A Faithful President Layed To Rest In Ross Cemetery

BAIRD — A president is dead and this community will always consider it a privilege to have known and respected him. Bob Norrell died quietly at his home at 1 p. m. Monday, October 1st.

Mr. Norrell, who retired as president of the First National Bank of Baird on January 9th, this year, still maintained an office and made almost daily visits to the bank. His retirement came after 65 years of dedicated service to the establishment, one day after his 89th birthday.

Born January 8, 1884 in Cottonwood, he was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Norrell. His father, a Confederate soldier and the mother, the daughter of a Methodist preacher, Bob Norrell molded himself into a faithful, dedicated and dependable person.

In an interview back in January, Mr. Norrell made this statement on his retirement, "I'm not going to do a lot of fishing, because I have already done that." Looking back over the life of this man, he could easily say these words about many things. In his early childhood, he learned to read from newspapers, and his first job was in the newspaper office of the Cottonwood Fax. He helped his father in the tax office before joining the bank here in Baird. He learned this business from the floor up and became its president in 1951.

Mr. Norrell added to his life the civic duties of the community and worked for his fellowman to the best of his ability. He remembered being involved in every organization in Baird, Red Cross, Salvation Army, a member of the official board of the First Methodist Church, of which he was a longtime member.

He served as president of the Callahan County Luncheon Club, and Director of the Baird Chamber of Commerce. During his Chamber work, the Callahan County Court House was built, Market Street was paved, and improvement on the sewer and water supply system were accomplished. He was a member of the Baird Lions Club and Odd Fellow Lodge, and remained Chairman of the Board of the First National Bank after his retirement.

Funeral services for Mr. Norrell were held at 3 p. m. Wednesday at the First United Methodist Church, with Rev. Delton Fisher, pastor, officiating. Burial was in Ross Cemetery under the direction of Godfrey Funeral Home.

Survivors include his wife, Alma Gray Norrell; one brother, Pink Norrell of Breckenridge; one sister, Mrs. R. L. Kerlin of Amarillo.

