And now it's about time for the BVDs to do a little mixing around.

/OL. 47-NO. 12

What's street- and highway-bound? It's the 1975 Midland County car license tag series and not a brand of man's underwear or literal tramps.

The series with an occasional vowel mixed in and an occasional word, started statewide Feb. 3 when tax assessor-collectors' offices began across-the-counter sales of the new five-year vehicle plates.

Though drivers will use the same sets of plates up to 1980, they will be paying the regular license tag fee for decals denoting the years 1976, '77, '78 and '79.

The fee, according to passenger car weight, is \$12.30, \$22.30 and \$30.30.

Midland County prefixes are shaping up into such words as but, bug, bud, bun, bum, bul, buf, bus, buy and buz. And someone who's a three-letter crossword puzzle buff might come up with a startling listing.

Some of the Midland County tag buyers were pleased with the word-forming tags that fell their way, some weren't, and some, apparently, didn't care one way or the

For instance, quite a few folks driving Volkswagens wanted the BUG prefix and got it. But there were only 990 of them to

Cattlemen and ranchers were making tracks to Elmo Linebarger's tax office for the BUL. "That's money in our pockets," Linebarger quoted a rancher who treasured the advertising value of the prefix.

BUM was popular among some, but shunned by others. "We had several calls on that," Chief Deputy Frances Shuffield said, "and one man objected to it at the counter."

Then there were the two look-alike spinster types who specifically requested BUT. "Oh, it was a big joke to them," Linebarger said. "They were having a good time about

The reasoning behind the ousting of those two vowels was more practical than literary.
"The reason for it," Mrs. Shuffield exlained, "is that the computer cannot tell the difference between the 'zero' and the 'O' and (between) the 'one' and the 'I.' So they just omitted them."

Some others, however, have speculated that Robert Townsley, director of the THD's motor vehicle division, wanted to cut down on the chances of unsavory words appearing on Texas car tags for five years running.

So far, the tax office here has sold well over half of its alloted 51,015 passenger car

And, likely late this afternoon, the tax office will be tearing into the BVD series for counter sales.

By midnight on April 1, Linebarger pointed out, Midland County drivers should have '75 plates on their vehicles. After that date, the '74 tags will be void, and peace officers will be writing tickets on violations.

Beside the fine, from \$12.50 to \$17.50, the tax office will tack a 20 per cent penalty onto the tag price.

And at that cost, few words on any plate could offer consolation.

Party war policies were important 19th century issues. Defeatist attitude in the War of 1812 helped kill the Federalist Party, dovish sentiments in the Mexican War were among the nails closing the Whig Party's coffin, and bitterness over the Civil War determined U.S. politics for several generations.

More recently, one can list specific popular reactions to overseas wars, territorial losses or "betrayals." After World War I, several hyphenate groups turned on Woodrow Wilson and the Democrats - the Germans for what happened to Germany, the Italians because Italy was not awarded Fiume, and the Irish because Ireland's plight was ignored at the Versailles peace

German, Irish and Italian unhappiness also colored politics before the outbreak of World War II. Then after the war, all three groups were especially prone to support conservative politician who criticized Washington's wartime policy for being too pre-occupied with Germany and ignoring the Communist threat. After China and Eastern Europe fell to the Soviets, top Mid-western isolationist counties swung heavily against the Democrats in the 1952 Presidential election, in effect saying "We told you so." Americans from Poland, Hungary and the Baltic states were also bitter, and for the last two decades, the "recrimination" rhetoric of "Captive Nations" groups has been a significant, albeit fading, factor in national politics. Since the Bay of Pigs, Florida's large Cuban population has been strongly Republican in protest against Communis rule in Havana

Political analyst Samuel Lubell argues that the politics of revenge and recrimination is mostly ethnic-based, and the evidence supports him. At first blush, U.S. reaction to the loss of China in 1949 would appear to be an exception, but on closer inspection, even the China Lobby's "Asia First" elements were disproportionately from ethnic isola-tionist strongholds like the Upper Midwest. Nevertheless, the China backlash did extend beyond ethnic

Since the China debate, of course, U.S. opinion has lost its Cold War fervor. Anti-Communism is a slackening popular emotion, and there is no Vietnamese ethnic element in the U.S. On the other hand, U.S. military forces never really fought in Eastern Europe or China and were never defeated in either place. This time, U.S. soldiers arguably have been defeated in Indochina and a major loss of American influence in Asia seems probable. Such circumstances may very well give renewed focus to the politics of revenge.

