The Democratic Senate Campaign Committee charged with electing Democratic senators-has turned itself into a virtual biennial committee for the circumvention of the popular franchise. In the five ballotings since 1966, more than 80 Democratic senatorial incumbents have run again and just five have been defeated in general elections. No a single Democratic

As soon as one election is over, the Campaign Committee begins preparing for the next one, making sure that Democratic senators are fully utilizing the taxpayer-financed resources commanded by the Senate majority. Preeminent among these assets is the sprawling legislative committee structure. Before six years pass, and a freshman senator must come up for re-election, the leadership sees to it that committee, This provides additional staff dozens-and the chance to hold wellpublicized hearings and otherwise increase political exposure. All of the new Democratic senators elected in 1970, and up for re-election next year, already have been given committee or subcommittee The tremendous build-up of sub-

WASHINGTON (KFS) - If we con- committee and committee staffs is not new. In his 1960 book "U.S. Senatoru and Their World," Prof. Donald Matthews observed that "some of the fastest growing bureaucracles are to be found in the Senate Office Building, Within the memory of Senate old-timers, a

typical senator's office staff consisted of an executive secretary and a typist or two. The average post-war senator, with his vastly increased work load, has a staff of a dozen or so people." As of 1975, that has climbed to 25-50. While huge staffs give all senators good odds for re-election, the massive committee and subcommittee structure-with its political platforms and additional staffs-make Democratic senators virtually invulnerable. In 20

years, the authorized Senate Committee budget has climbed from \$8.76 million (1953-54) to \$54.3 million (1973-74). A powerful senator like Henry Jackson appoints and controls 63 different jobs in the Interior Committee and the Permanent Investigation Subcommittee, giving him a tremendous election time staff advantage. Of the 190 field hearings held by Senate committees during the 93rd Congress, 163 were in the home states of members. Indiana Sen. Birch Bayh used 60 per cent of his Juvenile Delinquency Subcommittee travel budget for staff or personal visits to Indiana. Two millennia ago, Roman Senators

were elected for life by magistrates without the slightest pretense of democracy. In this country, until 1913, U.S. Senators were elected by state legislatures, and they tended to represent state political machines. In 1913, ratification of the 17th Amendment to the Constitution required direct election of Senators, and for the next half century, Senators could be said to represent the people. But in the last decade, they have become a self-perpetuating elite to a point where majority party incumbents are almost unbeatable in general elections. The ERS study estimated that by 1980 the energy needs of selected food and fiber industries would rise to almost 5,200 trillion British thermal units (Btu), an increase of over 11 per cent from

The ERS projection applied to five subsectors of the food and fiber industry: recently described the economic impact Farm production, farm family living,

food processing, marketing and distribution, and manufacture of certain inputs. Total energy needs of the whole food and fiber sector will total much more than 5,200 trillion Btu by 1980.

The industries selected for the ERS analysis used 4,667 trillion Btu of fossilfuel energy in 1970. Other studies have suggested that the United States' total food system, including home storage and preparation, used up to 8,618 trillion Btu that year. The ERS study goes into con-

siderable technical detail but the point is that the energy requirement in every sector of farm activity - except for farm family living, which will level off and decline slightly - will increase dramatically by 1980.

The question of exports enters this picture of increased energy use. "If we cut back on farm exports, our balance of payments ledger would be in a mess, since farm exports contribute strongly to the positive side," the ERS study said. This was in response to suggestions that exports be trimmed since importing petroleum to produce a crop and then exporting it again seemed very costly.






