Talks Urged

In Paris, the Viet Cong delegation called for a total U.S. withdrawal from South Vietnam and the establishment of a national concord regime in Saigon. The French government urgently called for talks between South Vietnam and the Viet Cong to set up such a regime to settle the political future of the embattled country.



Fetus Decides Time Of Birth


BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. AP) - It's the fetus who decides when the time has come to be born, says a New Zealand obstetrician and gynecologist.







Midland's Finest!

the finest, best-equipped, besttrained and most efficient police departments to be found anywhere, one of which Midlanders well may be proud

But the department is having its problems, resulting primarily from money and manpower shortages, along with a rapid increase in the city's crime rate.

This worries Chief Harold Wallace and his dedicated associates. It concerns them because it hampers their efforts to achieve the high goals they have set for themselves and their department in its day-by-day operations.

This also concerns most Midlanders, who appreciate the efficient service provided by the police department through the years.

The drastic increase in the crime rate, in line with the national trend, is trouble enough in itself, but when a police department does not have sufficient manpower to cope with it, the matter becomes doubly critical.

Armed robbery in the Tall City is said to have become almost commonplace in recent months. The crime rate increased by 39.48 per cent last year.

In a recent interview Chief Wallace told Reporter-Telegram reporter Buddy Baker that the department "has reached the satura-. tion point where we're not keeping. up with the calls. We're having to neglect some of them . . . but we're not culling them — yet."

The chief went on to explain that the department needs two more detectives. The 13 detectives now on the force are having to work overtime, without getting paid for the extra hours. An effort is made to give them time off during slack periods (if any), but this throws the division short much of the time.

To make matters even more difficult, any promotions to the ranks of the detectives would have to come from the patrol division but that division is five men short of its authorized strength:

No wonder Chief Wallace and his men are asking, "Where do we go

from here?" There was a time when criminals didn't stop here, or if they did,

The City of Midland has one of widely-known effectiveness of the Midland Police Department. That was during the time when the city was smaller and the police department was fully staffed: This still holds true to a degree, but understaffing will cause it to slip some.

It should be pointed out, however, that each offense report referred to the detective division is worked as promptly as possible, although it may not be worked to a successful conclusion . . . as the division personnel would prefer. Other calls to the department get ·prompt attention.

Yes, the city manager and members of the city council are aware of the problem.

The answer, of course, is to recruit additional personnel. This will require increased funding for the department. The council, however, doesn't have much choice in the matter. It is something which has to be done. The police department must be fully-staffed in order to cope with the problem at hand. This, undoubtedly, is the way the citizens want it.

INSIDE REPORT Ford Forces Again Playing 'Hardball'

By ROWLAND EVANS And ROBERT NOVAK

WASHINGTON - Frustrated by chaotic "reform" Congress beyond the control of Democratic chairmen who cannot deliver the votes of their committees, President Ford is on the verge of imposing another dollar import tax on oil May 1 to renew his energy confrontation with Capitol Hill.

Hopeful compromise talk of last month has vanished. Barring a late reversal, energy legislation being written in the House will contain strong controls abhorrent to Mr. Ford. That would leave the President two choices: do nothing or return to his old plan of import taxes. "I'd say," a Ford policymaker told us, "there's an 80 per cent chance we'll go back to playing hardball" -

that is, reimpose import taxes. Renewed confrontation probably dooms any government action on the continuing but momentarily invisible energy crisis. This shows that government divided between a Republican President and Democratic Congress can menace the nation when rank-and-file Democrats, under the banner of procedural "revolution," subvert the old committee chairmen system leaving nothing responsible in its place.

The President's energy program ordered a \$3-a-barrel import tax on oil for one reason: to prod Congress into doing something.

It worked, with this agreement reached late in February: the first \$1 levy would stay, but the President would not impose the second and third dollar tariffs; Congress would hold back on overriding Mr. Ford's veto of a bill suspending the tariff increases; both

NICK THIMMESCH-Credibility Is Suffering Worldwide

WASHINGTON-It's going to hurt us a lot when and if South Vietnam falls to the Communists. The glib and self-serving prophets will declare "good riddance" and try to think about something else. But we put a lot into Vietnam and have almost a sensual feel of the tragedy.

Fifty thousand American lives make us feel. So does the knowledge that our national honor has been defiled, and the notion that we would help a nation threatened or invaded by another is discredited. After all we put into Vietnam, we

must smart at the growing criticism that when America gives its word, it doesn't amount to much. Iran and-Pakistan don't put too much stock in our word. The South Vietnamese are bitter about it. Japan grows skeptical. Israel is shrewd enough to keep us as an ally and friend but not to enter into formal mutual pact.

Confronted with the humiliation of Vietnam and the awareness that those hundreds of thousands of refugees are largely our responsibility, it's understandable that the resultant emotional boil will cause people to pass the blame.

There's got to be some guilt in Congress, which cut military aid to Vietnam in half last year. So the guilty on the Hill blame South Vietnam's President Nguyen Van Thieu as a repressive, intransigent leader who wouldn't work for accommodation with the Viet Cong or North Vietnamese.

President Gerald Ford also took a swipe at Thieu, but for his military strategy, and hung most of the blame on Congress. And standing there, facing



daily press conferences in the Pentagon is Defense Secretary James Schlesinger, uttering the necessary dismal comment on what pass.s. Somehow sequestered from all this is Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger, recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize for negotiating the 1973 Paris accords. He isn't saying much these days.

Though President Thieu is portrayed as a heavy, there is merit in his argument that South Vietnam was victim to the terms negotiated by the United States back in 1973, terms which allowed some 225,000 North Vietnamese troops and another 50,000 Viet Cong to remain.

As Kissinger pointed out recently, the South Vietnamese, since last May, received only ammunition and fuel from the United States. They did not receive spare parts, planes or other military equipment. "Under those conditions," Kissinger remarked, 'the

True, the Israelis fight extremely well for their country. However, their leaders would never allow a third-party to negotiate the presence of 225,000 Arab troops inside their borders. Nor does Israel want American troops occupying its land and taking over its wars the way we did with South Vietnam.

Moreover, Israel is blessed with a sizable, affluent, influential cheering section in the United States, an advantage South Vietnam doesn't enjoy.

When President Kennedy sent those 18,000 troops into Vietnam, he made that war a big fight. We came to own that, war, and the South Vietnamese were subjugated to our pledges. They faced a relentless, tough foe, one which exploited domestic turmoil in the United States. Persevering and heroic as the North Vietnamese are, they are also butchers who do their grisly best without