The City of Midland can probably solve this problem only by encouraging free enterprise and private developers to develop housing for low Income and middle income residents in Midland. The city has no centrol on the interest rates, site availability, or the spiraling inflation-fueled costs of building. To seek a solution to the low and middle income housing problem through tax dollars, whether it be local or federal, could not solve all of the problem and would only deteriorate from an otherwise attractive building climate for prospective developers. Being closely associated with the vocational labor needs of the oil industry and being a college graduate, has given me insight into the educational needs of our children regardless of their aspirations in life. 2. I see no advantage to having a consolidated high school in Midland. The current school board has taken the stand that one school would eliminate future boundary change problems. Eliminating this so called problem would create a high school with about 3,700 students and two campuses (Lee and Midfand High). I believe this would create problems. in administration resulting in a bureaucratic structure. requiring additional staff and administrative personnel. Transportation between campuses would require bus facilities and result in mass movement of students. Participation of all students in school activities would be reduced-thereby hindering the develop ment of a well rounded student and creating additional school drop-out problems. A consolidated high school would probably result in a reduction of the teaching staff at the sacrifice of quality education. do not support the consolidation of Midland and Lee High Schools.

3. The Open Classroom Multi-Age Grouping Program (K-1: 2-3) has been accepted by the current Midland School Board as the norm for our elementary schools. It has not been demonstrated that this program is as good as our current conventional self-contained classroom concept. To obtain a good education founded on the basics of math, reading, writing and spelling, I believe a certain amount of regimentation and firm direction is necessary. You don't get this under the open classroom multi-age grouping concept. It has been documented in national news megazines, newspapers, and educational studies that the multi-age grouping education is very difficult to achieve and requires extensive school building re-structuring and teacher training to have any hope of success. The system we now have with our selfcontained classrooms has and is working well for the children of Midland. I see no reason to spend our tax dollars on remodeling our elementary schools to accommodate change solely for change sake. I believe in two equal and separate high schools. Students in separate schools have a much better opportunity to participate in school activities. Such programs as drama, debate, choir, band, the student newspaper, and athletics are very beneficial to the students who elect to perticipate in them. Consolidating the schools would seriously reduce the number of students who could participate in these programs. Therefore, keeping separate schools is in my opinion very important.

Just as important is the need to continue to see to it that both high schools are always equal in size and quality. The School Board first announced the policy of equality of the two schools back in 1959. The Board affirmed this policy when Carver High School was closed in 1968. It is most important for all Midland citizens, children and adults, no matter what part of town they live in, no matter what their race or ethnic background. The School Board cannot guarantee that students will take equal advantage of their opportunities, but the Board can, and must, guarantee that the opportunities themselves are equal. Needless to say, unequal schools do not provide equal opportunities.

The pilot program, called K-1, has met a mixed response among Midland parents. Some parents feel strongly that they do not want their children to participate in this program, They fear that their children would not learn and develop as well in K-1 as they would in a traditional program.

For this reason, when I am elected, I shall do everything in my power, beginning immediately after the election, to see that no public school student shall be required to attend the K-1 type class if his parents do not want him to, I will urge the adoption of a plan to grant an option, either by providing a traditional-type classroom program in the school where the student would ordinarily attend, or by pairing each elementary school using the K-1 system with an elementary school, situated in the same area, using the traditional system.

This proposal is sound, it will enable parents who do not like the K-1 program to send their children to a traditional program. The trustees are intelligent, conscientious, reasonable men, and I believe this is the kind of plan they will consider and adopt.

