Long was soon afterwards called to the 'phone, where he spent some few minutes, after which be re surned to where Montgomery and another young man were, Mont gomery reclining on the counter The former subject of being tirec of life was renewed by Long, and When Montgomery was the second time ask how he felt about it he answered it in the same manner as before. Scarcely had Montgomery ceesed speaking when Long drew revolver and throshing it near his friend's heed, flring the shot that ended the man's life almost instant ly. Long then seeing what he had done, immediately placed the muz zel of the yot smoking revolver his own head and fired again, thus ending the lives of two of Emma mont promising business men.

The Timber Situation.
Washington, Jan. 13.--"The of forests and inland waterways, time is coming in this, country pointing out the necessity for the When trees *ill be as scarce as government requiring forests. diamonds, unless immediate step taken are to perserve our forests.'
This was the dark picture paint ed in an address by secretary of Agriculture Wilson at the twenty eighth annual meeting of the American Forestry Association here today. The secretary de flared that our forest' growth is getting scarcer every day and that we are using three times a much wood as we are krowiuk.
"Do not let us sit down an make tires at congress," said Secretary Wilson, "because that body has not yet seen lit to pro vire for the Appalachian and White mountain forests reserves We must not depend too much on congress. What we want is reforestation of the country at the rate of about 250,000 acres each year.
Secretary Wilson emphasized various assciations and individuals in helping to solve the problem by planting trees in denuded places.