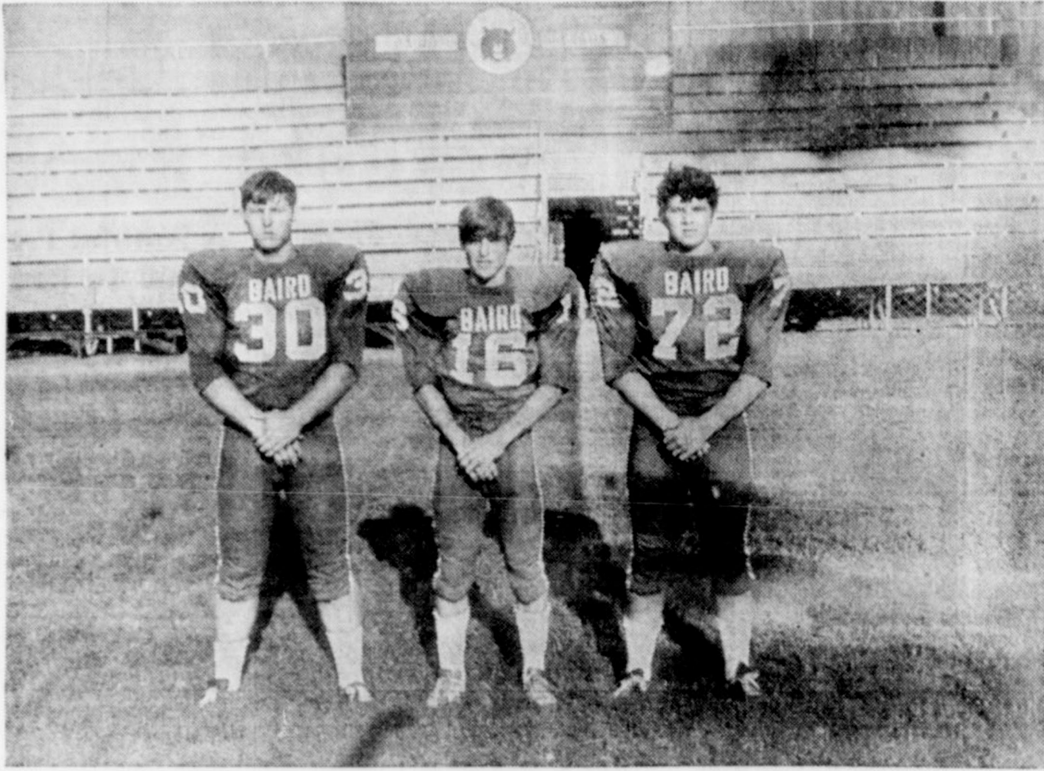
Debbie Curtis Big At Lubbock Fair

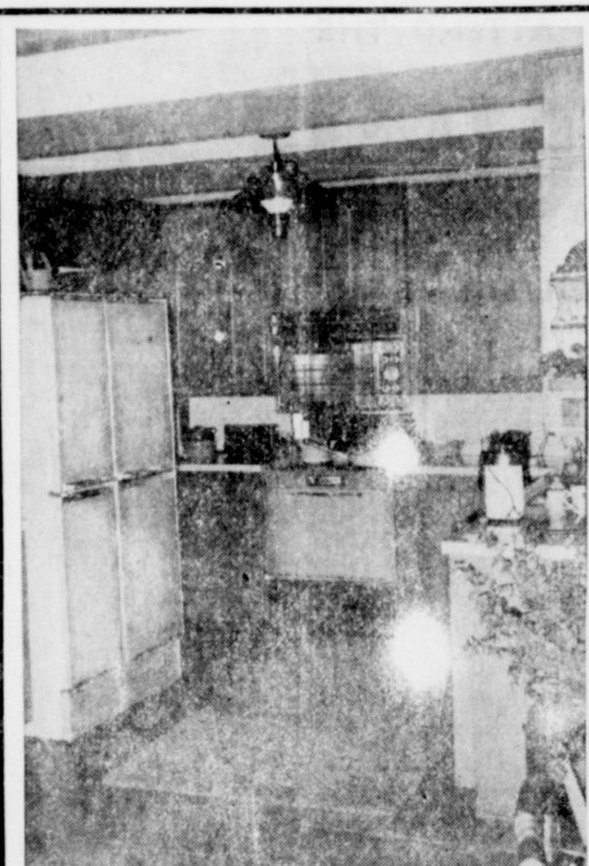
Young Homemakers In Ethetton Home

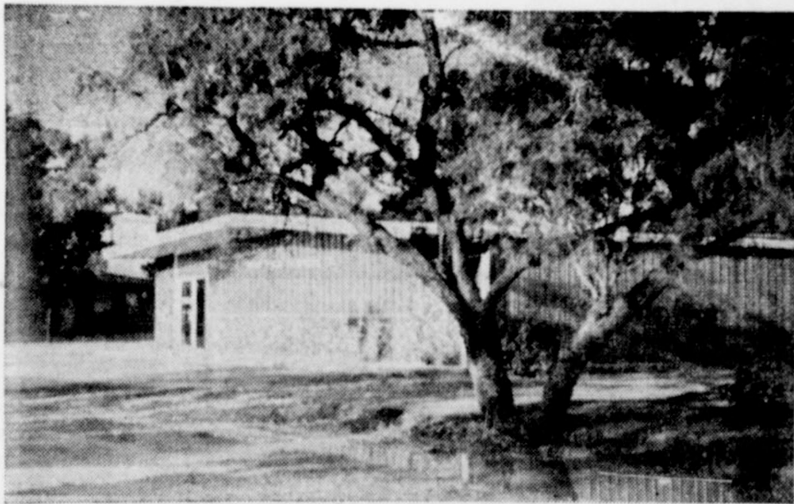