I have a Bachelor of Science Degree in Geology from the University of Texas at Austin. I have had 18 years experience as a geologist in the oil business. I have been active in the YMCA; United Way: Administrative Board, Sunday School Teacher, and Chairman of Commission on Education, St. Luke's United Methodist Church; and Vice Commissioner, Midland Junior Baseball Association. I have been a Midland resident for 16 years. Two sons are presently attending and one son graduated from the Midland Public Schools. I feel my interest and knowledge of Midland Schools is broad. I have time and the desire to serve the Children in our community.

Consolidation of our high schools is not consistent with the anticipated growth of Midland as predicted by City Officials. It is my concern that consolidation would reduce participation in every phase of cociricular activities. Two problems that would arise from consolidation are: (1) Additional required busing would cost the District more money; (2) Decrease of certain staff and teaching personnel. During the past 13 years Midland has enjoyed two equally superior high schools. The competitive nature of this situation is healthy for the student bodies and the community. I hope to see this remain.

Basic skills such as reading, writing, spelling and mathematics are most important in any education program. I desire to see these skills remain as top priority. In addition, it is essential that teachers encourage students to achieve at their maximum level. Our present School Board has voted to adopt the "K-1, 2-3" program only as a standard and feasable program. In my mind, this does not mean that it will or should be started at all elementary schools, since it will not meet the needs of all schools. Wholesale implementation of a multi-age grouping program is not advisable until more results are available substantiating academic excellence in the basic skills. It is my contention that multi-age grouping should only be initiated in schools where a majority of the parents demonstrate their interest and support for the program. I am not opposed to change, but I do feel I can remain open minded about a subject until I have investigated the facts and decided what is best for all the children. blank for the question is posed only one sidedly. I know of no MERITS for which I can not think of many DE-MERITS. The greatest objection I see to districting the Council is simply that it divides the community and the Council into "Camps", with each 'Camp" having its own Councilman who is trying to self serve his community to the expense of all the city. We see this going on in Congress right now when the Cheese and Milk states are trying to kill the oil depletion allowance in order to get re-elected. I believe it is far better for the entire community to. vote on each of the Councilmen thus making each Councilman subject to the people throughout the community. There is no mere humbling force than to stand re-election by all the people when you must think of every segment of the City and how you have represented the best interests of that

Of course, to do this it is essential that the two high schools be kept completely equal in every way. When they are equal, they are mutually stimulating: they challenge the vitality in one another. If one of the schools should ever become "better" than the other, the stimulus of academic competition would be lost to both. The quality of both would go down.

When Lee High opened 15 years ago, the School Board adopted, and Midland wholeheartedly supported, a policy of absolute equality. Boundaries were drawn to equalize the student bodies. This excellent policy has periodically required the Board to change the boundaries, as we did this year, to preserve equality between the schools.

The above advantages of two-equal-schools are also disadvantages of consolidation. Other disadvantages include the split campus and decreased opportunity for participation in non-classroom activities.

The advantages of consolidation include reduction of duplication in course offerings and permitting new courses for which there is insufficient demand in each school singly.

Midland's three year old pilot program in multiage grouping has produced good results. It emphasizes the basics, "reading, writing and arithmetic", learned in a disciplined climate. Children in the program consistently do as well or better than children from the same schools did before multi-age prouping. Multi-age grouping works very well for many

children, but not so well for others. And there are parents who object to the multi-age program. Consequently I consider it important that there be an alternative to provide a traditional type program for these students. A plan of elternatives fits well into the program, and I anticipate that such a plan will soon be implemented by the Board.

Parents and teachers in Midland's program have generally been pleased. Most parents enswering a recent questionaire stated that given a choice they would select a multi-age program for their children to attend; less than 30% of the responding parents indicated they would not choose the multi-age program for their children. Teachers in the program, in answering a similar questionaire, were approximately 4 to 1 in stating their preference for multiage grouping.
